NARCISSI AND DAFFODILS

New Pink Trumpet Daffodils

This famous group of attractive new Pink Trumpet Daffodils has been raised from the well-known variety Mrs. R. O. Backhouse and is in colour and growth far superior to the parent. Excellent for show, pans and garden purposes. Very free flowering and multiplying rapidly. Flowers of good substance.

- Champagne, pure white perianth, large creamypink trumpet with broad apricot ruffled edge. When fully opened, the colour turns into deep salmon-pink. One of the first to bloom. Strong stem.
- *Lady Bird, the large trumpet is distinctly pink and flaring, evenly ruffled; pale apricot outside, deep orange-apricot inside, deepening towards the throat. White perianth of perfect form. Solid stem. Most outstanding variety.
- *Louise de Coligny, the pure white reflexed perianth is of good substance and shows the neat apricot-pink trumpet beautifully. An outstanding and strongly fragrant variety. Higly recommended.
- *Pink Fancy, pale apricot trumpet, broadly fringed, soft pink at edge. Very free flowering and excellent for naturalizing.

- *triandrus albus, (Angel's tears daffodil) (6"), clusters of creamy-white flowers with reflexing perianth. April.
 - " concolor, soft yellow. Very distinct.
 - " pulchellus, beautiful sport of triandrus albus with bright buttercup yellow flowers.
- W. P. Milner (8"), small sulphur-yellow trumpet. April.
