- 2a **BALALAIKA**: 2, J.L.R. Aranjuez x Bahram. Clear bright yellow perianth and goblet shaped cup of the same shade with a narrow wire rim of deep red. A show flower of the highest quality. £7.
- 1b **BAYUNGA**: 3, J.N.H. Bonnington x Cromarty. A large and lovely exhibition bi-colour. Very broad, flat, much overlapping, ace-shaped petals of smooth texture and great substance and a large trumpet of deep rich cream serrated at the edge. The flower stands well on a strong stem. £5.
- 2b **COMPTON MACKENZIE**: 3, R.V.F. A fine large flower with broad white perianth of much substance and a large rather long crown which opens yellow and turns soft apricot pink. 50/-.
- 2a **COURT MARTIAL**: 3, J.L.R. Big Game x Narvik. Bright yellow very round flat perianth and nicely proportioned cup of deep orange red neatly serrated at the mouth. A fine show flower. £7.
- 3b **CREPELLO**: 5, J.L.R. Bryher x Chinese White. Pure white perianth, round and flat; the cup with a frilled edge of greenish lemon and centre of cool green. A lovely show flower and a tall plant. £10.
- 2b **DEODORA**: 3, J.L.R. Green Island x Greenore. Perianth segments very broad and flat, slightly pointed at the tips. Large saucer shaped crown pale primrose passing to white, with a frilled margin of greenish lemon. A tall robust plant and superb show flower. £10.
- 1c **EMPRESS OF IRELAND**: 2, G.L.W. Widely regarded as the best white trumpet yet introduced. A majestic flower of great size and substance and faultless form, balance and proportion. £30.
- 2b **EROICA**: 4, J.N.H. A large flower of arresting beauty and exceptional quality. Much overlapping very smooth snow-white ace-shaped petals of great substance and large perfectly proportioned cup of deep rich yellow. Tall strong stem. £5.
- 1b **FAIR TRIAL**: 3, J.L.R. Ardclinus x Kanchenjunga. A large pale bi-colour trumpet. Perianth pure white very flat, smooth and overlapping. Nicely proportioned trumpet of clear pale yellow which does not fade, widely flanged and expanded at the mouth. £5.
- 3b **HAMZALI**: 3, D.B. Broad round perianth and a flat pale citron eye with a narrow edge of red. A grand show flower. There are few of this type. 80/-.
- 2a **JAGUAR**: 3, J.L.R. Bahram x Ceylon. A large bloom and a show flower of the highest class. Deep golden yellow perianth very round and overlapping and large bowl shaped crown of intense orange red. £8.
- 2b **KILCORAN**: 3, J.L.R. Blarney x Coverack Perfection. Large flower with broad overlapping perianth of good substance and large saucer-shaped crown of soft yellow with a broad margin of deep orange. 40/-.
- 1a **KING'S RANSOM**: 4, J.L.R. Kingscourt x Goldcourt. Large flower of faultless form and quality. Uniform deep gold throughout. Best flower R.H.S. London, 1950. £20.
- 2a **LAMINGTON**: 2, J.L.R. Krakatoa x Ceylon. Large broad deep gold perianth; large cup widely flanged and serrated at the mouth and bright glowing orange-red in colour. Strong robust grower. £6.

- 1b **OUR SOLO:** 3, J.N.H. Cisco x Maylene. A full trumpet of a very beautiful shade of pink, the flower carried gracefully on a tall stem. 60/-.
- 2b **RECAP:** 3, J.N.H. A most unusual and highly decorative bloom. At the edge of the cup there are whorls and ruffles making little rosettes which are cream on opening and gradually go white. The perianth is smooth and overlapping, and the stem and neck are good. 60/-.
- 2a **RINGMASTER:** 4, J.L.R. Round clear yellow perianth of fine substance. Large expanded saucer-shaped crown of deeper yellow with a broad sharply defined margin of bright orange red. A superb show flower and tall strong plant. £8.
- 1a **ROYCROFT:** 4, J.N.H. A fine yellow trumpet of high show quality. The ace-shaped petals are absolutely flat and very smooth. The well-balanced trumpet is evenly flanged at the mouth. A flower of great substance on a tall strong stem. 40/-.
- 2b **SAILING LIGHT:** 3, J.L.R. Broad rather pointed flat pure white perianth of good substance and large flat yellow crown broadly banded with bright orange. 75/-.
- 2b **SALAD DAYS:** 4, J.N.H. Remarkable for the most intense colouring yet seen in the pinks, and for the heavily ruffled and serrated cup which never catches in the perianth on opening. Smooth much overlapping ace-shaped petals of good substance and well proportioned cup of intense salmon pink ruffled and serrated. Very good neck and stem. £10.
- 1c **SILENT NIGHT:** 4, J.N.H. A superb flower of classic appearance. Perianth broad flat and well overlapped; trumpet slightly expanded and beautifully rolled and serrated. Purest white throughout. Perfect stem and stance. Grand Champion, Ferny Creek, 1959. £15.
- 2a **TOORAK GOLD:** 0, J.N.H. This exceptionally early flower is a much improved version of Malvern Gold from which it was bred. The shovel-pointed perianth, which is flat and overlaps well, has tremendous substance and the rather squat cup is nicely flanged and rolled at the mouth. The perianth is bright yellow and the cup deep gold. The flower stands erectly on very tall strong stems. 60/-.
- 2a **VULCAN:** 2, J.L.R. Carbineer x Ceylon. Smooth round flat and much overlapping perianth of deep golden yellow. Large cup slightly expanded and serrated at the mouth, a deep solid orange red. Best bloom R.H.S. London Daffodil Competition, 1950 and 1958. £20.

**YELLOW TRUMPET NARCISSI**

- ANTWERP:** 3, J.L.R. A large flower of grand show quality. Bold trumpet slightly flanged and serrated at the mouth. Deepest golden yellow throughout. 10/-.
- ✓ **ARCTIC GOLD:** 2-3, J.L.R. Goldcourt x Kingscourt. The whole flower is an even deeper gold than Goldcourt. An exhibition bloom of superb quality. 80/-.
- ARK ROYAL:** 3, J.L.R. Kilkenny x Goldcourt. Large trumpet neatly serrated and rolled back at the mouth. Uniform deep golden yellow. Tall. 80/-.
- AUSTRALIA:** 2, H.A.B. A majestic yellow trumpet. The broad shovel-pointed petals are much overlapping and have tremendous substance. The well proportioned trumpet is widely flanged and rolled back at the mouth. This mighty flower is a uniform rich yellow and is carried erect on very tall, massive stems. 5/-.
- BASTON:** 4, G.L.W. A large golden trumpet of fine quality and substance, having a broad smooth flat perianth and long straight-sided trumpet. 5/-.
- BRAEMAR:** 3, Brodie. Fine golden yellow trumpet of smooth texture and good substance. 10/-.
- BUNGANA:** 1-2. Not a large flower, but of excellent form and texture. A reliable exhibition variety. 4/-.
- CAMBERWELL KING:** 1-2, H.A.B. Broad, well formed perianth, and large yellow trumpet. Still an excellent exhibition bloom. 1/6 each, 15/- dozen.
- CANDLELIGHT:** 3, J.N.H. Hunter's Moon x Kingscourt. Originally classified as a 1b. The whole flower is the softest limey yellow on opening. As it develops the perianth retains its colour but the trumpet darkens and the edge, which is nicely rolled and serrated, becomes a bright lemon. A unique and most attractive bloom of the highest quality. £10.
- CHROMIS:** 2, W.J. A flower of lovely soft yellow. Broad, smooth and much overlapping perianth; well proportioned trumpet; flower well poised on short strong neck. 15/-.
- CIDER:** 2, H.A.B. A beautiful flower of the smoothest texture. An ideal variety for decorative work. Rounded, well overlapped petals of primrose and perfectly proportioned trumpet of the softest golden yellow. Tall stem and good neck. 4/-.
- CLONCARRIG:** 4, J.L.R. Kilkenny x Goldcourt. A high quality exhibition bloom of uniform deep gold. 60/-.
- CROMARTY:** 4, Brodie. A deep golden trumpet of medium size. Perianth smooth and flat. Trumpet evenly flanged and serrated at the mouth. 4/-.
- CULLIAMURRA:** 1-2, J.N.H. Trawalla x Mortlake. An early flower of excellent quality and size. 3/-.
- DAGRENA:** 3, Tas. Smooth yellow perianth well overlapping and attractively pointed. Large smooth yellow trumpet. 6/-.
- DARNAWAY:** 3, Brodie. A large clear mid-yellow trumpet of superb form. 35/-.
- DAWSON CITY:** 4, C.G.v.T. A flower of good form. Uniform soft yellow. 2/-.
- EL BANCO:** 2, J.N.H. Hallmark x Camberwell King. A nicely balanced all-yellow flower. 2/-.
- ELGIN:** 2, Brodie. A large flower of rich colour and great substance. Rather pointed perianth. Trumpet flanged and serrated. 5/-.
- FRONTIER:** 1-2, G.L.W. King of the North x Content. Large flower of first-class form with broad pointed smooth perianth and well-balanced neatly flanged trumpet. Soft primrose-lemon throughout. 20/-.
- GOLDCOURT:** 3-4, J.L.R. A very dark intense gold trumpet. A neatly shaped flower with smooth perianth standing at right angles to a well-balanced trumpet. 10/-.

- GOLDSBOROUGH:** 2, J.L.R. Bred from Goldcourt. An early trumpet of top show quality. Smooth broad overlapping perianth, rather long trumpet rolled and serrated at the mouth. Bright gold throughout. 20/-.
- GOLDEN COCKEREL:** 3, J.L.R. Kilkenny x Goldcourt. A well-balanced flower, the trumpet not too wide and neatly finished. Deep gold throughout. 80/-.
- GOLDEN COIN:** 2, O.R. A reliable exhibition flower. Long slender trumpet and broad smooth perianth. 7/6.
- GOLDISH:** 3, O.R. Perianth gold, with shovel-shaped segments; trumpet darker gold. Champion 1a Melbourne 1957. 50/-.
- HILLSTON:** 1-2, J.N.H. An early large but neat trumpet. A cross between Hebron and Mortlake, having the best qualities of both. Particularly good neck and stem. Deep yellow throughout. 30/-.
- HORACE SHAILER:** 3-4, A.G. A very fine exhibition trumpet of immense substance. The broad, beautifully smooth overlapping perianth of rich yellow stands at right angles to the nicely rolled slightly deeper-toned trumpet. £7.
- HUNTER'S MOON:** 3, Brodie. A flower of unique colouring, being greenish-lemon yellow, most intense at the outer edge of the trumpet. A highly decorative flower. 7/6.
- HUNTHAWANG:** 2-3, J.N.H. A flower of excellent quality and size. The flat, smooth, shovel-pointed petals are a bright yellow and the large trumpet, which is well flanged and rolled, is a deeper yellow. 50/-.
- JOHN PEARCE:** 4, J.N.H. A late trumpet of superb exhibition quality. The perianth has great substance and the smoothest texture. The rather straight trumpet is evenly serrated at the mouth. The neck and stem are especially good. £5.
- KILKENNY:** 3-4, J.L.R. Royalist x Trenoon. A well-proportioned yellow trumpet of very good form and substance. 5/-.
- KINGSCOURT:** 3-4, J.L.R. Royalist x Crocus. A frequent championship winner. A flower of deep yellow with flat smooth perianth and well-balanced, bell-mouthed trumpet. 30/-.
- LYNDALE GOLD:** 3, H.A.B. Very rich gold throughout. Flat broad perianth and nicely balanced trumpet with frilled edge. Tall strong stem. 2/-.
- MANGERE:** 2-3, A.G. A reliable exhibition flower of good form and balance. Rich yellow throughout. Smooth thick texture. Neat trumpet. £5.
- MARAVAL:** 2-3, G.L.W. King of the North x Content. Large graceful decorative flower of cool sulphur lemon. Most unusual and attractive colouring. 30/-.
- MILANION:** 3, G.L.W. Broad rather pointed perianth and beautifully flanged trumpet. Uniform clear golden yellow. 10/-.
- MILSON:** 4. A yellow trumpet of high quality. Flat overlapping perianth and slightly rolled trumpet. 5/-.
- MOONSTRUCK:** 1-2, G.L.W. King of the North x Content. A large trumpet of unusual and attractive colouring. The flower is a lemon primrose with the brim of the trumpet bright lemon. 50/-.
- MORTLAKE:** 2, W. & F. A useful early trumpet. 1/6.
- MUCH BINDING:** 2-3, J.N.H. A yellow trumpet of striking appearance. The perianth is flat and rather pointed and the trumpet is very long and tubular with a serrated edge of deeper yellow. Deservedly very popular for decorative work. 3/- each, 30/- dozen.
- NANGEELA:** 3, W. & F. A deep golden yellow flower with overlapping perianth and long shapely trumpet. 3/-.
- OHAKEA:** 3, A.G. Uniform clear bright yellow throughout. Good substance and smooth texture. A reliable exhibition flower. 7/6.

- PORTARLINGTON:** 3, J.L.R. Broad flat shovel-pointed perianth of smooth texture. Graceful trumpet flanged and serrated at the mouth. Soft golden yellow throughout. An exhibition bloom. 20/-.
- PRETORIA:** 3, J.L.R. A large flower with slightly pointed perianth and well-proportioned trumpet evenly serrated and rolled back at the mouth. 20/-.
- PRIMLOUGH:** 3-4, J.J.B. A lovely trumpet of the smoothest texture, primrose yellow throughout. An exceptionally beautiful flower. 7/6.
- PRINCIPAL:** 3, G.L.W. A well formed self yellow of good substance, quality and texture. Broad flat circular perianth. Trumpet well posed on a good stem. 2/-.
- REGAL STATUS:** 2-3, J.N.H. A stately flower of superb exhibition quality. The Broad shovel-pointed petals overlap well, and the well-balanced trumpet is beautifully flanged and rolled back at the mouth. Deep yellow throughout. 60/-.
- RIO D'ORO:** 4, J.L.R. Goldcourt x Kingscourt. Perianth broad, well overlapping, flat and smooth in texture, trumpet nicely proportioned with frilled flange. Clear golden yellow. A show flower of the highest quality. £5.
- RIVERDALE:** 3, J.T.G. Beautifully smooth yellow perianth of round, shovel-shaped segments nicely overlapping. Trumpet a slightly deeper shade and evenly rolled at the brim. 3/-.
- ROBERT MONTGOMERY:** 4, C.E.R. A large all-golden yellow trumpet of good quality. 2/6.
- ROYALIST:** 4, N.Y.L. A fine show flower, faultless in form and smooth texture. Soft clear yellow throughout. 4/-.
- STRATHERIN:** 1-2. A beautiful early trumpet. The large open trumpet is a deeper yellow than the perianth and is neatly crimped at the edge. 5/-.
- STRONGHOLD:** 3-4, G.L.W. A fine yellow trumpet of good form and substance. 2/-.
- TRAWALLA:** 4, H.A.B. A graceful and striking trumpet of very rich deep gold. The rather pointed petals have great substance and smooth texture and the well proportioned trumpet is nicely flanged at the mouth. The stem is very tall and strong. 3/6.
- TUDOR PRINCE:** 2-3, J.N.H. A large, clear mid-yellow trumpet of superb form, quality and carriage. Very broad, smooth, overlapping perianth, standing at right angles to a perfectly proportioned trumpet. Tall, strong stem and short neck. A perfect show flower and fine garden variety. 12/6.
- VIRTUE:** 3-4, G.L.W. Bred from Crocus. Smooth flat perianth and straight-sided trumpet flanged and serrated. 15/-.
- WANDIN GLORY:** 1-2, S.M. Very early and very tall. 2/6.
- WATTLE:** 2, W. & F. Clear lemon yellow throughout. 3/-.
- WEXFORD:** 3, J.L.R. Medium sized flower of uniform clear soft golden yellow. Perianth smooth and flat, trumpet expanded and frilled at the mouth. 60/-.
- YELLOW POOL:** 4, J.L.R. Pretoria x Cromarty. A large flower with broad shovel-pointed perianth and long trumpet slightly bell-mouthed and serrated at the edge. Uniform medium yellow in colour. 60/-.
- ZACTLEE:** 2, A.O. A yellow trumpet of exceptionally good form and smooth texture. Highly regarded as an exhibition flower in Victoria. 10/-.

**BI-COLOUR TRUMPET NARCISSI**

- ADELONG:** 3, H.A.B. A lovely bi-colour; soft primrose bell-mouthed trumpet. 3/- each, 30/- dozen.
- ANDANTE:** 4, J.N.H. This very lovely bi-colour is of marvellous texture. The perianth is immensely broad and the lemon trumpet is beautifully proportioned with a widely flanged and rolled back edge. £5.

- BESSIE C. SCOTT:** 4, H.A.B. Tall, strong grower. 1/6.
- BONNINGTON:** 3-4, C.E.R. A quality flower with exceptionally smooth, broad, overlapping solid perianth and light lemon trumpet. 5/-.
- BRIDAL ROBE:** G.L.W. Pale lemon trumpet evenly flanged at the mouth. A good show flower. 10/-.
- BRUGES:** 4, J.L.R. This fine pale bi-colour trumpet came from unusual parentage—self-fertilized Cromarty. It is a medium-sized flower of lovely quality, smooth shovel-pointed petals and well proportioned trumpet, neatly rolled and serrated at the mouth. 25/-.
- BURNDALE:** 2, J.N.H. An early bi-colour trumpet which goes practically white as the flower ages. Lovely form. Useful for early shows. 5/-.
- CANDLE LIGHT:** See Division 1a.
- CARAMEL:** 2, A.C. Pure white perianth and a soft clear yellow trumpet with a neatly recurved brim. 5/-.
- CONTENT:** 2-3, P.D.W. Large trumpet. Uniform tone of clear soft greenish primrose throughout, gradually passing to a pale lemon white tone except the brim of the trumpet, which retains a charming frill of lemon. 5/-.
- CREAM WAVE:** An immense flower of great substance. Very broad, smooth, white perianth; large widely expanded cream trumpet; tall, stout stem. 7/6.
- DINTON GIANT:** 3, G.H.E. A large flower with overlapping rounded creamy white perianth of great substance and clear yellow trumpet bell mouthed and flanged. 5/-.
- EARLY PRINCE:** 1, O.R. An immense flower, very early and tall; broad, smooth whitish perianth; large deeply frilled sulphur trumpet. 10/-.
- EFFECTIVE:** 4, G.L.W. A brilliantly contrasted bi-colour trumpet of good substance, with clear white perianth and intense golden trumpet. 7/6.
- EVE DALY:** 2-3, J.N.H. The glistening white perianth is broad and well overlapping, with rather pointed petals. The trumpet, which is beautifully frilled, is a good shade of yellow. An early bi-colour, excellent for early shows. 5/- each, 50/- per dozen.
- FORESIGHT:** 1, G.L.W. A flower of first rate form and good quality, with broad, flat white perianth and well-proportioned neatly flanged golden trumpet. 1/6.
- FROSTING:** 3, J.N.H. A large bi-colour, ideal for decorative work; good smooth perianth and pale yellow straight trumpet with a serrated white edge. Tall, strong stem. Very attractive cut flower. 2/6 each, 25/- dozen.
- GLENCAIRN:** 4, J.L.R. A fine large flower with a broad white perianth which is very flat and of excellent substance. The long trumpet is chrome yellow, gracefully proportioned, beautifully serrated and rolled at the mouth. 80/-.
- GLENFERN:** 3-4, H.A.B. A fine bold flower of perfect form. Flat, white perianth, a long, perfect bell-mouthed trumpet of rich lemon colour. 2/-.
- GLENGARRIFF:** 4, J.L.R. A most distinct large flower, with broad pure white perianth of very good form and substance, rather pointed at the tips and a beautifully formed primrose trumpet, with a cream brim to its wide flange. 15/-.
- GLENRAVEL:** G.L.W. Pure white perianth, broad and overlapping; trumpet clear pale lemon passing almost to white. 2/-.
- GOORNONG:** 2, H.A.B. Perianth of good substance and form; trumpet is a deep lemon colour. 1/6.
- HONOUR:** Brodie. Beautiful show flower with flat overlapping perianth of pure white and neatly flanged yellow trumpet. 3/6.
- HOYLE:** 3, J.N.H. A very large flower with parchment-like perianth well overlapping. As the long bell-mouthed trumpet ages the insides pales to nearly white but the outside remains yellow. Well posed on a strong stem. A championship winner. 40/-.

- LARRIMAH:** 3, J.N.H. A very large flower bred from Kanchenjunga. The absolutely flat perianth is of wonderful texture, and the long narrow trumpet of bright yellow opens at the edge and is nicely serrated. 40/-.
- LILYDALE:** 2, J.J.B. Bold deep yellow trumpet flanged at the mouth. Very durable. 15/-.
- MANYUNG:** 4, J.N.H. A very beautiful flower with pure white shovel-pointed petals and a very well-shaped, medium yellow trumpet, narrow at the base and expanding at the mouth, with a very serrated and slightly frilled edge. £5.

**JAUNE A MERVEILLE:** 3, v.d.S. Soft lemon perianth and pale yellow eye with slight orange rim. 2/6.  
**LA FIANCEE:** 3. White petals and yellow cup. 1/6 each, 15/- dozen.  
**PLEIADES:** 5, C.E.R. A number of large flowers with flat white petals and soft yellow cup to each massive stem. 15/-.  
**ST. AGNES:** 4, P.D.W. White perianth and shallow cup of deep orange. Four round flowers to a stem. 1/6 each, 15/- dozen.  
**SCARLET GEM:** 3, P.D.W. Apricot yellow perianth and flat crinkled cup brick red. 2/6.  
**SOLEIL D'OR:** 0. The common Jonquil. 9/- dozen.  
**XERXES:** 5-6, R.O.B. White petals and deep orange cup. 1/6.

**POETICUS NARCISSI**

- DACTYL:** 5, G.H.E. The crown is yellow with a ribbed margin of red and a green base. 2/6.  
**RED RIM:** 6, G.H.E. Very round flat pure white perianth and large yellow eye broadly edged with red. 2/6.  
**SEA GREEN:** 6, G.H.E. The snowy white petals are perfectly circular, absolutely flat and of great substance. The large eye is pale green widely banded bright red. 30/-.  
**SUZETTE:** 5. Similar to Dactyl but a fraction smaller. 2/6.  
**SHANACH:** 6, G.L.W. Bred from Dactyl. A large flower with broad flat circular perianth and citron eye rimmed with red. Very lasting. 5/-.

**SPECIES AND MISCELLANEOUS NARCISSI**

**BULBOCODIUM:**

- b. *albidus zaianicus lutescens*: Under this formidable name shelters a robust creamy coloured Hoop Petticoat daffodil. Early. 10/-.  
 b. *filifolius*: A bright yellow bloom which appears a little later than the common Hoop Petticoat. 7 ins. 1/6.  
 b. *obesus*: Large shining rich yellow flowers. Short stems. Prostrate leaves. 3 ins. 2/6.  
 b. *romieuxii*: Small widely expanded crowns of sulphur yellow. Early. 3 ins. 4/-.  
 b. *romieuxii mesantlanticus*: A rare pale yellow Hoop Petticoat. 7/6.  
 b. *romieuxii riffanus*: Very open crown. Upright pose. 3 ins. 5/-.  
 b. *tenuifolius*: Small primrose flowers and narrow leaves. Early. 2/6.  
 b. *vulgaris genuinus*: Better known as N. bulbocodium or N. bulbocodium conspicuus. The common Hoop Petticoat daffodil. 6 ins. 1/6 each; 15/- dozen.  
 b. *vulgaris nivalis*: The smallest of the Hoop Petticoats. Tiny dark yellow leaves. 2 ins. 3/-.  
**cantabricus foliosus** (formerly b. *monophyllus foliosus*): Thin rush-like leaves. Milk white Hoop Petticoat flowers. Early. 3/-.  
**hedreanthus**: A newly rediscovered plant. Short stemmed primrose flowers obviously related to the bulbocodiums, unusual in their protruding stigmas and anthers. 15/-.  
**Jessamy**: D. Blanchard. b. *romieuxii x cantabricus foliosus*. Smart little Hoop Petticoat flowers which open cream and turn milk white. Wide shallow crown. Free flowering. Late. 10/-.  
**Nylon**: D. Blanchard. Resembles *cantabricus foliosus* but crowns are larger and more expanded and flowers appear earlier. 4 ins. 4/-.  
**Tarlatan**: D. Blanchard. Exquisite pure white bowl shaped crowns. Taller and larger than *cantabricus foliosus* and later to bloom. 15/-.

**TRUMPETS:**

- asturiensis (minimus)*: The earliest and smallest yellow trumpet. 2 to 3 ins. 3/-.  
*obvallaris (Tenby Daffodil)*: Sturdy smart golden flower. Neatly flanged and serrated trumpet, petals at right angles to trumpet. Very early. 10 ins. 2/6.  
**Little Beauty**: Gerritsen. Pure white perianth and bright yellow trumpet. 4 ins. 7/6.

**Pepper**: J. C. Williams. Bright orange-red cup and deep yellow perianth. Early. 12 ins. 3/6.

**TRIANDRUS:**

- t. *albus*: Angels' Tears. A lovely dwarf having two or three hanging bells with reflexed petals. 3 ins. None to offer.  
 t. *concolor*: A charming bright yellow version of Angels' Tears. A little taller and earlier flowering. 4 ins. 4/-.  
 For Triandrus hybrids see Division 5.

**CYCLAMINEUS:**

- cyclamineus*: Delightful little yellow species with long narrow trumpet looking down, petals sharply reflexed upwards. Very early. 4 ins. 5/-.  
 For Cyclamineus hybrids see Division 6.

**JONQUILLA:**

- calcicola*: Several little flowers on a stem with bright yellow petals and cup. 7/6.  
*fernandesii*: Discovered in Portugal in 1943; 1 to 3 golden yellow flowers on a stem. Neat little cups half as long as the rounded petals. Sweet scented. Early. 3 ins. 10/-.  
*gracilis*: Several light sulphur yellow flowers on a stem. Sweet scented. Very late. 4 ins. 3/-.  
*jonquilla*: Several narrow petaled short cupped golden stars. Entrancing perfume. Early. 10 ins. 2/-.  
*juncifolius*: Enchanting very small variable daffodil. Usually several tiny yellow flowers with quite wide cups. Scented. 2/-.  
*rupicola*: One flower on each stem, a perfect circle of mid-yellow. 3 ins. 3/-.  
*tenuior*: The "Small Straw-coloured Jonquil". 1 to 3 well-formed little flowers on each stem. Late. 5 ins. 4/-.  
*odorus campernelli*: The single campernelle. 1 to 3 small golden flowers with pointed petals and short serrated cup. Sweetly scented. 16 ins. 1/6 each, 15/- dozen.  
*odorus campernelli plenus*: The double campernelle; 1 to 3 double golden flowers. Sweetly scented. 15 ins. 3/-.

**Halingy**: A. Gray. Perianth milk white, cup pale yellow. Early. 6 ins. 10/-.

**POETICUS:**

- recurvus*: The old "Late Pheasant's Eye." One of the most powerfully scented narcissus. 16 ins. 1/6 each, 15/- dozen.
