

INTRODUCTIONS

- 4 **CANDIDA:** 3, J.L.R. A very fine double from Falaise x Petsamo. The outer petals are pure white, very broad and of great substance, the inner ones are not so broad, interspersed amongst these are smaller ones of palest primrose. A lovely full flower with a tall stiff stem. \$5.00.
- 2d **DAYDREAM:** 3, Mitsch. A very perfectly formed flower with very flat overlapping sulphur lemon perianth segments of good substance and texture; the trumpet-shaped crown opens lemon coloured, but quickly passes to white. \$8.00.
- 7b **DICKCISSEL:** 3-4, Mitsch. Binkie x Jonquilla. A complete break in colour. The perianth is of good substance in luminous lemon gold, the fluted, rather flaring crown being of similar shade on first opening, but soon passes to nearly pure white. Usually two or three flowers on a stem. \$25.00.
- 4 **GAY TIME:** 6, J.L.R. A fine double raised from Falaise x Limerick. A good large flower; the creamy outer petals are broad and the inner ones narrower and pointed; interspersed among these in the centre are small segments of bright orange-red. \$3.00.
- 3b **GOSSAMER:** 3, Mitsch. Rubra x Foggy Dew. Like Rubra this has a somewhat reflexed white perianth and a small crown of pale lemon, with a band of pink, about one-eighth inch wide at the margin. \$5.50.
- 1c **HIMALAYA:** 2-3, J.L.R. A magnificent large white trumpet; the very broad perianth segments are beautifully smooth and flat, of lovely quality, the inner ones having a slight inward roll. The large trumpet is widely flanged and rolled at the mouth. \$5.00.
- 2c **KNOWEHEAD:** 3, G.L.W. Nearly a trumpet, pure white throughout, with broad overlapping shovel-pointed perianth standing at right angles to the neatly proportioned beautifully flanged and fringed trumpet-shaped crown. Strong stiff stems. \$3.00.
- 2d **LIMEADE:** 2-3, Mitsch. This may be the best of this series as a garden flower because of its free flowering and long-lasting traits, and in addition it is of good exhibition form. Very flat, smooth, lemon perianth, with long, somewhat flaring crown that very slowly fades to creamy white. \$5.00.
- 2bp **MISS DON:** 3-4, J.N.H. A very attractive flower with a short cup of a delicate shade of pink. \$2.00.
- 9 **PERDITA:** 5, D. W. Gourlay. Medium sized flowers with flat perianth of purest white; the large flat eye is pale yellow with a green centre and a band of bright orange on the outer edge. \$2.00.
- 7b **PIPIT:** 3, Mitsch. A strikingly different flower; this, with Dickcissel and Verdin, introduce a new break in Daffodil breeding. Although the colour of the perianth is much paler than that of Dickcissel, the contrast in colour seems stronger, due, perhaps, to some reflexing of the petals in this one. Main stems carry two or three blooms. \$35.00.
- 1c **SILVER CIRCLE:** 3, J.N.H. This is a very decorative flower; it comes out cream, then goes white, but the edge always remains a distinct white. Can produce a unique show bloom. \$5.00.
- 7b **VERDIN:** 4, Mitsch. Another excellent flower from Binkie x Jonquilla. Soft lemon perianth with a crown that fades to white. This is paler than Dickcissel but deeper in colour than Pipit, with a more rounded form and increases a little faster. \$20.00.
- 1c **WHITE TRIUMPHATOR:** 3-4. Immense flower of perfect form, splendid carriage and stiff substance, very broad overlapping perianth of grand texture; the trumpet is well proportioned, straight, and gently serrated at mouth. The whole flower is silvery white. \$1.00.

YELLOW PERIANTH AND YELLOW TRUMPET

- ANTWERP:** 3, J.L.R. A large flower of grand show quality. Bold trumpet slightly flanged and serrated at the mouth. Deepest golden yellow throughout. 40c.
- ARCTIC GOLD:** 2-3, J.L.R. Goldcourt x Kingscourt. The whole flower is very deep gold. An exhibition bloom of superb quality. \$3.50.
- BURNISHED GOLD:** 5, J.L.R. Bred from Goldcourt. A lovely flower of superb quality. Very deep golden yellow and very late. \$5.00.
- CANDLELIGHT:** 3, J.N.H. Hunter's Moon x Kingscourt. The whole flower is the softest limey yellow on opening. As it develops the perianth retains its colour but the trumpet darkens and the edge, which is nicely rolled and serrated, becomes a bright lemon. A unique and most attractive bloom of the highest quality. \$9.00.
- CIRCUMSTANCE:** 3, J.N.H. A large impressive trumpet of good substance and quality on a tall stem. The trumpet, which is straight with a slightly flanged edge, is the same good yellow as the perianth. Useful for middle season shows. \$1.00.
- CLENDINNEN:** 2, Spry. A superb early exhibition flower, very strong and large, with good carriage and stem. The perianth is even, regular and flat, and the long solid yellow trumpet has a wide frilled flange. \$6.00.
- CLONCARRIG:** 4, J.L.R. Kilkenny x Goldcourt. A high quality exhibition bloom of uniform deep gold. \$1.00.
- CONVAIR:** 2, J.N.H. A lovely soft yellow flower with a gay and graceful appearance and very good exhibition form, 40c.
- CULLIAMURRA:** 1, J.N.H. Trawalla x Mortlake. An early flower of excellent quality and size. A good show flower. 30c.
- DAGRENA:** 3. Smooth yellow perianth well overlapping and attractively pointed. Large yellow trumpet. 30c.
- DANDENONG:** 3, J.N.H. A smooth round flower of very good form, coloured a beautiful rather soft shade of yellow. A tall, vigorous garden plant and a fine show flower. 25c.
- DARNAWAY:** 3, Brodie. A large clear mid-yellow trumpet of superb show form. \$2.00.
- FRONTIER:** 1, G.L.W. King of the North x Content. Large flower of first-class form with broad pointed smooth perianth and well-balanced neatly flanged trumpet. Soft primrose-lemon throughout. Medium height. 75c.
- GOLDEN EMPIRE:** 2, O.R. A fairly early, tall and very large and very even, smooth quality flower. A bold, flared trumpet of really dark colour, with a slightly paler perianth, exceptionally wide and overlapping. \$1.50.
- HILLSTON:** 1, J.N.H. Hebron x Mortlake. Very flat much overlapping perianth petals; perfectly proportioned trumpet. Deep yellow throughout. One of the best of the very early yellow trumpets. 50c.
- HOLROYD:** 4, J.N.H. Exceptionally smooth and good. A superb new exhibition yellow trumpet. \$2.00.
- JOB:** 3, W. Jackson. Excellent colour, quality, shape and carriage. A reliable seed parent. \$2.00.
- JOHN PEARCE:** 4, J.N.H. A late trumpet of superb exhibition quality. The perianth has great substance and the smoothest texture. The rather straight trumpet is evenly serrated at the mouth. The neck and stem are especially good. \$4.50.
- KINGLAKE:** 4, J.N.H. A late flower of excellent quality. The whole flower is a clear golden yellow. 30c.
- KINGSCOURT:** 3-4, J.L.R. Royalist x Crocus. A frequent championship winner. A flower of deep yellow with flat smooth perianth and well-balanced, bell-mouthed trumpet. \$1.00.
- MIDDAY:** 3, O. Ronalds. A large flower of wonderfully thick substance and rich dark colouring. The perianth segments are regular and wide, shovel-shaped and remarkably smooth. The trumpet is a darker gold. \$3.00.

- MILSON:** 4. A yellow trumpet of high quality. Flat overlapping perianth and slightly rolled trumpet. A fine show flower. 35c.
- OHAKEA:** 3, A. Gibson. Uniform clear bright yellow throughout. Good substance and smooth texture. A reliable exhibition flower. 75c.
- ONDINE:** 3, J.N.H. Roycroft x seedling bi-colour trumpet. This is a lovely greeny coloured flower useful for decorative work. The trumpet is rather large for the perianth for a show flower, but very lovely in a vase. 75c.
- PORTARLINGTON:** 3, J.L.R. Broad flat shovel-pointed perianth of smooth texture. Graceful trumpet flanged and serrated at the mouth. Soft golden yellow throughout. A fine exhibition bloom. \$1.00.
- PRETORIA:** 3, J.L.R. A superior show flower with slightly pointed perianth and well-proportioned trumpet evenly serrated and rolled back at the mouth. \$1.25.
- PRIMLOUGH:** 3, J. J. Brown. A lovely trumpet of smoothest texture, uniform primrose yellow throughout; good neck and stem. 75c.
- RABAU:** 5, J.N.H. A perfectly smooth very round well balanced flower of good stance, size and height. Very useful for late shows. 75c.
- REGAL STATUS:** 3, J.N.H. A stately flower of superb exhibition quality. The broad shovel-shaped petals overlap well and the long perfectly balanced trumpet is beautifully flanged and rolled. Deep yellow throughout. \$2.00.
- RIVERDALE:** 3, J. T. Gray. Beautifully smooth yellow perianth of round, shovel-shaped segments nicely overlapping. Trumpet a slightly deeper shade and evenly rolled at the brim. 25c.
- ROYAL OAK:** 4, J.L.R. A superb deep golden yellow trumpet. Bred from a seedling and Goldcourt. A flower of lovely quality with flat perianth of splendid substance; the trumpet is nicely serrated and rolled at the mouth. \$7.00.
- ROYCROFT:** 3, J.N.H. An outstanding exhibition variety. A large round flower on a tall strong stem, bright yellow in colour. Good cover and thick substance in the flat perianth. 75c.
- SPANISH GOLD:** 4, J.L.R. Kingscourt x Goldcourt. A large flower of faultless form and superb quality, with broad beautifully smooth rounded perianth of waxy substance, and a large bell-mouthed trumpet nicely flanged. Intense maximus gold throughout. \$3.00.
- STANDARD BEARER:** 4, J.L.R. A lovely medium-sized flower — a Goldcourt seedling, with broad flat smooth perianth of fine texture and a rather slender trumpet with a wide rolled nicely serrated flange. \$5.00.
- STRATHERIN:** 1. A beautiful early trumpet. The large open trumpet is a deeper yellow than the perianth and is neatly crimped at the edge. Very good show form. 40c.
- TRAWALLA:** 4, J.N.H. A most graceful and striking trumpet, very rich gold throughout. Very tall strong stem. 25c.
- TUDOR PRINCE:** 3, J.N.H. A large, clear mid-yellow flower of outstanding form, quality and carriage. Very broad, smooth, overlapping perianth standing at right-angles to the wide well-proportioned trumpet. Tall, strong stem and short neck. A perfect show flower and fine garden plant. \$1.50.
- TULENDENA:** 3, W. Jackson. A Jobi seedling of excellent colour, form and quality. Always comes perfect. \$3.00.
- VERDUN:** 4, J.N.H. A tall plant with a good neck and stem. A striking yellow trumpet. 40c.
- VIKING:** 4, J.L.R. A flower of lovely quality with broad, overlapping pointed perianth of smooth texture. The long graceful trumpet is expanded and frilled at the mouth. Deep clear yellow throughout. A.M. R.H.S., London, 1960, a show flower. \$5.00.
- WEXFORD:** 3, J.L.R. Superb show flower of uniform clear soft golden yellow. Perianth smooth and flat, trumpet expanded and frilled at the mouth. \$2.00.

WHITE PERIANTH AND COLOURED TRUMPET

- ALPINE EAGLE:** 3, J.L.R. Spitzbergen x Broughshane. A show flower of the highest quality with broad flat pure white perianth of unusual substance. The trumpet is rich creamy buff in colour. \$4.00.
- ANDANTE:** 4, J.N.H. This very lovely bi-colour is of marvellous texture. The perianth is immensely broad and the lemon trumpet is beautifully proportioned with a widely flanged and rolled back edge. A superb exhibition bloom. \$6.00.
- BESSIE C. SCOTT:** 4, H.A.B. Solid white perianth and bright yellow trumpet. Tall, strong grower. Good show form. 25c.
- BONNINGTON:** 3-4, C. E. Radcliff. A show flower with exceptionally smooth, broad, overlapping, solid perianth and light lemon trumpet. \$1.00.
- BRUGES:** 4, J.L.R. This fine pale bi-colour trumpet came from unusual parentage — self-fertilised Cromarty. It is a medium-sized flower of lovely quality, smooth shovel-pointed petals and well proportioned trumpet, neatly rolled and serrated at the mouth. \$1.50.
- CAPE HORN:** 1b, J.L.R. 3. An immense pale bicolour trumpet with very broad much overlapping white perianth of good substance, and a large primrose trumpet beautifully flanged and rolled at the mouth. \$5.00.
- CARAMEL:** 2, A. Clark. Good perianth and a soft clear yellow trumpet with a neatly recurved brim. An outstanding variety both for garden and for show. 50c.
- CHILTERN:** 1, J.N.H. A very beautiful and very early bi-colour trumpet, white and creamy yellow. Classic exhibition form and smooth texture, together with good size and stem. 75c.
- CONTENT:** 2-3, P.D.W. Uniform tone of clear soft greenish primrose throughout, gradually passing to a pale lemon white tone except the brim of the trumpet, which retains a charming frill of lemon. Tall but rather weak stem. A distinct and lovely flower. Ideal for decorative work and useful for exhibition. 30c.
- DEDERANG:** 3, J.N.H. An unusual decorative variety. The edge of the deep cream trumpet is jagged, and flecked with white. Good perianth and stem. 25c.
- DREAM TIME:** 2, J.N.H. A good sized flower of very smooth finish, fine substance, high quality. Flat white perianth and well proportioned, straight, neatly serrated trumpet which opens soft yellow and passes gradually to a most lovely rosy cream entrancingly rich and delicate in effect. \$8.00.
- ECHUCA:** 3, J.N.H. A distinct flower of outstanding character. Perianth of tremendous substance completely overlapping. Large well proportioned trumpet of strong bright yellow. 75c.
- FORESIGHT:** 1, G.L.W. A flower of first rate form and good quality, with broad, flat white perianth and well-proportioned neatly flanged golden trumpet. 25c.
- GLENGARRIFF:** 4, J.L.R. A most distinct large flower, with broad pure white perianth of very good form and substance, rather pointed at the tips and a beautifully formed primrose trumpet, with a cream brim to its wide flange. An ideal show flower. 75c.
- GLENRAVEL:** 3, G.L.W. Pure white perianth, broad and overlapping; trumpet clear pale lemon passing almost to white. A good exhibition bloom. 25c.
- HOYLE:** 3, J.N.H. A very large flower with parchment-like perianth well overlapping. As the long bell-mouthed trumpet ages the inside pales to nearly white but the outside remains yellow. Well poised on a strong stem. A championship winner. \$2.00.
- KWINANA:** 3, J.N.H. A very large bi-colour trumpet of much substance. The perianth is of a thick waxy texture and the long but well-balanced trumpet is of a medium yellow slightly rolled back and fringed at the edge. Wonderful lasting quality. 50c.
- MURCHISON:** 5, J.N.H. Very smooth and good. Bright yellow trumpet contrasting with ice white perianth. Very late. 40c.

- NEWCASTLE:** 3-4, W. J. Dunlop. Undoubtedly the best bi-colour trumpet up to date. A lovely large flower with broad flat pure white perianth of grand substance and quality. Deep golden yellow trumpet. Best bloom London 1962. \$15.00.
- NORTHLEA:** 3, J.N.H. A very attractive flower with a bright yellow trumpet neatly rolled at the edge. A large flower on a tall, massive stem. \$1.50.
- OLIVER:** 4, O.R. An immense flower raised from Mrs. Krelage x Renown. \$1.00.
- PALE MOON:** 4, C. O. Fairbairn. A beautiful flower with good overlap and substance. Deep yellow trumpet nicely flanged and serrated at the edge. \$2.50.
- PREAMBLE:** 2, G.L.W. A beautiful exhibition quality first early bi-colour having broad, flat, smooth, pure white perianth and bright rich chrome yellow trumpet, which goes a little paler as the flower ages. \$1.00.
- ROSTELLA:** 3, C. E. Radcliff. A well-formed flower, the trumpet coloured a good shade of pink. An excellent show flower. 75c.
- SPITZBERGEN:** 4, J.L.R. This is a really magnificent flower, with broad, rounded overlapping ivory-white perianth of great substance. The large bold trumpet is nicely flanged and well rolled back at brim; this opens pale primrose and gradually whitens with age, taking a considerable time to develop fully. Tall, strong stem with broad foliage. \$1.00.
- TINTERN:** 3, J.N.H. A smart exhibition flower with pure white, flat, waxy perianth and soft yellow straight trumpet. 50c.
- TROSTAN:** 4, G.L.W. A tall plant; broad flat white perianth and boldly flanged lemon trumpet. 40c.
- TROUSSEAU:** 3, P.D.W. An exquisite bi-colour trumpet of superb quality, perfect form, great substance and fine texture. Flat pure white perianth and well-proportioned straight, neatly flanged trumpet, which opens soft yellow and passes gradually to a rich buff rosy cream. \$1.00.
- VANA:** 4, J.N.H. A very useful late tall bi-colour of good substance and contrast. \$1.00.
- WINDSOR:** 4, J.N.H. An excellent late flower with broad, flat, smooth, pure white perianth of splendid substance, and pale gold trumpet nicely serrated at mouth. Tall, strong stem and good neck. Champion 1b 1958, Grand Champion 1959, at R.H.S., Melbourne. Grand Champion, Skipton, 1960; Ferny Creek, 1960. \$1.00.
- WINDERMERE:** 4, H.A.B. White perianth and well-balanced lemon-yellow trumpet. Tall, strong stem. Late. 20c.

WHITE PERIANTH AND WHITE TRUMPET

- ANDES:** 2-3, J.L.R. A fine large pure white flower with broad, smooth, flat, shovel-pointed perianth, and a large slightly expanded trumpet, beautifully rolled and serrated at the mouth. \$6.00.
- ARCTIC PRINCE:** 4, J.L.R. The perianth is very broad and round, standing at right angles to the bold trumpet, which is nicely expanded with a neat roll at the mouth. Very robust plant and superb show flower. \$3.00.
- ARDCLINIS:** 3, G.L.W. A large flower of lovely form, balance and quality, clear white throughout; trumpet beautifully proportioned and nicely flanged at mouth. 75c.
- BEERSHEBA:** 3, G. H. Engleheart. Trumpet long and slightly funnel-shaped; segments long and slightly pointed. A very beautiful flower. 75c.
- CAMERONIAN:** 4, Brodie. An immense flower with broad overlapping perianth of grand texture. The trumpet is well proportioned with a nicely serrated edge. The whole flower is uniform pure white. 50c.

- CLETUS:** 3, J. T. Gray. A large trumpet of good exhibition quality. May be described as a larger and much improved Beersheba. \$1.25.
- GLACIER:** 3, J.L.R. Broughshane x Killaloe. Perianth flat, very broad and overlapping, standing at right angles to the large bell-mouthed trumpet which is flanged and frilled. A beautiful show flower and very robust plant. Awards of merit from R.H.S., London and from Wisley. \$10.00.
- HAIL STORM:** 3-4, J.N.H. An immense bloom with a very broad perianth forming a complete circle of purest white and a magnificently widely flanged and serrated trumpet of palest lemon passing to white. \$1.50.
- HOTHU:** 4, W. Jackson. A well-balanced flower of purest white. The perianth is of excellent substance and the trumpet is well flanged and slightly rolled back. \$1.25.
- JOSEPHINE:** 3, J.N.H. A very beautiful white trumpet of superb form, quality and substance. Broad overlapping white perianth standing at right angles to the perfectly proportional cream-white trumpet. Short neck and strong stem. 50c.
- KANCHENJUNGA:** 3, G.L.W. An immense bloom; perianth broad and overlapping; huge trumpet widely flanged and serrated; perianth pure white, trumpet palest lemon passing to white. \$1.50.
- LOCHLEE:** 4, J.N.H. Lyndale Giant x Kanchenjunga. The parchment-like perianth of this large flower is overlapped well, and the trumpet of palest cream is very much serrated and rolled back at the edge. A good neck and stem. \$2.00.
- LUX:** 3, J.N.H. A fine large variety of good shape and substance; colour creamy white passing to ivory. The trumpet has a nicely serrated edge. 35c.
- MT. KOSCIUSKO:** 3, J.N.H. A trumpet of good quality bred from Tenedos x Kantara. A large flower of good shape and substance; colour creamy white passing to ivory. Tall, strong stem. 35c.
- RASHEE:** 3, G.L.W. Cotterton x Broughshane. A recently introduced variety very highly rated in Britain. \$6.00.
- SOLITUDE:** 4, J.N.H. A very lovely exhibition white trumpet. Perfectly smooth and perfectly formed. Ice white with a green glow at the base of the trumpet. \$4.00.
- SUNWHITE:** 5, J.N.H. The whole flower a uniform pearly white. Distinctive perfectly straight trumpet. Very late. 40c.
- THURSO:** 3, Brodie. An immense white flower with very board, smooth perianth of grand quality and substance and large bell-mouthed, nicely frilled trumpet. Can be a first-class show bloom. \$1.00.
- TRUEFORM:** 3, J.N.H. A lovely flower of purest sparkling white. The broad petals are sharply pointed and the straight trumpet is well crimped at the edge. Excellent poise and substance. \$5.00.
- WHITE HILLS:** 4, J.N.H. A large smooth flower of medium height. The trumpet is open and appears more like a 2c. 50c.
- WHITE XMAS:** 5, J.N.H. An enormous but well-formed white trumpet. Standing tall and erect, this is one of the most striking very late varieties. 75c.

COLOURED PERIANTH AND WHITE TRUMPET (Reversed Bi-Colour Trumpets)

- MULATTO:** 1, C. G. van Tubergen: The flower opens sulphur yellow throughout, but the trumpet passes to white except for a tinge of pale lemon at the brim. Very good stance, size and form. 50c.
- SPELLBINDER:** 2, G.L.W. A large flower of clear luminous greeny sulphur lemon. When fully developed, the inside of the flanged trumpet passes almost to white, while the outside retains its colour. Very useful for exhibition. \$1.00.

DIVISION 2a.

YELLOW PERIANTH AND YELLOW LARGE CUP

- AMBERLEY:** 3, F. C. Stern. St. Egwin x Crocus. Uniform clear golden yellow throughout. Well proportioned bowl-shaped cup. 40c.
- BALMORAL:** 3, Brodie. Broad overlapping perianth and a large cup frilled at mouth. The whole flower is a uniform clear deep yellow. An outstanding variety both in the garden and for exhibition. 50c.
- CASTLEDERMOT:** 2, J.L.R. Crocus x Cromarty. Broad rounded overlapping perianth and large cup slightly expanded and rolled at the mouth. Uniform clear gold. Tall and strong. 75c.
- FILIGREE:** 2, J.N.H. A fine decorative flower of a uniform soft yellow. The wide crown is intensely frilled. A good neck and stem. 75c.
- GALWAY:** 3, J.L.R. Tall, strong-stemmed, intense self-golden flower, bordering on trumpet proportions; having a broad, smooth perianth and a well flanged crown. 75c.
- GOLDEN VINTAGE:** 2, J.N.H. A superior and very useful exhibition bloom. Perfectly flat, smooth, overlapping perianth and darker yellow cup with distinctive wide and even fluting. Good stance, size, and height. 50c.
- GRENOBLE:** 1, J.N.H. Well formed yellow perianth and large, open ruffled cup of deeper yellow. Suitable for exhibition and outstanding for garden display. 30c.
- KILFINNAN:** 3-4, J.L.R. The perianth is broad and of the most perfect smooth waxy texture; the medium-sized cup is nicely proportioned and slightly serrated at the mouth the whole flower is uniform clear soft yellow. 50c.
- LEITRIM:** 4, J.L.R. A very fine golden yellow flower after the style of Galway. The perianth is very broad and overlapping, slightly pointed at the tips, and the large crown is bell-shaped, nicely flanged, and deeply serrated at the mouth. Tall, strong plant, free flowering. \$1.00.
- PICCOLO:** 3, C. O. Fairbairn. A flower of excellent substance and deep rich colour. The long cup is very neatly flanged. \$1.00.
- SHANGHAI:** 3, Warnaar. A large and distinctive flower. Soft lemon yellow throughout and very well formed. 75c.
