The catalogue gives descriptions of selected varieties arranged according to their classification.

The Royal Horticultural Society's system of classification is followed with two exceptions:—

Division 2a is split into two parts, the first comprising large-cupped daffodils with yellow colouring throughout.

Division 2b is split into two parts, the second comprising large-cupped daffodils with pink colouring in the cup. (Trumpet daffodils with pink colouring appear in Division 1b.)

The figure after a name indicates the relative time of flowering — Number 0 the earliest and Number 6 the latest.

This is followed by the name or initials of the raiser of the variety. The following raisers are indicated by initials:—

G.L.W.—Guy L. Wilson, N. Ireland. J.N.H.—J. N. Hancock & Co., Victoria.
H.A.B.—H. A. Brown, Victoria. O.R.—Oscar Ronalds, Victoria.
J.L.R.—J. L. Richardson, Eire. P.D.W.—P. D. Williams, England.

Prices shown are for one bulb of each variety. Generally one dozen bulbs of a variety are supplied for the price of ten. Thus, for example, 30 cents each implies \$3.00 per dozen. Special quotes for hundreds.

LITTLE IMP: 3-4, J.N.H. Another baby pink similar to Little Flirt but the long cup is overall pale pink. \$1.50.

Milady: A dainty little flower. Smart white perianth and long trumpet-shaped crown, butter yellow and distinctly flanged. 12 ins. 30c.

SPLIT: 3. An unusual variety from Div. II. White outer petals and pale lemon flat corona is split into four parts. \$1.00.

TULIPA SPECIES

CHRYSANTHA: A charming and elegant flower of yellow with a red exterior. Multiplies freely. 8 ins. \$1.00 each.

T SAXATILUS (The Satin Tulip): A lovely species that flowers freely bearing one to five or more flowers to a stem. Delicate lilac-rose with bright yellow base. Should be planted in a sunny situation. \$2.50 per dozen.

T SYLVESTRIS: The outside of this charming flower is greenish yellow and inside pure rich yellow. Two or three flowers on a stem. Spreads freely if planted in a sunny situation where bulbs can be baked in summer. \$1.00 each.

On Growing Daffodils

Daffodils will grow almost anywhere in Australia, but they seem to do best in districts where the winter is cold and the summer dry. Type of soil does not appear to influence the bulbs especially; good drainage and deep thorough working of the soil are the essentials.

Daffodils need a little of all basic plant foods, but English experiments suggest that in good soil the only additive which will produce an evident response is potash. Compost and well-rotted animal manure are suitable fertilisers, but most standard market garden mixtures are satisfactory. The fertiliser may be worked into the ground below bulb depth before planting, and potash added as a top-dressing before or after flowering. Heavy feeding increases size but there is a coarsening of texture and loss of refinement in the bloom.

The bulbs can be planted at any time in the summer, autumn or winter, but the usual practice is to plant during March. Early planting, if it is followed by rain or watering, gives the bulb a good start for the season.

In choosing a place to plant, the essential consideration is protection from wind. The chief enemy of the flowers, as for most plants, is a hot wind.

The bulbs need to be planted at a depth sufficient to ensure that they remain cool in summer. For an average sized bulb in average soil this means two or three inches of soil above the bulb. Distance between bulbs can vary within wide limits, but a normal spacing would be three or four inches apart.

Regular cultivation will help keep the ground moist and will check weed growth. Mulching is beneficial especially in sandy soils. The growth of the bulbs will be interrupted by prolonged dry weather, and in some districts watering may be required in the early autumn or late spring.

Daffodils can be left in the ground indefinitely, but it is usual to lift and divide every three years. The best time to lift is in the early summer after the foliage has died down and before new root growth has begun. The bulbs should be stored in an airy place on shallow trays. When replanting, offsets which separate easily should be removed from the main bulb.

Time of flowering is not decided by the time of planting, some varieties have the habit of blooming early, others of blooming late. Nevertheless, a new planting will usually bloom ahead of the same variety left in the ground for several years. In most of southern Australia, daffodils flower in August and September, with a few very early varieties in July and a few very late varieties in October. Together with other spring flowers, they will appear in some districts sooner than in others; generally, the cooler the climate the later the time of flowering.

Daffodils are easy to keep in good health. The most reliable means of dealing with almost any complaint is the hot water treatment. In the summer when the bulbs have dried out after lifting they are put in water which is kept at a temperature between 110 and 112 deg. F. for from one to four hours, depending on the size of the bulb. Formalin (40% formaldehyde) is added to the water to make an 0.5% solution, i.e., 1½ fluid oz. (3 tablespoons) to 2 gallons of water. A Fowler's Vacola bottling outfit, preferably with thermostatic control, would seem to be suitable equipment to use in giving the hot water treatment. Under certain circumstances the treatment may produce mottling of the foliage and distortion of the bloom, but only in the immediately following season. Commercial growers apply the treatment to healthy bulbs to encourage more vigorous growth.

In the case of basal rot, dusting with sulphur during storage and before planting is a preventive measure, and affected bulbs may be dipped in a fungicide such as Benlate. Daffodils are not as subject to virus diseases as most plants, but foliage and blooms may be deformed and discoloured from this cause, and there is no known remedy.

- 2a **HAY MAKER:** 2, J.N.H. A very large arresting flower on a very tall strong stem. The flat yellow perianth shows off a large expanded pleated dark orange crown with a gold base. \$1.00.

- BRAEMAR:** 3. Fine golden yellow trumpet of beautifully smooth texture with very flat-broad perianth of good substance. The trumpet is nicely rolled back at mouth. 50c.
- BUKA:** 3, J.N.H. A large and beautiful yellow trumpet of deep gold. The edge of the trumpet is delightfully crimped. 35c.
- BURNISHED GOLD:** 5, J.L.R. Bred from Goldcourt. A lovely flower of superb quality. Very deep golden yellow and very late. \$3.00.
- CANARY:** 3, Fairbairn. As the name implies this is canary yellow throughout. A good show flower of excellent form and texture. \$2.00.

- CIRCUMSTANCE:** 3, J.N.H. A large impressive trumpet of good substance and quality on a tall stem. The trumpet, which is straight with a slightly langed edge, is the same good yellow as the perianth. Useful for middle season shows. 60c.
- DANDENONG:** 3, J.N.H. A smooth round flower of very good form, coloured a beautiful rather soft shade of yellow. A tall, vigorous garden plant and a fine show flower. 35c.
- DARNAWAY:** 3, Brodie. A large clear mid-yellow trumpet of superb show form. \$1.50.
- DUNGIVEN:** 3, G.L.W. Fine large tall-growing rich clear self golden trumpet; broad smooth pointed flat perianth, straight sided well serrated trumpet. 35c.
- EARLY SENSATION:** O, V. D. Schoot. A remarkable and very attractive bold yellow trumpet that flowers early in June. 50c.
- FRONTIER:** 1, G.L.W. King of the North x Content. Large flower of first-class form with broad pointed smooth perianth and well-balanced neatly flanged trumpet. Soft primrose-lemon throughout. Medium height. 75c.

- GWEN FLEMING:** 3, O.R. A perfectly balanced and very round flower of superb quality. Very smooth and well overlapped perianth. The darker yellow trumpet is slightly expanded with the mouth rolled back a little and slightly frilled. \$2.75.
- HORACE SHAILER:** 3-4, G. Gibson. A fine exhibition trumpet of immense substance. Rich yellow perianth and nicely rolled deeper toned trumpet, \$2.50.
- JOB:** 3, W. Jackson. Excellent colour, quality, shape and carriage. A reliable seed parent. Best bloom Box Hill, 1974. \$1.00.
- KINDRED:** 3, G.L.W. A large rich self golden trumpet of first class quality. Broad pointed smooth perianth and trumpet nicely flanged. \$1.50.
- KINGSCOURT:** 3-4, J.L.R. Royalist x Crocus. A frequent championship winner. A flower of deep yellow with flat smooth perianth and well-balanced, bell-mouthed trumpet. \$1.00.
- KING'S RANSOM:** 4, J.L.R. Kingscourt x Goldcourt. Uniform deep gold. \$4.00.
- KIRRIBILLI:** 3, E. Murray. A show trumpet of excellent form and texture. \$1.00.
- McROB:** 3-4, J.N.H. A well poised flower, very rounded perianth of good substance and a long trumpet expanded and frilled at the mouth. The whole flower is of the richest gold and a proven show bloom. 75c.
- MUCH BINDING:** 2, J.N.H. A trumpet of striking appearance. The flat perianth is rather pointed and the trumpet is long with serrated edge of deeper yellow. Popular for decorative work. 35c.
- PRETORIA:** 3, J.L.R. A superior show flower with slightly pointed perianth and well proportioned trumpet evenly serrated and rolled back at the mouth. 40c.
- REGENCY:** 3-4, J.N.H. An outstanding show flower of rich yellow. Very good perianth and refined trumpet. \$1.00.
- ROYAL ARMOUR:** 1. A very smooth and shapely exhibition golden yellow trumpet that flowers in July. Its earliness makes it a winner as both a garden or a cut flower. 75c.
- SLIEVEBOY:** 3-4, G.L.W. Bred from Royalist x Gold Digger. A large clear self yellow trumpet of quite perfect form, \$1.00.
