Dear Daffodil Friends,

Once again it is time to put our catalogue together.

This flowering season has been the most rewarding we have experienced.

The joy of sharing our blooms with so many people on our weekend Open Days, walking the beds of the new seedlings and looking at all the exciting cultivars flowering for the first time and to be released in future years gives a lot of pleasure; we feel we are really achieving results. We had great success on the show bench winning GRAND CHAMPION at HOBART with a 2w-p No. 67/89 on its first flowering, and at LAUNCESTON with a 2w-w No. 35/86. We also won 14 CLASS CHAMPIONS including three with this year's New Releases.

You will notice that we have added stem length and the flower diameter to our New Release descriptions, also The Royal Horticultural Society's Colour Chart comparisons where relevant. We hope this helps in giving a true description to those who can't visit our garden and see the flowers in bloom.

Our descriptions now have the registered name of the cultivar, with its colour code, followed by a number indicating time of flowering. No.1 for those flowering before September, No.2 for flowering in the first week of September, No.3 for the second week, No.4 for the third week, No.5 for the last of September and No.6 for those few flowering in October. The variety's seedling number follows (in brackets) with the last

number being the cultivar's first year of flowering, i.e. (306/80) first flowered in 1980. Then listed is the variety's parentage which is sometimes of interest to other breeders, and stem length, early in flowering, measured in millimetres. (Twenty five millimetres equals one inch). Finally, the flower diameter, again in millimetres, so you can tell if the cultivar is abnormally large or small.

We hope the new format is of assistance and not causing confusion. All the above of course is how they grow here at Surges Bay. Hopefully they won't vary much in your garden although it has been our experience that other growers' cultivars take two or three years before settling down and producing their best blooms in our garden.

Please order as early as possible and include alternatives in case of demand outstripping supply. We mail Overseas Orders early as possible as we believe this assists with acclimatising bulbs posted to the northern hemisphere.

We are delighted to hear of success of Jackson-bred Cultivars. We also appreciate any constructive criticism that may help us improve our service to you, our Customers, and I hope, our friends.

We enjoy having visitors and our Open Weekend will be the Saturday afternoon 15th and all Sunday 16th September 1990.

- BEAUFORT** 2-3. (113/78) *Cyros x Helsal*. Stem 380. Diam. 110  
 1w-y A smooth triangular perianth with no staining from the bright, yellow 3A, trumpet. The trumpet is considerably longer than the petals and is slightly expanding with a frill at its end. A long lasting flower. \$8.50
- KUKIM** 3. (234/79). *Daric x Helsal*. Stem 350. Diam. 104.  
 1w-y A bright bi-colour trumpet of terrific substance. The petals are thick pure white with no staining from the corona. The trumpet is average width, slightly tapered with a slight flare and ruffle, is bright lemon coloured, yellow 7C, and seven mm longer than the petals. A very, very consistent excellent show flower. CHAMPION Launceston 1989. \$45
- KEMBLA** 1-2 (15/78) *Mercedes x 172/65*. Stem 480. Diam. 103.  
 1w-w An early consistent white trumpet that produces a high percentage of show flowers and is proving to be a good parent. Smooth shovel shaped petals with the back touching. The trumpet is tapered with a roll. CHAMPION Launceston '83, Hobart 83/85/86. \$43.00
- KINGURRA** 1-2. (67/77). *Mercedes x 19/70*. Stem 500. Diam 107.  
 1w-w The perianth is smooth and triangular. The petals are slightly pointed and wide at their base with the back set overlapping. The trumpet is almost straight with slight ruffling at its end. Very consistent. \$23.00
- RAUN** 2. (70/78). *Mercedes x Glendermott*. Stem 440. Diam 105.  
 1w-w Another early white trumpet that is smooth, has good substance and is consistent. The trumpet is only slightly longer than the petals and has a distinctive roll and frill. CHAMPION Launceston '87, Hobart '89. \$28
- KING HIT** 2. (119/79). *Yoone x Ra*. Stem 520. Diam. 100.  
 2y-yoo A flower that is always in our show team. A round flower with broad shovel-shaped petals. The acorn-shaped cup is yellow at its base and orange 28A for two-thirds of its length ending in a slight frill. \$55.00  
 CHAMPION Hobart '79, 87.
- POSAI** 3. (279/79) *Chino x Daydream*. Stem 400. Dia. 98.  
 2y-p Our first yellow pink release and although there are better on the way we believe it is still worth listing. The perianth is rich yellow of good form and is slightly cupped with a slight halo at its junction with the cup. The cup is three-quarter length with an expanded frill. The cup is a pale pink-yellow colour that pinkens slightly more with maturity. A productive parent. \$15.00
- GETAWAY** 4-5. (205/81). *242/75 x Sea Dream*. Stem 500. Diam. 100.  
 3y-gyy A smooth perianth of rounded petals that are paler than the cup. Petals Yellow 4D, cup Yellow 12A. The cup is delicately frilled and has a deep green eye. A very definite Division Three with a petal length of 45mm and cup length of 10mm. Good stance and proven parent of 3y-y. \$18.00
- KROS** 4-5. (223/80) *Tia x Kopi*. Stem 530. Diam 90.  
 A bright flower with broad shovel-shaped back petals that overlap. The acorn shaped cup is bright red and only just one-third the length of the petals. \$12.50
- FARRAGO** 2-3. (287/80) *Placid x Verona*. Stem 450. Diam. 93.  
 A round white flower that opens with the cup slightly yellow which then fades to creamy white. The petals are smooth and rounded. Stands up well and is early for its Division. Consistent and a good show flower. CHAMPION Launceston 85, 89, Hobart 89. \$28.00

- TRU 2-3. (245/77). Bandit x 221/69. Stem 460. Diam. 100.**  
 3w-wwy A very attractive flower that has a flat white cup with a narrow bright Yellow 6A, rim. The perianth is round with good substance. The back petals overlap with the front only slightly smaller. Stands up well on a good stem and is consistent. Has often been in our winning teams and easily measures Division Three. **\$38.00**
- HUON GLOW 5. 306/80). Signal Light x Tavelle. Stem 500. Diam. 90.**  
 4w-y A vigorous sturdy double of thick substance with up to four layers of petals interspersed with short bright orange-yellow petaloids. Sometimes has pollen and style. **\$15.00**
- HUON PRIDE 5. (300/76) Chimeon x Tavelle. Stem 500. Diam. 93.**  
 4w-w The petaloids are pale yellow on opening soon fading to a white only very slightly creamier than the petals. A full symmetrical double with five sets of petals and a tall strong stem. All white doubles are rare but this flowers too late for Tasmanian Shows. **\$20.00**
- CLASS 1 YELLOW TRUMPETS**
- BARFLY 3. (97/64) Otewa x Comal.** A slightly smaller mid-season trumpet that is consistent. The perianth is flat and smooth and forms two triangles. The trumpet is straight with a slightly frilled edge. It stands extremely well and is a uniform colour. CHAMPION Canberra 1977, 1983 **\$10.00**
- BEGA 2. (86/76) Otewa x Ristin.** A definite trumpet with a rounded perianth with both sets of petals almost touching. The trumpet is almost straight with a slight roll and frill; it is in proportion to the rest of the flower. Stands well. CHAMPION Whitmore 1987. **\$12.00**
- BIOGRAPH 2. (59/78) Comal x 1/69.** A glistening smooth perianth of golden yellow with the back petals touching at their base, and the front petals only slightly narrower. The trumpet is of good proportion and finishes with a frilled edge. CHAMPION Hobart '85. **\$20.00**
- HAZARD 1. (25/76) Ristin x Warbin.** A golden trumpet with the back shovel-shaped petals touching. The trumpet is darker, slightly tapered with a small frill. The stem is tall. CHAMPION Hobart 1980. **\$15.00**
- HITCHHIKER 1. (25/79) Ristin x Otewa.** A good even smooth flower of deep golden yellow. The petals are shovel shaped and have great substance. The trumpet is slightly tapered and has a small frill. Stands very well on a tall strong stem. CHAMPION Hobart 1986. **\$20**
- MINDER 2. (33/77) Comal x Yarley.** A good deep yellow trumpet that is consistent and stands well on a strong stem. The trumpet is slightly deeper yellow than the perianth, is straight with almost no frill. **\$ 9.00**
- RICOM 2. (25/73). Comal x Ristin.** A very smooth even yellow trumpet. The major petals meet and the minor almost meet. All are smooth and broad. The trumpet is just a slightly deeper yellow, well formed with a serrated edge. A well balanced bloom with good carriage. **\$10.00**

**TIERCEL** 3. (64/73). Pedigree unknown. A very consistent flower of golden yellow in both perianth and trumpet. The perianth is very smooth with shovel shaped minor petals. The cup is neatly serrated at the rim and is well balanced to the perianth. It has excellent stance and is slightly smaller than most of our trumpets but deserves a place as it flowers later than most yellow trumpets. \$ 6.00

**WATCHA** 2. (34/78) Comal x Warbin. A large flower of even colour on a tall stem. A definite trumpet which is slightly tapered, rolled and frilled. CHAMPION Hobart 1979. \$15.00

**BI-COLOUR TRUMPETS**  
(White Perianth, Yellow Trumpets)

**COMPUTE** 1-2. (36/79) Lenz x Helsal. A large early bi-colour which has a very large long trumpet of bright lemon yellow that does not stain the perianth. The perianth is triangular and very smooth, opens a little muddy but whitens to a pure white. A very consistent smooth flower carried well on a tall stem. CHAMPION Launceston 1986. \$25.00

**DABSTER** 1. (36/78, 73/69 x Lod). A very even smooth flower that stands well on a tall strong stem. The petals are shovel-shaped of good substance and not stained at the cut off to the bright trumpet. A very pleasing flower because of the pure white perianth and clear yellow trumpet. Been in many winning teams. PREMIER 1w-y Spring World 1984. \$35.00

**PREDATOR** 3. (216/79) Helsal x Lenz. A bi-colour that just measures with the trumpet and petals the same length. The trumpet is lemon-coloured, narrow, tubular with a slight expansion at its slightly frilled end. \$15.00

**QUENCH** 2. (13/76) Betrin x Lod. An early definite trumpet that is consistent, smootheven and stands well on a good strong stem. The perianth is triangular with the back petals larger than the minor petals. The trumpet is straight with a slight roll, a lemon yellow and does not stain the perianth. \$12.00

**WHITE TRUMPETS**

**CRUSTA** 2. (54/73) Mercedes x Saroya. A largish bloom that flowers early for a white trumpet. Has broad shovel shaped inner and outer petals of good substance. The cup easily measures trumpet, is slightly flanged and frilled. \$10.00

**KINDEE** 3.4. (209/71) Karel x Kareeia. A chrySTALLINE flower which is white on opening. The perianth has very wide minor petals of very strong substance. The attractive trumpet is nicely serrated with a green eye. Strong grower, good carriage with flower at right angles to the short neck. Very consistent. \$15.00

**TRIFECT** 2. (19/78). Mercedes x (45/61 x Caprice). An early white with broad shovel shaped petals. the trumpet is slightly flanged and frilled. Stands well on a tall stem.. \$12.00

**ABONA** 3. (50/71). Goldscript x Berrima. The smooth perianth is a golden yellow of good substance and shovel shaped petals. The cup is a deep golden yellow slightly deeper in colour than the perianth. It is a strong grower with excellent posture. Very consistent, every bloom a show bloom. \$ 6.00

**ACCRUAL** 1. (164/79) Warcom x Akala. A smooth and consistent flower of lemon-yellow with the trumpet slightly darker than the perianth. The petals are smooth and oval with a more than reasonable overlap. The cup is slightly waisted, flanged and is only a little shorter than the petals. \$15.00

**GLIDER** 3. (42/72). Ristin x 128/65. A rich deeper yellow flower of good substance and smoothness with the minor petals not quite as rounded as the major. The trumpet is well balanced, slightly flanged and the same shade as the perianth. It has excellent carriage. \$ 8.00

**GOOLA** 3. (56/70). 101/65 x 216/65. Very like Camelot in form but a much deeper golden yellow and much smoother substance. Very vigorous grower. \$ 4.00

**PROSKA** 3. (88/70). Goldscript x Vixi. This flower has a very smooth flat perianth, a pleasing shade of yellow, but paler than the nicely serrated cup. Beautiful substance in the perianth. It has a short, stiff neck and bold appearance. Good doer and every bloom good. RESERVE CHAMPION Orange 1979. BEST BLOOM Spring World '84, CHAMPION Hobart '85, Ulverstone '87 \$ 8.00

**SCIPIO** 3. (137/73). Camelot x Manuella. A good addition to its class which is smooth even and consistent. The minor petals are smaller than the major and the plain cup is slightly darker than the perianth. It stands well on a strong stem with every bloom identical. \$10.00

## LARGE CUPS - Yellow/Red

**AUSPICIOUS** 2. (214/77). Gunsynd x Brett. The first orange flushed perianth we have described on releasing as an Orange Perianth. A large flower on a tall stem with a long lasting pronounced flushed perianth. The flowers form is good with broad shovel shaped petals, almost touching at their base, to form a slightly cupped perianth. The cup is more than half length, slightly expanding and bright orange to its base. 2 o-o \$10.00

**COLORFUL** 2.3. (176/71). Dimity Seedling x Bilboa. A very distinctive red yellow. Perianth is a deep golden yellow, flat, smooth and very nicely rounded and of good substance. Cup is solid red throughout, rather flat and slightly serrated at rim. A very well balanced flower with good carriage. Very, very consistent and seldom nicks. One of our best recommended. Class 2y-r. PREMIER Nth. Island N.Z. 1982. \$15.00

**DYNAMIC** 2.3. (205/71). Bilboa x 215/65 (Dimity x 118/57). Smooth deep yellow perianth with lovely rounded broad smooth petals. Cup is golden yellow for more than 2/3rds of its length, then has a lovely serrated rim of brilliant red. A flattish cup. A most attractive and well balanced red and not predominant flower. Consistent, seldom nicks. Class 2y-yyr. \$ 8.00

**JUEL 2. (72/69).** Bred from **Tanais x 18/60**, which was a Mars x Ceylon cross. It has the lovely rounded perianth of Mars with Ceylon colouring. The cup has a wide, nicely serrated rim ranging from red at the edge toning to orange at the base. The red seems to reflect on to the perianth. A well balanced flower with good carriage. Does not burn 'til old. AUS. CUP, Hobart 1974. **\$10.00**

**KASIA 3. (113/65).** This flower was bred from two numbered seedlings of ours and was in the Tasmanian Cup team on its first flowering. The perianth is of bright red at the rim, shading down to deep orange at the base. The flower has good carriage on a tall strong stem. RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION, Claremont 1966, Bagdad 1968 ; CHAMPION Launceston 1969, Canberra 1972, Hobart 1981 ; PREMIER Sth. Island N.Z. 1982, 1983. **\$ 8.00**

**MATTARA 1. (2/70).** Another **Tanais x 18/60**. A striking flower of good presentation. Smooth deep yellow well shaped perianth with a narrow serrated cup toning from reddish orange at the rim and slightly paler at the base. Does not burn. **\$ 6.00**

**ODULATION 3. (282/78) 166/73 x latros.** Later flowering with a lemon perianth of broad shovel shaped petals that touch at the back and almost touch at the front. The goblet shaped cup is more orange than red. The flower is very smooth and stands well on a tall stem. GRAND CHAMPION Hobart 1984 2 y-o **\$17.00**

**RABID 2. (158/73). Dimity x 65/66.** A well sized flower with a bright yellow perianth that is almost round. The petals are broad and shovel shaped. The orange-red cup is at a right angle to the perianth, same colour throughout and resistant to burning. A most attractive flower that will have success on the show bench. Class 2y-r. **\$ 8.00**

**RUNAWAY 3. (285/79) Tia x Kopi.** A bright attractive flower on a tall stem with a lemon perianth of good substance. The red goblet shaped cup is very bright with good contrast but can burn in the hot sun. 2y-r. **\$20.00**

**SANSUI 2. (Vulcan x Sunpride).** The perianth of this flower is a deep golden yellow of very good substance. The cup is yellow at the base gradually deepening to orange-red. The cup is slightly fluted and wider at the mouth than the base. A vigorous flower of excellent carriage and consistent. 2y-yr. **\$ 6.00**

**SVELTE 3. (147/77). Blandfordia x Latros.** This flower has a smooth saucer shaped perianth of bright yellow with the petals touching and or almost touching. The acorn shaped cup is a bright orange to its base and does not run into the perianth. Stands well on a strong stem and is very consistent. 2 y-o. **\$ 6.00**

**TWICER 3. (198/75) True Orbit x Yoone.** A large tall flower that is hard to classify as some blooms are a definite Division Two and others just as definite Division Three. Have classified it as Division Two, because of its size and appearance. The perianth is consistently smooth and similar to its parent Yoone. The acorn shaped cup is bright orange at its rim, toning to yellow at its base. 2 y-yoo. **\$15.00**

**LARGE CUPS**  
(White Perianth, coloured cup)

- DORUS 3. (159/66).** Yet another Arbar x Jo seedling of excellent quality. The perianth is pure white and of good quality and substance. The short expanded cup is serrated and some of the serrations slightly darker than the rest of the cup. The flower has a very strong short stiff neck giving it excellent presentation. LAUNCESTON CUP 1968-70, CHAMPION 2B Canberra 1972, Bulman 1974, TAS. CUP 1974, CHAMPION 2B Hobart 1974, 1977, Canberra 1982. \$ 8.00
- BOI 2.3 (260/80). Matika x Toya.** A consistent, even striking flower with rounded petals. The almost flat cup is yellow at its base merging to orange at its fluted and serrated rim. Stands well on a strong stem. 2w- yoo. \$22.00

- KAY 2.3. (45/70) (Arbar x Jo) Signal Light.** This flower has a smooth pure white nicely rounded flat perianth. The cup is broad at the rim which is attractively serrated. The edge of the rim is a brilliant orange red, verging into yellow and green at the base. A most spectacular flower with good carriage. CHAMPION Ulverstone '85 \$10.00


