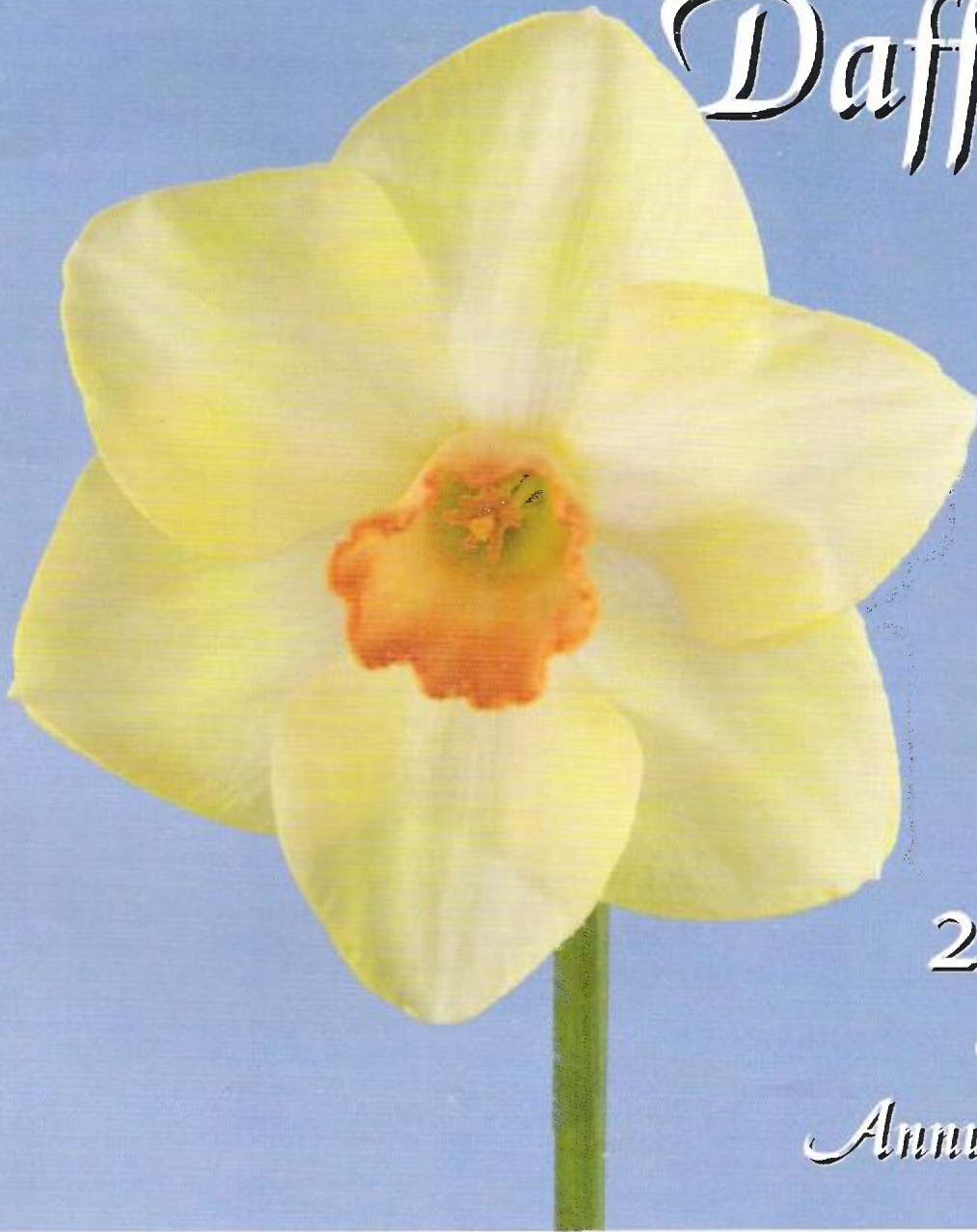

Greetings

We wish to thank each of you for your fine interest, which makes our business possible; it has been so greatly appreciated.

Our introductions this year primarily concentrate on the pink and yellows, using American Dream as the basis, along with Acumen and Color Magic. A large number of selections were made from these crosses and observed for several years, resulting in some consistent show quality progeny. At the top of our list are American Star and Beautiful Silk, of somewhat similar form, but quite distinct in color. An orange cup jonquil Artist's Life, with potential for yellow/pink breeding is being introduced as well. Also two more borderline 1W-O's from Demmo – Orange Focus and Orange Sky. Universal Charm, a reverse bicolor intermediate we feel will be a fine addition for exhibition collections.

We are pleased to offer a few miniatures and small flowers from Eileen Frey, which has been her special interest for many years.

It is our privilege to offer a number of Jackson's cultivars again this year. We have always looked forward to David and Robin's visits and observations over the years. Their visit last spring, along with Jamie and Kaye Radcliff, was especially enjoyed. As you might imagine, daffodils were the center of interest and conversation. The roots of all three of our families go back to previous generations, with regard to daffodil hybridization.

As many of you know, our total plantings have been reduced with less of the older cultivars. However, many of the seedlings are being observed for introduction in the next few years. After being involved for so long, reducing is very difficult for both of us. However, we are still selectively hybridizing – the temptation is just too great each spring.

A number of our introductions are being released somewhat prematurely, with a limited supply.

We encourage the use of www.daffseek.org for identifying cultivars. A number of even greater improvements have been made to it, for which we are very grateful to Ben Blake and Nancy Tackett. Also, please see our website www.MitschDaffodils.com for a number of offerings and pictures.

Our spring has been very late this year, here as in many areas of the country. At this writing, bloom is well on its way.

We wish you a beautiful showing and gardening spring with much enjoyment.

GENERALIZATION OF DAFFODIL CLASSIFICATION

(as defined by the Royal Horticulture Society)

Color codes are as follows: white or whitish W, green G, yellow Y, pink P, orange O, red R. These colors describe the flower at maturity. Classification for daffodils is composed of division number, color of perianth – color of corona.

- Division 1 TRUMPET – one flower to a stem; trumpet at least as long as perianth segments.
- Division 2 LARGE-CUPPED – one flower to a stem; corona more than 1/3, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments.
- Division 3 SMALL-CUPPED – one flower to a stem; corona not more than 1/3 the length of the perianth segments.
- Division 4 DOUBLES – doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both.
- Division 5 TRIANDRUS – usually two or more pendent flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed.
- Division 6 CYCLAMINEUS – one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed, flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short neck.
- Division 7 JONQUILLA – usually one to three flowers to a rounded stem; leaves narrow, dark green; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; flowers usually fragrant.
- Division 8 TAZETTA – usually 3-20 flowers to a stout stem; leaves broad; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers fragrant.
- Division 9 POETICUS – usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona usually disc-shaped, with a green or yellow center and red rim.
- Division 10 BULBOCODIUM – usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with dominant corona.
- Division 11 SPLIT-CORONAS – corona split rather than lobed and usually for more than half its length.
- Division 12 MISCELLANEOUS – all daffodils not falling into any one of the previous.
- Division 13 SPECIES

2011 Daffodil Introductions

AMERICAN SPRINGS (Havens) 2011 2YYW-P M 15" (Color Magic x American Dream) MH7/2A. Somewhat similar in color to American Legacy, with deep contrast, but with a more distinct perianth halo. Deep lemon, broad perianth with heavy substance; funnel shaped corona, ruffled at the slightly expanded border. Very appealing flower with great hybridizing, as well as show potential. Very limited supply. **02-131** \$75.00 each.

AMERICAN STAR (Havens) 2011 2Y-P M 15" (Acumen x American Dream) OH4/3. One of our best – exceedingly silken smooth flower of clean color. Very flat broad lemon yellow perianth with a hint of halo. Long tubular corona of pleasing pink, deeper at the crenate rim. Winner of the Grant and Amy Mitsch Award (set of 3 stems of a seedling) at the 2008 ADS National show in Richmond, VA; also the Rose (best seedling in show) in Albany, OR in 2010. ARCTIC PINK (Havens) 2011 2YYW-P LM 17" (Acumen x American Dream) OH4/2. The second to be selected from this group, after American Star. Deep contrast characterizes this one – a very broad sharp lemon perianth and a straight cylindrical corona, pink to the base; there is a hint of yellow underlay at the slightly frilled and expanded rim. A unique flower with a special beauty. Picture on page 10. **02-146** \$40.00 each.

ARTIST'S LIFE (Havens) 2011 7YYW-OOY L 17" (Fertile Crescent op.) NHO5/2. One of the most exceptional of our newer jonquils. Of unusual color and possibly a step toward yellow/pink jonquils. The deep golden lemon, well formed perianth complements the cup-shaped corona of pinky orange, edged in light yellow. Generally three florets per stem. Picture on page 10. **07-161** \$40.00 each.

BEAUTIFUL SILK (Havens) 2011 2Y-P L 16" (Acumen x American Dream) OH4/5. A most beautiful flower from a prolific cross, with coloring somewhat reminiscent of American Shores. Pastel lemon yellow very flat, smooth perianth accentuates a beautifully colored straight mid pink corona, darker near the rim. A very elegant flower for show. Very limited supply. Picture on front cover. **02-154** \$70.00 each.

CHRISTMAS BELLS (Havens) 2011 5W-W L 15" (Hillstar x N.T. var. triandrus) Y93/52. One of the few pure white flowers from this cross, this one has a uniform, slight incurve to the graceful perianth segments. Generally three pendant blossoms per stem, with many stems, making it very floriferous. Mid-length cup-shaped corona with slightly reflexing perianth. Has been a vigorous grower here. **05-363** \$20.00 each.

CLASSICAL MUSIC (Havens) 2011 1Y-O E (Demmo x Magic Lantern) NH26/2. An attempt at deeper color in Magic Lantern, this flower has the perfection of Magic Lantern and has considerably larger, much deeper yellow perianth. Although we would like to see a deeper orange, the trumpet is a beautiful shade of light yellow-orange upon maturity. Winner of the Grant and Amy Mitsch Award in 2010 at the National show in Murphys. Most useful flower for show and hybridizing. Very limited supply. Picture on page 12. **01-261** \$85.00 each.

ORANGE FOCUS (Havens) 2011 1W-O E 14" (Demmo open pollinated) MHO14/1. Broad, flat perianth opening creamy yellow, changing to a quite clean white upon maturity. The bright orange long corona measures borderline trumpet and is slightly expanded at the rim with a wavy edge. Picture on page 10. **01-173** \$70.00 each.

ORANGE SKY (Havens) 2011 1W-O E 14" (Demmo open pollinated) MHO14/10. Borderline trumpet with broad flat perianth of creamy yellow, becoming creamy white at maturity. The funnel shaped narrowly flanged corona is wavy at the edge. Well formed useful for show, as well as an important flower for hybridizing. Excellent grower and increaser; great in the garden. Plentiful stock allows a lower introductory price. Picture on page 10. **01-235** \$30.00 each.

SUN CAPTION (Havens) 2011 7YYW-W L 17" (American Frontier x ?) MH8/1. Useful flower for show and garden, this one is very floriferous, even though many have only 1 flower per stem. Rounded, well overlapped perianth of intense lemon yellow with white halo, is symmetrical and slightly reflexed. The bowl-shaped corona opens with a pinkish cast, especially near the rim, and turns to white at maturity. A fine flower capturing the notice of visitors. Picture on page 12. **07-191** \$20.00 each.

UNIVERSAL CHARM (Havens) 2011 2YYW-W L 14" (Limequilla x American Frontier) MH28/1. An excellent addition to the intermediate size reverse bicolors – the flower diameter is 80 mm; beautifully formed, very well rounded flowers. Lemon colored flat perianth with a white halo, the white extending into the middle of the petals, at maturity. Round, relatively short funnel shaped cup, resembling the form of American Frontier, but opening buffish color, turning white at maturity. Very rarely has two florets per stem. A small flower with promising show potential, in our opinion. Picture on page 10. **02-156** \$40.00 each.

DAFFODIL AWARDS



The **WILLIAM G. PANNILL AWARD** is given annually to an American hybridizer to recognize a named standard daffodil which has demonstrated winning show qualities for a minimum of 5 years following registration. The cultivar must have been awarded at least one ADS Gold or White Ribbon within the last 5 years, and must be regarded as generally "growable and showable" in a majority of the ADS regions.

Novelty Daffodils for 2011

EXPLANATION OF DESCRIPTIONS

In the descriptions of the varieties as listed below, the name of the variety is given first in capital letters, followed by the name of the originator in parentheses. Then there is the date of registration or introduction. Next there is the classification symbol, composed of a division number and color code, (see page 2); flowering season, E. for early, M. for mid-season, L. for late. etc. Approximate height in inches or centimeters follows. **Just preceding the price is an item number to be used on the order form.**

Following are two definitions of terms:

Corona: The cup, or trumpet-shaped or disc-like outgrowth, arising from the inner surface of the perianth at the base of the segments.
Perianth: The six floral leaves, comprised of three sepals and three petals.

ADEPT (Havens) 2009 7YYW-Y L 16" (Hillstar x Pink Step) I8/3.

A very well rounded flower with broad perianth of deep lemon yellow with a white halo. Cup shaped mid-length corona is a pinkish buff color, lighter near the rim. Usually 3 florets per stem with a sweet fragrance. An excellent increaser, making a bright statement in the garden and useful for show. **07-183** \$17.00 each.

ALL AMERICAN (Mitsch/Havens) 1998 2W-P LM 16" (Refrain x Magician) 2V2/1. Has inherited precise form from Refrain. Heavy substance throughout—flat white spade shaped perianth; straight, formal, reddish pink corona. **02-107** \$8.00 each.

AMADEUS (Mitsch) 1997 2W-R LM 19" (Precedent x Magician) TT10/3. A real breakthrough in color, large broad rounded perianth of pure white stands in contrast to the brilliant red corona frilled and expanded. It is almost as if the corona is emitting light. Heavy substance and strong stem. As in all flowers, climatic conditions will influence color intensity. Picture on page 11. **02-957** \$16.00 each D.

AMERICAN CLASSIC (Havens) 1997 2Y-WYY L 19" (Sungem x Lemon Lyric) XH120/1. Perfection of form characterizes this flower, as the parentage would suggest. Very broadly ovate perianth of deep lemon yellow, every flower perfectly flat, very slightly reflexing at maturity. Straight corona opens buff, turning white at the base, leaving buff yellow at the mouth. One of our best show flowers. **02-958** \$25.00 each.

AMERICAN DREAM (Havens) 1999 1Y-P M 18" (Memento x Lorikeet) SEH21/5. One of our best, a most refined flower with elegant form and heavy substance. Of smoothest texture, the very broadly ovate, spade shaped, flat perianth segments of deep lemon yellow are in sharp contrast to the narrow waisted pink trumpet. Recipient of the Wm. G. Pannill Award from ADS. Picture on back cover. **01-579** \$42.00 each.

AMERICAN HERITAGE (Havens) 1993 1YYW-P M 18" (Memento x Lorikeet) SEH21/2. Perfectly flat and smooth, spade shaped perianth of deep lemon gold, with each segment broad and symmetrical. The tailored trumpet is straight with a very slight frill at the margin. Limited supply. **01-684** \$10.00 each.

AMERICAN LEGACY withdrawn

AMERICAN PEACE (Havens) 2004 5Y-Y L 15" (Hillstar x N. t. triandrus) Y93/34. Well formed, the gracefully reflexed perianth is a deeper shade of luminous lemon than the cup-shaped corona. Particularly well suited to the rock garden as well as the show table. Possessing a light fragrance, there are generally 2-3 florets per stem. Picture on page 11. **05-822** \$10.00 each D.

ANITRA'S DANCE (Havens) 2010 2W-P LM 15" (Lorikeet x Magician) WH27/5. A most beautiful flower from this prolific cross, resembling its sibling Musetta's Waltz, except that the perianth has less yellow, making it white with a pinkish cast. Very broad perianth with heavy substance, and formal enough for show. Brightly colored, pink corona is funnel shaped, expanded at the margin with a heavily ruffled border. Even with the preceding corona, the perianth resists tears and nicks. An excellent garden flower with potential for show and breeding. Rapid increaser. Picture on page 11. **02-160** \$15.00 each.

ANVIL CHORUS (Havens) 2W-O L 17" (Cool Flame x N. jonquilla) REH11/1. Bright orange cup shaped corona; white rounded flat perianth with orange underlay. Well formed intermediate. **02-921** \$8.00 each.

ARROWHEAD (Havens) 1994 6Y-R EM 13" (TEH54/2 (Jetfire x Trogon) x N. cyclamineus) XH95/1. A most unusual and delightful flower, a bit larger than Jetfire and with much broader perianth segments, well reflexed at maturity. Their color is deep golden yellow with a distinct orange flush. The orange red corona is similar to that of Emperor's Waltz, but a bit shorter and much deeper in color. Very heavy substance throughout. **06-759** \$10.00 each.

ARTICULATE (Mitsch) 2003 6Y-Y E 11" (Glisten x N. cyclamineus) 2U26/3. One of the earliest of the cyclamineus hybrids, a bright sunshine yellow. Well reflexed, relatively broad perianth segments complement the long tubular corona, slightly expanded and ruffled at the rim. Beautiful flower suitable for show. It has freely set seed for us. Makes rather rough appearing bulbs. Limited supply. **06-552** \$17.00 each.

ASTUTE (Havens) 2009 2W-O M 16" (REH26/ (Gold Crown x F111 [(Ardour x Ceylon) x Brer Fox] x unknown) HH31/2. The brilliant orange cylindrical corona with a hint of a slightly lighter ruffle at the border is in contrast to a broad, flat perianth of creamy white with an orange-yellow underlay at the center, which fades as the flower ages. Short neck, heavy substance and bright color makes a long lasting flower for hybridizing, garden and show. Very striking flower of refined form. Very limited stock. Picture on page 9. **02-114** \$45.00 each.

BALANCED EQUATION (Havens) 2004 11aW-PPY L 15" (Camelot x Pink Holly) Y47/1. Unique split corona with improved form and beautiful color. Broadly ovate perianth of white with heavy substance. Ruffled corona of luminous pastel peach pink with an amber rim, which splits evenly into the perianth. Varied background indicates hybridizing potential. **11-961** \$7.00 each.

BERCEUSE (Mitsch) 1989 2W-P M 16" ((Melody Lane x Rose Caprice) x (Carita x Accent)) KK8/5. The broad white perianth, outer segments almost touching, is perfectly smooth and symmetrical, being a bit reflexed. The mid-length moderately expanded cup is deeply colored intense rose pink with a hint of lavender. **02-451** \$9.00 each.

BIOMETRICS (Havens) 2004 2Y-O E 12" (Jetfire x Gypsy) TEH53/11. Nicely formed intermediate size flower which is fertile. It has shown ability to set seed when crossed with miniatures. Well formed flat bright yellow perianth and bright orange cup-shaped corona with slight ruffle. Intermediate. Limited supply. Picture on page 11. **02-913** \$12.00 each.

BIRD MUSIC (Frey) 1997 1Y-Y E 6.5" (WeeBee x Jetfire) PEF10/1. A miniature size trumpet. The light yellow tubular corona is enhanced by a lemon colored perianth. It is a very prolific bloomer here, making it a beautiful addition to the rockgarden. ADS approved miniature. **06-964** \$12.00 each.

BRISTOL BAY (Havens) 2009 2Y-P LM 15" (Widgeon x VH18/4 (Widgeon x Memento)) I41/1. Silken smooth flower, beautiful though smaller than some. Flat perianth of creamy light yellow complements the soft pink long funnel shaped cup with a modest ruffle at the border. Entire flower of heavy substance and smooth texture. **02-185** \$10.00 each.

CANTERBURY (Havens) 1999 5Y-Y L 13" (Hillstar x N. t. var. triandrus) Y93/12. Triandrus hybrid with as many as five pendent blossoms per stem possessing a jonquil type fragrance. Evenly reflexed perianth segments of luscious soft lemon yellow, complement the bowl-shaped, round corona of a shade lighter creamy yellow. **05-786** \$20.00 each.

CARIB (Mitsch) 1980 6W-P M 13" (Y36/2 ((Mabel Taylor x Interim) x Rima) x N. cyclamineus) KK105/3. A well formed, strongly reflexed ivory white perianth, and a long, nicely expanded trumpet crown of peach pink, being more highly colored on the inside of the corona. Limited supply **06-134** \$8.00 each.

CEDAR HILLS (Mitsch) 1987 3W-GYY L 24" (Impala x Green Hills) KK87/3A. One of our favorites, the large green eye zone, which extends nearly half the cup, seems to dominate one's attention. Perfection of form and clean coloration. Beautifully rounded broad white perianth and deep yellow short cup. **03-138** \$6.00 each.

CHESTERTON (Duncan) 9W-GYR L Very vigorous poet, blooming late in the season. Broad white perianth, reflexed somewhat. Disc-shaped corona of greenish yellow with green eye and narrow red rim. **09-283** \$5.00 each.

CHIT CHAT (Fowlds) 1975 7Y-Y L 10" (N. assoanus x N. jonquilla). Small, perfectly formed blooms of clear rich yellow, borne in great profusion, two or three to a stem. Very limited stock. **07-147** \$5.00 each.

CHROMITE (Havens) 2004 2O-O L 14" (Hillstar x Lemon Sails) Y99/5. Intermediate in size as it grows here (75 mm diameter). An unusual color, probably inherited from Lemon Sails, but with much more intensity. Broadly ovate, smooth perianth opening lemony yellow and matures to deep buffish orange. Long straight cup of very pleasing deep tangerine orange. Rapid increaser and unique flower. **02-133** \$11.00 each.

CLASSICAL AGE withdrawn

CLAVICHORD (Havens) 2001 11aY-W L 16" (Hillstar x Pink Holly) Y100/4. A very appealing split corona, the entire flower opens a rich lemon color, the corona gradually flattening and developing to creamy buffy white. The flatness of the symmetrical, evenly divided corona, folded into the rich lemon of the perianth, displays sharp contrast. Intermediate size here. **11-668** \$6.00 each.

COLONIAL TREASURE (Mitsch) 1998 3W-GWW L 20" (Impala x Green Hills) 2P59/1A. Very beautiful large rounded white flower with heavy substance and smooth texture. Small white flat ruffled cup with intense green eye. Fragrant. **03-526** \$10.00 each.

COLONIAL WHITE (Mitsch) 1994 2W-W LM 18" (Panache x Misty Glen) TT26/1. Clean white throughout, with a greenish cast, the flat, broadly ovate perianth has a smoothness reminiscent of silk. Mid-length corona, very slightly expands at the wavy shaped mouth. Picture on page 9. **02-757** \$9.00 each D.

COLORBURST (Frey) 2008 2Y-GYO EM (JEE9/4 x Falstaff) TEF4/2. Distinctive little flower, measuring slightly over intermediate size (at 81 mm in diameter here), bright sunshine yellow throughout, the corona having a distinctive ruffled roll of bright orange. The broad perianth resists catching in the ruffles. **02-380** \$10.00 each.

CONVERGENCE (Havens) 2003 4Y-P LM 14" (Camelot x Tropic Isle) AH117/12. Of the many selections made from this cross, this one is perhaps the best formed; it is of pale yellow with bright pink petaloids. Its strong stem and short neck give it a garden presence even in inclement windy weather. Form is suitable for show. **04-267** \$8.00 each.

COTINGA (Mitsch) 1977 6W-P EM 11" (Open pollinated Mitylene x N. cyclamineus seedling) EO7/3. A flower somewhat like Dove Wings in form but with an apricot pink trumpet, the color being considerably deeper near the margin. Reflexed ivory white perianth, and an attractive flared trumpet. **06-157** \$8.00 each.

COUNTERPOINT (Havens) 2010 7W-Y L 16" (Acceleration op.) GO114. Nicely formed broad perianth with bowl shaped corona crenate at the edge with quite unusual coloring. Opens with a yellow perianth and orange at the rim of the cup. As the flower matures, the perianth becomes white, while the corona develops to a butterscotch yellow, eventually turning white if left out in the sun. Very prolific. **07-396** \$15.00 each.

DENALI (Havens) 1992 1W-W EM 18" (Empress of Ireland x ((Vigil x Empress of Ireland) x Panache)) QEJ30/3. Named for the beautiful, majestic Mt. McKinley in Alaska whose present native name is Denali. A very beautiful flower nicely proportioned with smooth texture. Relatively narrow waisted trumpet expanding slightly at the mouth with tailored appearance. The spade shaped perianth segments are broad and flat. Limited supply. Picture on page 11. **01-653** \$15.00 each.

DENARIUS (Havens) 2008 2Y-Y M 16" (VH18/8 (Widgeon x Memento) x Magic Lantern) GH13/10. The entire flower of coppery yellow, the inside of the long corona is a deeper hue, bordering on orange. Smooth flat perianth with ovate segments, rounded at the apex. Long cylindrical corona, slightly expanded and with a very slight ruffle at the border, just a few millimeters short of trumpet proportions. Picture on page 11. **02-225** \$25.00 each.

EASTER ATTIRE (Frey) 1988 2Y-GWY M (Silken Sails x Cool Crystal) A lovely soft lemon yellow with a deeper heavily frilled yellow corona, becoming nearly white with lemon rim at maturity. **02-468** \$4.00 each.

EMERALD EMPIRE (Havens) 1999 2W-GWW L 18" (Misty Glen x Angel) Y149/10. A large elegant flower with many of the positive traits of both its parents. Smooth flat perianth segments of pure white and rather small white frilled corona seem to intensify the large deep green eye. The broadly ovate perianth segments have a silken texture with the back three segments nearly touching. A smooth show flower with vigorous health. Picture on page 10. **02-562** \$14.00 each.

ENDEARING (Havens) 2009 7Y/W-Y L 12" (N. jonquilla x ?) HH19/1. Of unusual color, this is identical in form to N. jonquilla. The perianths are yellow with wide white marking in the center, giving the impression of a yellow rim on the perianth. It has been consistent for a number of years, so we decided to release it as something of a novelty. Miniature size. **07-119** \$18.00 each.

ETHEREAL MAGIC withdrawn

EVE'S POET (Eve Robertson) 9W-GYR L 15" (unknown parentage) Slightly reflexed pure, poeticus-white perianth relatively flat, with just a hint of curl at the edges, mucro at the tips. Disk shaped corona with a large green eye showing on the outside of the cup, the green extending slightly, into the perianth, as it blooms here. Cup has a broad yellow zone and narrow orange red rim. **09-810** \$10.00 each D.

EVENING PRAYER (Havens) 2009 9W-R L 16" (Mountain Poet x unknown) Z154/1. Our best red eyed poet to date, this is a beautifully formed flower with distinct colors. The broad rounded perianth's inner segments sometimes touch. The intensity of white contrasts well with the disk corona deep orange red to the base. Very striking flower. Limited stock. **09-196** \$45.00 each.

FERTILE CRESCENT (Havens) 2000 7YYW-YYW L (Hillstar x Quick Step) Y91/2. A fragrant, floriferous jonquil, the well formed broad perianth of deep lemon with a white halo combines with a cup shaped corona, opening lemon colored and changing to buffish yellow with a distinct white rim. Well suited for show and garden, as well as hybridizing. Generally 3 florets per stem. **07-189** \$9.00 each.

A Country Garden

Over the years of our hybridizing program, the goal of excellence in show flowers has been a high priority beginning in the 1940's in the early days of Grant Mitsch's hybridizing. Very early on, he was working for color intensity especially reddish pinks, in various combinations, for he knew that this would be of interest to most people. Seedlings have been hybridized and selected on this basis. The following named cultivars have proven themselves as fine garden flowers. They have been observed for a period of years to substantiate consistency and a number of them are also of exhibition quality.

Named Cultivars – Garden

PINKS

✓ **CATALYST** (Mitsch) 1995 2W-R LM 17" (Decoy x Magician) TT3/1. Large, ruffled, brilliant red corona with white broadly ovate perianth of heavy substance. We feel Catalyst is another step toward true red with less yellow undertones, achieved by breeding from pinks. True to its name, a catalyst for color intensity. Picture on page 11. **02-783** \$8.00 each D.

HAWAIIAN SKIES (Mitsch) 2W-YYP M 13". Spectacular flower for the garden, the pure white perianth accentuates the large, bright expanded cup of bright yellow, with brilliant rim of red-pink from the time it opens. Prolific bloomer and increaser, this one makes a bright splash of color in the garden. Its strong stems support it well and its heavy substance gives long life to the flowers. It has a large flower, but produces a small bulb for us. Picture on page 11. **02-393** \$12.00 each.

LIBERATION (Mitsch) 2003 2W-R LM 15" Brilliant corona, approximating the color of its sibling, Amadeus, the corona is less expanded at the base, more funnel shaped, flared and frilled at the margin; broad perianth segments are informal and very white. Deep pink red corona combined with the whiteness of the perianth is most striking in the garden, with its heavy substance, giving long life to the flowers. **02-817** \$7.00 each D.

PINK DECLARATION (Mitsch/Havens) 1987 2W-P LM 18". Very heavy substance throughout, broad white perianth; flared ruffled deep pink corona. **02-284** \$6.00 each.

RED or ORANGE CUPS

ORANGE CANDY (Galyon) 2009 2Y-O LM 28" (Copperfield x Shinon) FG56. Exceptional flower of unique color, ideal for the garden and arranging. Broad perianth of bright yellow with heavy substance; large bowl shaped crown of butter-scotch orange with a picotee border, a shade lighter. Very pleasing flower, looking fine in clumps. Picture on page 11. **02-142** \$10.00 each D.

SWEET ORANGE (Havens) 1997 2Y-O M 13". A very distinctive flower with unusual color combination. Bright orange flared and rolled corona; flat lemon perianth. Excellent garden flower and possibly useful for show. Makes a very healthy but rough appearing bulb. **02-922** \$6.00 each.

WHITES & BICOLORS

BRIDAL ARRAY (Frey) 2003 2W-GWW L 17" (Old Satin x Cool Crystal) JEE7/1. Rounded perianth of pure white with heavy substance. The expanded white corona is deeply frilled, with a green eye. **02-499** \$6.00 each.

SOUTHERN GARDEN (Galyon) 2009 5Y/W-Y L 17" (Silver Bells x ?) FG4. Dr. Galyon did a great deal of hybridizing with the upper divisions, including Silver Bells. The entire flower opens light yellow, the perianth turning white with yellow edge near the base of the segments. Relatively long cup shaped coronas. Generally 3 florets per stem. We are unsure of the pollen parent. Very appealing sweet scent and floriferous, making an excellent garden flower. Rapid increaser, hardy and with good health in our climate. **05-206** \$10.00 each.

2. **Customer Number** is on your address label if you have ordered recently. Please hand write it on the order blank or affix the label from your catalog cover onto the order blank. It is especially important to have your correct, current address for bulb shipment. (UPS will not deliver to P.O. Box).
3. **“D”**: “D” means bulbs are subject to discount if they qualify and order is sent by June 1 in the United States. If eligible discount is not taken, we will include extra bulbs.
4. **Payment**: Please send payment with order and make check or money order payable to Mitsch Daffodils. We also accept credit cards (VISA, MasterCard and Discover) as indicated on our order form., in which case orders may be sent via fax 503-651-2742.
5. **Postage and Handling**: On domestic orders, prices quoted include postage on catalog orders \$35.00 and over.
