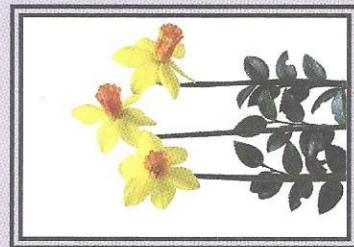

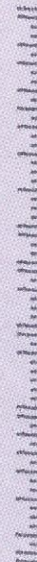

Several years ago, Walter Blom requested a selection of my bulbs from the Section Bulbocodium. Walter has grown these on and made further selections. His goal has been to select bulbs that are free flowering and make a nice show in pots, pans and the garden. Featured this year are three newly named hybrids. They bloom in late winter or very early spring. They are featured in the *North American Rock Garden Soceity Journal*. They will appear in the RHS Daffodil Register in the Autumn of 2004.

4-01 **Chinese Ivory** 10W-W Selection from N. romieuxii #3. Flowers 35mm wide, yellowish white, facing up: smooth and of heavy substance, corona bowl shaped and lightly frilled. Dwarf ....\$12.00

4-02 **Peppermint** 10W-W Selection from N. cantabricus var. foliosus #2. Flowers 25-30mm wide, greenish white; smooth and of heavy substance, corona bowl shaped, smooth with mouth wavy and rim entire. Dwarf .....\$12.00

4-03 **Silver Palace** 10W-W Selection from N. cantabricus var. foliosus #3. Flowers 25mm wide, greenish white, facing up. Dwarf.....\$12.00

4-04 **One of each of these delightful newly named hybrids**.....\$32.50

4-05 **N. asturiensis** 13Y-Y The tiniest of the trumpet daffodils, once known as N. minimus, from the Asturian mountains in northern Spain south to central Portugal. Grows on rocky, acid soil. Will tolerate cold weather. Sets seed .....\$15.00

4-06 **Poplin** 10Y-Y One of D. & J.W. Blanchard's hybrid bulbocodiums named after fabrics. Rarely offered. Very early winter flowering with a well rounded corona. ....\$7.00

Dear Friends,

Well time is marching on.  
Jerry and I are not getting any younger. I have decided to change my focus. Initially I wanted to grow narcissus species and miniatures for the rock garden. I travelled to Spain and France to see daffodils in the wild and became aware of the huge losses of native bulbs due to road building, monoculture, goat and cattle grazing.

We have a huge collection of Narcissus species and new hybrids. This is where I want to concentrate. There are several new hybrids to be registered and bulbs from other continents to be acclimatized. They will be important in the future for conservation, hybridizing, small garden planting and show competition. I hope to place these bulbs with growers who will carry on their propagation.

Over the next few years we will delete from our list those daffodils that are readily available and sometimes less expensive in the trade. Several distributors sell these in large quantity to use as bedding plants. If you want to plant fields of daffodils, look on the American Daffodil Society web site for sources. If you are a collector of rarer daffodils, stay on our mailing list. Happy growing!

## Narcissus are divided and color coded for identification.

Narcissus have been reclassified by the Royal Horticulture Society into 13 Divisions. Divisions 1-12 are of garden origin.

Color codes are as follows:

Y=yellow	W=white	O=orange
G=green	P=pink	R=red

If a daffodil is labeled Y-Y it means it has a yellow perianth and a yellow corona. These designations can become quite complicated if there are bands of color in the flower ie, Gipsy Queen 1YYW-WWY
