

Dear Friends,

Well time is marching on.
Jerry and I are not getting any
younger. I have decided to change
my focus. Initially I wanted to grow
narcissus species and miniatures
for the rock garden. I travelled to
Spain and France to see daffodils
in the wild and became
aware of the huge losses
of native bulbs due to
road building, monoculture,
goat and cattle grazing.

We have a huge collection of Narcissus species and new hybrids. This is where I want to concentrate. There are several new hybrids to be registered and bulbs from other continents to be acclimatized. They will be important in the future for conservation, hybridizing, small garden planting and show competition. I hope to place these bulbs with growers who will carry on their propagation.

Over the next few years we will delete from our list those daffodils that are readily available and sometimes less expensive in the trade. Several distributors sell these in large quantity to use as bedding plants. If you want to plant fields of daffodils, look on the American Daffodil Society web site for sources. If you are a collector of rarer daffodils, stay on our mailing list. Happy growing!

Narcissus are divided and color coded for identification.

Narcissus have been reclassified by the Royal Horticulture Society into 13 Divisions. Divisions 1-12 are of garden origin.

Division

- 1 Trumpet
- 2 Large cupped
- 3 Small cupped
- 4 Double
- 5 Triandrus
- 6 Cyclamineus
- 7 Jonquillae and Apodanthae
- 8 Tazettae
- 9 Poets
- 10 Bulbocodium cultivars (or hybrids)
- 11 Split Coronas
- 12 Daffodils that do not fit into other categories
- 13 Species and wild variants and hybrids

Color codes are as follows:

Y=yellow W=white O=orange G=green P=pink R=red

If a daffodil is labeled Y-Y it means it has a yellow perianth and a yellow corona. These designations can become quite complicated if there are bands of color in the flower ie, Gipsy Queen 1YYW-WWY
