Terms and Conditions of sale

Bulbs

All bulbs are offered subject to the crop being satisfactory.

Acknowledgement of orders.

Because of the high cost of postage and other costs, orders will not be acknowledged unless requested.

Orders

As the stocks are very small and in some cases only two or three, all orders will be accepted in the order in which they are received, subject to the crop being unsold. Orders should be sent as early as possible, and not later than the 1st of June. Postage and packing must be added to the cost of the bulbs ordered.

Payment

Owing to the high cost of rendering accounts, orders are only accepted on a cash with order basis including postage.

No orders will be dispatched until money is received.

Payment by overseas customers can be made either

1. By International Money Order in Sterling at the prices shown in the catalogue, or
2. By cheque in their own currency. Please add the equivalent of £6.00 sterling to cover Bank exchange charges.

Should the exchange rate alter after placing your order, and so be to your disadvantage, I will compensate with additional bulbs.

Dispatch

All bulbs travel at the customer's risk and expense. All overseas orders will be sent Airmail unless otherwise instructed.

Batemans	2Y-Y A large deep gold rounded flower with a superb perianth which is smooth and flat. The funnel shaped corona is flared at the mouth, notched and slightly flanged. Shown in the Engleheart Cup on several occasions and a Single bloom winner R.H.S. Show 1993. Named after the Sussex home of Rudyard Kipling. Seedling No. 1.17.83.	(Celtic Chief X Gold Convention)	Mid Season	Price £25.00
Fletching	1W-W The flowers open pure white forming a double triangle over 100mm wide. Perianth segments are broadly ovate, overlapping half and are full of substance. The corona is cylindrical, the mouth flared and even, it's rim slightly notched. A long lasting and reliable exhibition flower held on a tall strong stem with a short neck. The plant is vigorous, increases well and so far appears resistant to basal rot. Seedling No. 1.23.83.	(Broomhill X Canisp)	Early Season	Price £25.00

Golding	1 Y-Y A very consistent deep gold flower of medium size and perfect form. Nearly every bloom being free from 'nicks' or other blemishes and well poised on a tall strong stem. Although not as large as some yellow trumpets, if left to develop on the plant flowers can grow to 90mm. Named after a famous Kentish hop it was shown in the winning 12 Seedlings R.H.S. Competition 1990 and in the Devonshire Trophy 1996. Seedling No.2.12.79	(Celtic Gold X Arctic Gold)	Mid season	Price £12.50
Anderida	1 W-W A large, very consistent pure white flower of exemplary show form, having a superb perianth that is broadly ovate and well overlapping. The corona is cylindrical with a slight flare at the mouth that is minutely notched. The blooms are carried on strong tall stems with short necks and with good poise. Shown in Engleheart up 1994 and 12 seedling class R.H.S. Late Competition 1996. Seedling No 4.21.80	(Broomhill X White Star)	Mid season	Price £28.00
Cuckmere	1 W-W Large pure white flower with broad ace of spades perianth and long slender trumpet ending in a neat flange which is evenly serrated. Very consistent in producing show quality blooms. In winning 12 Seedlings R.H.S. Competition 1990 and in Engleheart Cup 1993. Seedling No 2.19.80	(Panache X White Star)	Late Season	Price £22.00
Danehill	1 Y-Y Broad rounded perianth of thick, waxy texture. Straight sided corona which is neatly flanged and serrated. The blooms are well poised on a strong tall stem. Consistent and "nick" free. It is not exaggerating to say that I have rarely had a less than perfect flower since it first bloomed and it does look like a genuine large cup. Finchcocks	2 Y-R Probably the deepest coloured flower in this sub-division. The almost sunproof, fiery red corona is enhanced by the rich gold perianth, over 95mm in diameter. Very consistent and long lasting. Shown in many winning groups as a seedling. In Engleheart Cup 1988, 1991 and 1994. In winning 12 Seedlings R.H.S. Firehills	2 Y-O Broad, overlapping, ovate perianth of vivid yellow over 90mm in diameter. Sunproof, orange, funnel shaped corona. Long lasting with nearly every bloom free from blemishes. Shown in winning Richardson Trophy 1988 and in Engleheart Cup 1991 and 1992 also 12 seedlings R.H.S. Late Competition 1996. Seedling No 1.9.80	(Lea 1.18.66 X Loch Hope)	Early Season	Price £7.00
Henfield	2 Y-GOO Deep yellow, slightly rounded perianth of thick silken texture. Saucer shaped corona, evenly flanged and serrated. Motts Mill	2 Y-O Broadly ovate perianth of deepest gold surrounds a cup shaped corona, pale orange at the base turning to deep orange at the flanged and lobed rim. Somewhat reminiscent of the old Richardson flower "Air Marshall" but brighter in colour and much more consistent. Sister to Finchcocks. Wealden Fire	2 Y-O A large broadly ovate perianth of vivid yellow which has a most attractive suffusion of orange, completed by cup shaped corona of deep orange red. Lydwells	2 W-GYY Broad, round perianth of sparkling white over 100mm in diameter. The deep yellow bowl shaped corona is much enhanced by a lovely green eye. Southease	2 W-GYY Large, well-poised flower that is best described as an improved Irish Minstrel with a sparkling sheen to the perianth that takes a little time to whiten. Kilndown	2 W-YYO A very useful addition to this sparsely populated class. Blooms are large and round with a perianth of thick waxy texture which takes several days to whiten. The funnel shaped corona is deep yellow ending in a well defined rim of bright orange. Shown in 12 Seedlings R.H.S. Competitions 1992, 1994 and in the Engleheart Cup 1997. Cherry Gardens	2 W-GPP Large, overlapping bluntly pointed perianth of crystalline texture, over 100mm in diameter. Bowl shaped corona of deep pink with a sharply defined rim of cherry red that does not fade. The whole enhanced by a green eye. Single bloom winner R.H.S. 1985, 1987, 1988. Riseden	3 Y-Y A large flower with a broadly ovate perianth of good clear yellow that does not fade. The widely expanded corona is of a darker shade of yellow, and is finely frilled at the mouth. Blooms are over 100mm in diameter and held with good poise on a tall strong stem. Vigorous plant with good increase that will be valuable for breeding. Winner of its class R.H.S. Ringmer	3Y-YYO Overlapping, deep yellow perianth, slightly pointed and of a lovely smooth texture. Saucer shaped corona of mid yellow, banded with fiery orange. Very consistent in producing show quality blooms. Always measures Division 3. Tall strong stem which holds the flower with good poise. Single Bloom winner R.H.S. Adversane	3 W-GWW Beautiful smooth white perianth forming almost a complete circle over 95mm in diameter free from "nicks" and blemishes. The small bowl shaped corona opens with a pale yellow rim that soon fades to pure white with just a suggestion of pink. The whole flower is enhanced with a deep green eye and is carried with perfect poise on a tall, strong stem. Single bloom winner R.H.S. Bainden	3 W-GYO Large broadly ovate perianth of sparkling pure white over 110mm in diameter. The shallow funnel shaped corona has a green eye followed by a broad band of greenish yellow and finishing with a serrated edge of bright orange red. The flower is carried with good poise on a tall, strong stem. Shown in winning 12 Seedlings R.H.S. Tidebrook	3 W-W Pure white, broad, much overlapping perianth which compliments the shallow, funnel shaped corona that opens white with a touch of green in the eye. Division 4

Hever	4 Y-Y A very round and full double. Both perianth and petaloid segments in more than three whorls, regularly arranged opposite one another, decreasing slightly in size towards the centre. The whole flower is a good deep yellow slightly darker in the centre. The strong stem and short neck carry the flower in perfect exhibition pose. While not as large as some modern "doubles", the blooms are over 90mm diameter making it an excellent flower for collection classes where uniformity of size is important in.
