## Daffodils

### Narcissus

Daffodils are probably one of the easiest bulbs to grow. They usually begin welcoming Spring to our farm in mid-February. One can see them all along the ditchbanks at first, their presence a direct result of 'spills' during our annual harvesting and replanting. While this is not necessarily a tribute to mechanization, we think it certainly is to nature! All daffodils are DNII (14-16 cm in circumference) size unless noted otherwise.

**Large Trumpet** - trumpet (cup or corona) equal to or longer in length than the perianth (petal) segments. One flower per stem.



[B] DF-0100 **Holland Sensation** White petals with yellow trumpet. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0102 **Counsellor** Golden yellow. Very strong grower. (very late, 18")

[A] DF-0104 **Dutch Master 'King Alfred' type** Replaces famous golden yellow. (mid-season, 18")

[B] DF-0106 **Mount Hood** The best white, trumpet daffodil. Opens flushed pale yellow and fades to pure white (mid-season, 15")

[B] DF-0115 **Rijnveld's Early Sensation** Yellow. (very early, 12")

[A] DF-0222 **Saint Patrick's Day** Reverse bicolor. Lemon green petals turning pale white turning lemon green at the rim of the cup. (mid-season, 16")

[A] DF-0110 **Unsurpassable** One of the largest blooms in the daffodil family. Golden yellow with extra long trumpet. (mid-season, 15")

**Large Cup** - corona (cup) more than one third, but less than equal to in length than the perianth. One flower per stem.

[A] DF-0200 **Carlton** Clear yellow. Great perennial for the South. (early, 16")

[A] DF-0204 **Verona** Pure white with pale green throat. (mid-season, 16")

[A] DF-0206 **Fortune** Golden yellow bloom with large cup, edge tinted orange yellow. Prolific blooms. (mid-season, 14")

[A] DF-0210 **Ice Follies** Startling white with yellow, flat-fringed cup. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0225 **Lothario** Yellow with pale orange cup. (late, 18")

[B] DF-0216 **Pink Cloud** White perianth with rosy pink cup. (mid-season, 16")



[A] DF-0218 **Salome** White perianth with cup fading to salmon. (mid-season, 15")

[A] DF-0212 **Professor Einstein** Pure white petals with reddish-orange cup. (mid-season, 16")

[A] DF-0223 **Silver Standard** White with open yellow cup fading to white. Tall. (early, 20")

**Small Cup** - one flower per stem. Cup not more than one third the length of the petals.


[A] DF-0302 **Barrette Browning** Bright white perianth, frilled orange cup. (mid-season, 16")

**Double** - one or more double flowers per stem.

[A] DF-0406 **Apotheose** Large yellow flower with pale orange centers. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0402 **Cheerfulness** White clusters of 3 or more flowers per stem. Fragrant. (late, 16")

[B] DF-0403 **Erlicheer** Clusters, 6-8 small double flowers per stem, white with creamy yellow centers. Very fragrant and ideal for pots. (early, 16")

[A] DF-0401 **Golden Ducate** Solid gold double. Strong stems. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0412 **White Lion** Large, white double with bright yellow segments. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0414 **Yellow Cheerfulness** Golden yellow. Fragrant. (late, 14")

**Triandrus** - 2 to 3 pendulous flowers per stem.

[B] DF-0506 **Thalia** 2 or 3 lovely white flowers per stem, two inches or more across. Good for rock gardens. (late, 16") 12/14 cm

**Cyclamineus** - 2 to 3 pendulous flowers with reflexed petals.

[A] DF-0600 **February Gold** Golden yellow. (very early, 10") 12/14 cm

[B] DF-0602 **February Silver** White trumpets with yellow crowns that quickly fade to white. (very early, 8") 12/14 cm

[A] DF-0604 **Tete a Tete** Miniature. Ideal for forcing. Reflex yellow petals with pale orange cup. (early, 5") 12/14 cm

**Jonquilla** - multiple, small flowers on a single stem. Well known for their fragrance.

[A] DF-0700 **Trevithian** Like old-fashioned jonquils. 3 to 4 yellow flowers per stem. (mid-season, 18")

[A] DF-0705 **Baby Moon** Miniature version of above. Honeysuckle-like fragrance. (late, 12") 6/+ cm

**Poeticus** - very fragrant. Small, red-rimmed cups.

[A] DF-0900 **Acteae** The 'dogwood daffodil'. Bright white petals, small yellow cup rimmed in red with a green eye. (mid-season, 16")

**Tazetta** - clusters of many, extremely fragrant flowers. Excellent forcers.

[A] DF-0802 **Geranium** 4 to 6 white with orange cup flowers per stem. (late, 15")

[B] DF-0804 **Grand Soleil d'Or** (Yellow Paperwhite) For forcing indoors or use them as a garden flower in the South. Must be planted deep. (very early, 16")

[A] DF-0805 **Minnow** Miniature. Bright yellow cups with white petals. Terrific naturalized in rock gardens or grass. (mid-season, 6") 8/+ cm

# Grape Hyacinths

**Muscari spp.**


**Sugg. planting rate: 10 / ft<sup>2</sup>**

Popular for mass planting in rock gardens or borders. Used extensively to underplant daffodils for a spectacular spring show. The form 'Plumosum' makes a loose, feather-like plume of flowers while armeniacum and Album form tight spikes. Top size bulbs. Blooms mid March to April in N.C.

[A] GR-010 *M. armeniacum* Blue. Foliage appears in late summer in temperate climates. 6 - 8" tall.

[A] GR-030 *M. comosum* 'Plumosum' Plum. 8-12" tall. 'Feather hyacinth'.

[B] GR-020 *M. botryoides* 'Album' White. 4 - 6" tall.

# Bulbs by the Bushel

About graded blooming size bulbs... Bulbs in these bushels are comprised of all sizes that will bloom reliably. Because the size of the flower is directly related to bulb size, we suggest that you purchase our largest blooming size bulbs for more formal plantings. However, if you want bulbs for naturalizing or more informal plantings, the items listed below are by far your best value.

**Daffodils by the Bushel** 400 average bulb count per bushel, in graded blooming sizes, 10-16 cm. Will bloom this spring. Ideal for naturalizing. One bushel will cover an average of 75 square feet when planting in sweeps or 125 square feet using naturalizing techniques.

- [A] DB-080 **Fortune** Yellow petals with Orange tinted cup fading to yellow. Very prolific.
- [A] DB-090 **Ice Follies** The best two-tone white with large yellow frilled corona. Outstanding grower and naturalizer.
- [A] DB-055 **Naturalizing Mixture** Customers tell us they receive up to 8 weeks of blooms from this mixture.
- [B] DB-050 **Yellow Trumpet Mixture** King Alfred type flowers. Blend of 4 yellow trumpet flowers to give an extended blooming season.

**Daylilies by the Bushel** 150 average root count per bushel, in graded blooming sizes, 1-2 fan divisions. One bushel will cover an average of 225 square feet when planting in sweeps.

[D] DB-100 **Daylily Mixture** A mixture of early to late blooming varieties. Most economical choice for large border plantings.

**Tulips by the Bushel** 600 average bulb count per bushel, in graded blooming sizes, 11-+ cm. One bushel will cover an average of 100 square feet when planting in sweeps or 160 square feet using naturalizing techniques.

[C] TB-010 **Tulip Mixture** A mixture of early to late blooming tulips. A very good choice for the cutting garden or adding splashes of color in large borders.

**Lilies by the Bushel** 300 average bulb count per bushel, in graded blooming sizes, 11/12 cm. One bushel will cover an average of 100 square feet when planting in sweeps or 160 square feet using naturalizing techniques.

[D] LB-010 **Garden Lily Mixture** A mixture of Oriental, Asiatic, Tiger and Trumpet lilies known for their showy, long lasting blooms. These bulbs can be interplanted among existing bulb/perennial beds to fill in the flowering gap between spring and summer blooming plants. You can expect to see blooms over an 8 week period with this mixture!

**Snowflakes by the Bushel** 500 average bulb count per bushel. One bushel will cover an average of 100 square feet when planting in sweeps or 150 square feet using naturalizing techniques.

[D] LB-020 **Leucojum aestivum**. 3 to 6 bell shaped flowers appear in late Spring on lush, daffodil-like foliage. It should be noted that the bulbs will tolerate very moist conditions and quite a bit of shade.

# Peonies

**Paeonia**

**Sugg. planting rate: 1 / 2ft<sup>2</sup>**

Nothing compares to a peony. Huge flowers, up to 5 inches across, on strong stems with lush green foliage. A cut flower without comparison, they are also beautiful in the border as a centerpiece. We have freshly dug roots in good varieties adapted to the North and Southeast. All have fully double flowers. Plants take at least one year to settle before real blooming growth begins, but do not need to be lifted for years. Three to five eye divisions. Height: 30 to 36 inches. Blooms early to mid May in N.C.


PN-015 'Edulus Superba' Tall, old rose pink. Very early. Fragrant.

PN-020 'Felix Supreme' Medium height raspberry. Prolific, producing 20 or more flowers per plant in 4-5 years.

PN-030 'Festiva Maxima' Tall, early white.

PN-040 'Jules Elie' Tall, medium pink.

PN-050 'Sarah Bernhardt' Tall, pale pink.

# Squill

**Scilla**


**Sugg. planting rate: 7 / ft<sup>2</sup>**

*Endymion hispanicus* (S. campanulata) 'Spanish bluebells' or 'wood hyacinths'. The best miniature hyacinths for the South. Bell shaped flowers on thick stems with lush foliage. The bulbs will not rot even in moist conditions. Blooms for years. Best for borders, edging, or naturalizing. Leave in to form thick groups. Tolerates shade. Height: 8 to 12 inches. Blooms in April in N.C.

- [A] SC-010 *S. campanulata* 'Excelsior' Blue
- [B] SC-020 *S. campanulata* 'Rosea' Pink
- [B] SC-030 *S. campanulata* 'Alba' White
- [A] SC-990 *S. campanulata* Mixture

*S. siberica* 'Siberian squill'. Nodding, bell-shaped flowers on thick stems with strap-like leaves. Vigorous naturalizer that multiplies by division and self-seeding. Height: 4 to 6 inches. Blooms late March in N.C.

- [A] SC-110 *S. siberica* 'Alba' White


# Snowdrops

**Galanthus nivalis**

**Sugg. planting rate: 10 / ft<sup>2</sup>**

Small, white, pendulous blooms. Long, slender petals drape delicately over the perianth. Cup is marked green around the rim. Blooms early like crocus and is very hardy. Excellent for naturalizing under trees and in the grass as they multiply rapidly once established and like moist, almost heavy soil. Height: 8 to 10 inches. Blooms February in N.C.

- [B] GL-020 *G. nivalis* 'Flore Pleno' Double flowered form of *Galanthus nivalis*.
