## PREFACE

The name "Jackson" has been associated with the growing of seedling daffodils since the early 1920's, when my father, the late W. Jackson, commenced hybridising, and I have carried on this work since his death in 1948.

We flower some thousands of seedlings each year, but only a few hundred are selected for further trial and are given at least three years flowering before being named.

Mixed bulbs are offered for sale at \$1.00 per ten. These contain all colours and include many good flowers.

Selected bulbs that have not been named after three years flowering are offered for sale at \$2.00 per ten. These contain many show blooms.

Jackson Seedlings have won the Australian Seedling Cup and the Tasmanian Seedling Cup in Hobart from 1955 to 1974. Launceston 1963, 64, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 72, 73. Claremont 1963-69 and the Australian Championships. Hobart 1964, Canberra 1968, Launceston 1969, Canberra 1972, and Launceston 1973.

The figure after a name indicates the relative time of flowering: Number 0, the earliest and Number 6, the latest.

This is followed by the name or initials of the raiser of the variety. G.L.W.—Guy L. Wilson, N. Ireland; J.L.R.—J. L. Richardson, Eire; S.J.B.—S. J. Bisdee, Tasmania; J.N.H.—J. N. Hancock & Co., Victoria; P.P.—P. Phillips, New Zealand; Bell—David Bell, New Zealand; M.E.B.—M. E. Brogden, New Zealand; Gray, New Zealand.

## SEEDLING INTRODUCTIONS, 1975

Numbers in brackets indicate number and year of first flowering.

Owing to there being a very small stock of most of these new introductions, only a limited number of each are offered for sale.

**2B ATTIS**—3 (127/68). Bred from Arbar onto a Jo x Capella seedling No. 86/61. The white perianth is of good quality and substance. The flattish cup is red at the rim shading down to deep orange at the centre and very serrated round the rim. The flower has good presentation and is well carried on a very tall stalk. Launceston Cup 1972. \$4.

**2A GARIAN**—3 (36/70). Bred from Janz onto a Mars x Ceylon seedling. The perianth is the same deep golden colour of Ceylon. The major petals are very rounded and the minors shovel shaped and nicely overlapping. Perianth has good quality and substance. The fairly large cup is bright red at the rim fading very slightly towards the base, serrated at the rim. Short stiff neck with good presentation. \$5.

**4B GIMU**—3.4 (206/69). Bred from seedling 78/64 (Chimeon x Lawali) on to Mrs W. Copeland. This is an attractive medium sized double. It has a white perianth and then alternative cream petaloids and white petals finishing in the centre with cream whorls. The flower is carried on a medium stem with rather a long neck. \$2.

**1B HELSAL**—3 (73/69). Bred from 2 numbered seedlings of mine. This is a very distinct bicolor trumpet as there is a clear line of demarcation between the yellow trumpet and the white perianth. A smooth white perianth of very good quality and substance with large shovel shaped overlapping minor petals. The light yellow trumpet is slightly expanded and rolled at the mouth which is nicely serrated. The flower has a good neck, good presentation on a strong stem. It is a very regular grower as every flower is up to show standard. Champ. 1B Launceston 1973, Launceston and Bulman Cup 1974. \$10.

**2A KAVI**—3 (58/68). Bred from Dimity x Rave. Perianth is a deep rich yellow and of very good quality and substance. The goblet shaped cut is bright red throughout and is slightly fluted and serrated at the mouth. Good presentation and a tall strong stem. \$4.

**2A LUAN**—3 (39/69). Another Dimity x Vulcan seedling that has inherited the bright colours of Vulcan. The deep yellow perianth is of good quality and substance and very good texture. The goblet shaped cup is bright red throughout and slightly serrated at the mouth. The flower is well carried on a tall strong stem. \$4.

**2B PEM**—3 (67/69). Bred from Arbar x Glenburvie. This is a large red and white flower with a perianth of good quality and substance. Both major and minor petals are shovel shaped with the minors overlapping nicely. The large expanded cup has a bright red trim shading down to deep yellow at the base. The mouth is nicely serrated. The flower has a short neck and a very tall stem. \$3.

**2A RA**—3 (178/68). Bred from Dimity x Vulcan. This is a very striking red and yellow 2A as it has inherited the rich deep yellow and bright red of Vulcan. The perianth has fine major and minor petals of good quality and strong substance. The fairly deep cup is bright red at the mouth shading down slightly to the base. The mouth is serrated. A very tall stem with excellent carriage. Launceston Cup 1973. \$6.

**3A RIIS**—3.4 (195/67). Bred from Dimity x Rave. Good yellow perianth with large overlapping shovel shaped minor petals of good quality and substance. The small goblet shaped cup is vivid red which makes a good contrast to the yellow perianth. The cup is so small that the flower very easily measures a 3A. Tall strong stalk with good presentation. \$4.

**4BP ROSE RHYTHM**—3.4 (134/70). Bred from seedling 72/60 on to Lawali. White perianth of good quality and substance. Very large bright pink cup which is completely filled with alternate pink and white petaloids making it a most attractive flower. It has a good carriage on a fairly tall strong stem. \$5.

**2C SALACIA**—2 (4/68). Bred from Empress of Ireland on to seedling 74/68. This is an early 2C of very good quality. The pure white perianth of very strong substance and has large shovel shaped overlapping petals. The green throated large cup is expanded at the mouth, serrated, and slightly rolled. The flower has a short stiff neck, a strong stem and good presentation. Tas. Cup, Launceston and Bulman Cups 1974. \$6.

**2A SEAN**—3 (53/69). Bred from Vixi x Goldscript so it has a solid 2A background. The whole flower is deep yellow throughout. Perianth is of good quality and strong substance. The nicely balanced cup is slightly expanded and flanged at the mouth making it a well balanced flower. Short stiff neck with good presentation and strong stem. Bulman Cup 1969, Launceston Cup 1973. \$5.

**2P SILHOUETTE**—4.5 (200/69). This flower is bred from Verran x Egina and is the best late flowering pink in the garden. The perianth is snow white and of excellent quality, substance and smoothness. Unlike Verran the perianth is quite flat. The rich pink large cup broadens slightly towards the mouth which is very slightly rolled and nicely frilled. The flower is carried on a tall strong stem with a very short stiff neck that gives it excellent presentation. It is a very regular grower as each flower is of show standard. \$6.

**1A SOL**—1.2 (21/68). Bred from Farmington x Jobi. It could be called a refined Jobi as it is very like that flower. Yellow perianth of very good colour, shape and quality. The well proportioned trumpet is slightly expanded and nicely serrated and frilled at the mouth. Good presentation with very tall stem. It only just measures a trumpet. \$2.

**2B TRITON**—1.2 (10/69). Bred from two 2C's, Killymoon x Filia. Perianth consists of broad pointed petals with very large overlapping minors of good quality and substance. The large trumpet-like cup of lemon yellow is expanded and very serrated at the mouth. The whole flower is well balanced and it is consistent in producing all blooms of show standard. Good presentation and tall strong stem. Very free of increase. \$5.

**2BP VAHU**—3 (30/70). Bred from Verran x Cathlin. It can be best described as an improved Verran as it has inherited the best qualities of its parents. The perianth is pure white of excellent quality and texture, with large overlapping smooth petals. The large cup is deeper pink than Verran and is slightly expanded at the mouth which is slightly rolled and evenly frilled. The flower is carried on a tall strong stem with short neck which gives it excellent presentation. The best pink I have released yet. Few to go. Aus. Cup and Champion pink Hobart 1970, Canberra 1972, Aus. Cup 1972, Aus. Cup 1973, Launceston Cup and Champion pink 1973, Tas. Cup and Champion pink Hobart 1974, Bulman Cup 1974. \$40.

**2A YOONE**—3 (14/68). Bred from Dimity x Rave. Rich golden yellow perianth of excellent quality and substance with large overlapping minor petals. The well proportioned cup is bright red at the rim shading down very slightly at the centre, slightly serrated and fluted at the rim. Has a tall stem and good presentation. Champ. 2A Launceston 1970, Launceston Cup 1972 and 1973, Champ. 2A Launceston 1973, Champ. 2A Hobart 1974, Launceston and Bulman Cups 1974. \$20.

**3B ZOE**—3 (179/68). Bred from seedling 79/60 on to Arbar. Large white perianth of good quality and substance with large overlapping minor petals. The small cup is yellow at the rim shading down to lemon at the base. Mouth of cup is serrated and fluted. The flower is carried on a tall strong stem. It hangs its head when it first opens but straightens up after a few days on the plant. \$3.

**Class 1A—YELLOW TRUMPETS**

**AKALA**—2.3. (93/65). Bred from seedling 54/61 onto Jobi. This is a very refined flower having the quality of Jobi and a rich warm yellow colour throughout the perianth and trumpet. The well proportioned trumpet is slightly flanged at the mouth. Strong tall stem and very short stiff neck. Australian Cup 1970, 1971, Launceston Cup 1974, Bulman 1974, Grand Champion Adelaide 1974. \$1.00.

**AKKAD**—2 (37/67). Bred from the cross Tulenda x Chillion. Very large perianth of shovel shaped petals with the minors greatly overlapping. Quality, colour and substance are good. The bold trumpet is slightly darker than the perianth and is nicely proportioned. It is serrated at the rim which has an attractive roll. The flower is carried on a strong stem with a short stiff neck giving it good presentation. Tas. Cup 1974, Grand Champion Hobart 1974, Bulman Cup 1974. \$4.

**ATTICA**—2 (56/68). Bred from one of my numbered seedlings on to Jobi. It has inherited most of Jobi's good qualities and is very similar to its seed parent. Perianth of good colour and substance, with shovel shaped petals which overlap nicely. The trumpet is straight, slightly serrated at the mouth without any roll. Good carriage and stem. \$1.

**BERIT**—2.3. (39/61.): Early yellow trumpet of deep golden colour. Flat perianth of good quality and texture. Well proportioned trumpet with slightly rolled rim. Bulman and Launceston Cups 1966, Australian Cup 1967, Bulman Cup 1967, Champion 1A Claremont 1967. Tasmanian Cup 1971. \$ 1.00.

**COMAL**—3. (41/64): A Zimi x Letti seedling. A beautifully proportioned deep yellow trumpet, perianth smooth and flat with large overlapping minor petals. Well proportioned trumpet of the same deep yellow, with a slightly flanged mouth. Strong stem and neck. Grand Champion Launceston 1967, Australian Champion and Grand Champion Canberra 1968, Launceston Cup 1968, Australian Champion, Grand Champion and also Champion 1A Launceston 1969. Grand Champion and 1A Champion Hobart 1972, Australian Cup 1972, Tasmanian Cup 1972. Tasmanian Cup 1973. Bulman 1974. \$20.

**DAYAN**—2.3 (57/67). Bred from Mr Bisdee's Chillion on to Jobi. The rich yellow perianth has shovel shaped overlapping petals of very good quality and substance. The well balanced trumpet is slightly deeper yellow, serrated and slightly expanded at the mouth. The flower has a short, stiff neck with good presentation on a tall strong stem. Canberra 1972, Tas Cup 1973. \$20.00.

**RISTIN**—1. (1/65.): Bred from 16/59 (Moque x Anukis) on to Bene so it has early flowering parents on both sides. Very early rich golden yellow trumpet of very good shape, form and carriage. Large shovel shaped flat minor petals of smooth and even texture. Nicely proportioned trumpet slightly flanged and frilled at the mouth. A nicely balanced flower carried on a tall strong stem. Australian and Tasmanian Cups 1967, Claremont 1967, Tasmanian Cup and Claremont 1968, Box Hill 1969, Wandin 1970, Australian Cup 1971, Tasmanian Cup 1971. Australian Champion 1971. Australian Cup 1972-73. Aus. Cup 1974. Grand Champion Kyneton 1974. \$6.

**WARBIN**—2. (3/65). A very deep yellow perianth of excellent texture and quality, with large shovel shaped minor petals. Large bold trumpet nicely serrated and rolled at the rim. The whole flower is well carried on a tall strong stem. A very consistent show flower. Tasmanian Cup 1966; Australian Cup 1966, 1968, 1970. Grand Champion Hobart 1966. Reserve Champion Claremont 1966. Bulman 1966, 1967, 1968, Grand Champion Claremont 1968. Wandin Cup 1970. Australian Cup 1971-72, Canberra 1972. Tas. Cup 1973. \$3.00.

**YARLEY**—3: (4/64): Bred from Haka x Letti both of which were raised by me. Large deep yellow perianth of fine quality and substance. Minor petals are broad and overlapping. Bold deep yellow trumpet with a nicely rolled rim. The flower is carried on a tall stem and has good presentation. Claremont Cup 1968, Australian Cup 1968. \$1.00.

**YELMO**—3. (213/66). A fine golden yellow trumpet bred from Jaslin x Tulendena. Very smooth perianth of excellent quality with all petals flat and overlapping. Well proportioned trumpet slightly flanged and serrated at the mouth. good carriage on a strong stem. Tasmanian Cup and Bulman Cup 1969. Tasmanian Cup 1972. Bulman Cup 1972. \$2.00.

### Class 1B.—BI-COLOUR TRUMPETS (White Perianth Yellow trumpet.)

**BETRIN**—2-3. (12/64.): Bred from Ammon x Rowella. White perianth with slightly pointed overlapping minor petals. The whole perianth is smooth, flat and of good quality and substance. The well proportioned trumpet is lemon coloured and slightly flanged and serrated at the rim. The flower is well carried on a tall strong stem. Grand Champion Bagdad 1967, Reserve Champion Hobart 1968, Australian and Bulman Cups 1968, Box Hill, Launceston & Bulman Cups 1969, Grand Champion Hobart 1970, Champion 1B Launceston 1970. Tasmanian Cup 1970. Wandin 1970. Australian Cup 1973. Champion 1B Hobart 1973. Aus. Cup 1974. \$5.

**CYROS**—3-4. (217/66.): Another fine seedling from Lod x Rowella. Pure white perianth with large smooth overlapping petals of good quality and substance. The trumpet is deep lemon yellow and is slightly expanded and rolled at the mouth. The trumpet colour does not run into the perianth. Very short stiff neck and good carriage. Bulman and Launceston Cups 1967. Champion 1B Launceston 1969. Tasmanian Cup, Bulman Cup, Launceston 1972. \$2.

**DARIC**—2 (32/67). Bred from Lod x Rowella, a cross which has produced many good bi-colours. Perianth is of good quality and substance with fairly pointed and overlapping minor petals. The trumpet of rich yellow gives a good contrast and makes the flower a definite bi colour. The trumpet is nicely serrated and rolled at the rim. Strong stem, short neck, good presentation. Bulman Cup 1973. \$5.

**HYLAS**—3. (66/64): Bred from seedling 56/58 (Preamble x Mitanni) on to Rowella. White perianth of good substance and quality. Minor petals are broad and overlapping. The yellow trumpet is slightly flanged and rolled. Good carriage on a tall strong stem. This flower wants a few days to develop properly. Canberra Cup 1968. Wandin 1970. Australian Cup and Tasmanian Cup 1972. \$1.00.

**JACOBAR**—3-4. (37/65). Bred from cross Lod x Palana. Pure white nicely balanced perianth with overlapping minor petals. Well proportioned yellow trumpet is serrated & slightly rolled at the rim. Flower has good carriage with a short stiff neck. Aus. Cup 1971, Canberra 1972, Aus. Cup 1974. \$1.

**LOD**—4: Bred from Preamble and Mitanni. A very distinct bi-colour. Pure white perianth deep yellow trumpet. Very strong substance, good shape and form. Launceston Cup 1967, 1968, Box Hill 1969, Wandin 1970, Champion 1B Launceston 1971. Australian Cup, Bulman Cup 1972. Champion 1B Hobart 1972, Australian Cup 1973, Launceston Cup 1973, Launceston Cup 1974, Champ. 1B Launceston 1974. \$3.

**NALA**—3. (110/65). A Lod x Rowella seedling. A very distinct yellow and white flower with very good presentation. The trumpet has a lovely frill and is slightly rolled. The perianth is very flat and smooth with shovel shaped minor petals and it is a very well balanced flower. Australian Cup 1968 and 1970. Bulman Cup, Canberra, and Tasmanian Cup 1972. **ROWELLA**.—3.4.: This is an outstanding flower. Opens rather muddy in perianth but soon whitens. Improves on the stalk. Every bloom a show bloom. Tasmanian and Australian Cup teams 1959-63-64. Australian Cup 1960-61-62-63. Box Hill and Bulman Cups 1969, Bulman Cup 1973. 50c

**ANITRA**—3. (20/65): Bred from 10/60 (Astor x 59/53) x Tranquil. Pure white smooth and flat perianth of excellent quality and substance. The trumpet is well balanced and slightly serrated and rolled at the rim. Short neck on a strong stem with good presentation. Reserve Champion Hobart 1967, Australian & Tasmanian Cup 1967, Tasmanian Cup 1968, Bulman Cup 1968, Box Hill 1969, Launceston Cup 1969. Wandin 1970. Australian Cup 1971. Tasmanian Cup 1971. Tasmanian Cup 1973. \$8.00.

**CILLA**—3.4. (179/66). Raised from Glen Derwent on to an Ammon x Merri seedling. Pure white perianth with fine overlapping shovel shaped petals of excellent quality and substance. Well balanced trumpet, serrated and rolled at the mouth giving good balance to the whole flower. Short neck and strong stem. Bulman Cup 1972. \$3.00.

**MERCEDES**—2.3. (30/65). Bred from Kapitah x 54/52 on to Tranquil. Very large pure white flat perianth with shovel shaped overlapping minor petals. Well balanced trumpet set at right angles to perianth. The trumpet is slightly serrated, flanged and rolled. A very striking flower carried on a tall stem with a short stiff neck. A very consistent flower. Australian Cup 1965-66-67-68-70, Tasmanian Cup 1968. Bulman 1969, 1970. Box Hill 1969 Champion. 1C Wandin 1970. Grand Champion Hobart 1971. Australian Cup 1971, Tasmanian Cup 1971. Grand Champion New Zealand National Show, Hamilton 1972, Grand Champion and Champion Australian Raised and Bred, Canberra 1972. Tasmanian Cup 1973. **SAROYA**.—3. (15/65.): Bred from a seedling 28/58 (Zaire x Kapitah) onto Tranquil. Pure white perianth of good quality and substance. Large smooth shovel shaped minor petals of the same quality. Well balanced trumpet is slightly flanged and serrated with the base showing a tinge of green. Short stiff neck with the flower carried on a tall strong stem. Launceston Cup 1967, Box Hill and Bulman Cups 1969. Australian Cup 1971. \$3.00.

### Class 1BP—PINK TRUMPETS (White perianth, Pink trumpet).

**MADANG**.—3.4. (191/66.): Bred from Remis x Palo. Pure white perianth of shovel shaped petals with minors nicely overlapping. The trumpet is pale pink on the outside but much deeper pink on the inside. The mouth of the trumpet is very serrated and slightly flanged and rolled. The flower is very long lasting on the plant. Few to go. \$3.00.

**PETINA**.—(ex KARA) 2.3. (6/60.). A very pronounced trumpet that flowers early in the season. Good smooth white perianth. Delicate pink trumpet slightly flanged and frilled at the rim. Good carriage and presentation. Australian Cup 1966, Launceston 1966, Wandin 1970. Few to go. \$4.00.

### Class 2A.—LARGE CUPS (All Yellow.)

**HYPHE**—3 (180/67). Bred from Lyetta onto a seedling 28/56. This is a large golden yellow flower that just falls short of trumpet measurements. The perianth is flat and of good colour and substance. The well balanced large cup is slightly serrated and flanged at the mouth. The stem is very strong and tall and the flower is carried on a short stiff neck. Bulman Cup, Launceston 1972. \$1.00.

**NINGANA**—3. (36/65.): Bred from Melissa x Jobi seedling on to Haka. Smooth flat deep golden perianth of excellent quality, colour and substance. Neat trumpet like cup of the same rich colour, slightly flanged at the rim. Good carriage on a tall strong stem. Tasmanian Cup 1965, Australian Cup 1967, Tasmanian Cup and Bulman Cup 1968, Tasmanian Cup and Box Hill 1969. Wandin 1970, Canberra 1972. \$1.00.

**PHYRENE**—3 (42/66). Bred from Joslin x Tulendena. The whole colour of this flower is a deep rich golden yellow. The perianth is of a good shape, quality & substance. The large cup is set at right angles to the perianth and is nicely serrated and flanged at the mouth. The stem is very tall and strong & the flower has good carriage. The whole flower is most attractive and a fine addition to this class. \$1.00.

**TEMPE**—3 (43/66). Bred from two named seedlings of mine Jaslin and Tulendena. The flower is a rich golden yellow of good quality and substance. Perianth is very smooth and flat with a nice well proportioned trumpet like cup. The cup is slightly expanded and serrated at the mouth. Good carriage on a tall stem. \$1.00.

**VIXI**—2: Galway x Hymis. Deep yellow flower carried on a tall stem. Good shape and substance. Grand Champion Hobart, Claremont and Launceston 1964. Launceston and Bagdad Cups 1966. Champion 2A Launceston 1967. Australian and Bulman Cups 1969. Champion 2A Launceston 1971, Invercargill 1971. Australian Cup 1973. Bulman 1973, Launceston 1973. \$1.50.

**YVES**—1.2 (76/66). Bred from Haka on to 65/57. A very good show flower. The colour of both cup & perianth is a very deep yellow. The flower is beautifully smooth and well proportioned with good carriage and strong stem. One of the best all yellow cups I have produced. Bagdad Cup 1968, Tasmanian Cup 1970. ### Class 2A.—LARGE CUPS (Yellow perianth, Red Cup.)

**CINEL**—2. (192/65). A most striking red and yellow, bred from Freycinet x Vanity. Deep yellow perianth with large shovel shaped overlapping petals of good quality and substance. The large saucer shaped cup is a deep vivid red and attractively serrated throughout. The cup is nearly sun proof. Good carriage on a tall stem. \$1.00.

**GUNSYND**—2.3. (65/66). Bred from two seedlings of mine 110/56 x 111/57. Striking deep yellow perianth with large smooth shovel shaped minor petals. The large cup is a brilliant red at the rim fading down to orange at the base. **ROCKALL**—4 (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1965 as a Show flower. This is without doubt the finest 3b that has yet been raised. a very large flower for this type, measuring nearly 4½ inches in diameter with broad overlapping slightly pointed purest white perianth of lovely quality and thick substance, the medium sized saucer shaped crown is brilliant red, almost scarlet, nicely serrated at the margin, a wonderful contrast in colour. Very tall strong plant, a certain winner in Single Bloom Classes. \$4.00.

**Class 3C.—SMALL CUP (All White.)**

**ALTYRE**—4: (J.L.R.). A remarkable flower raised from a Nelly seedling x Chinese White. The perianth is immensely broad, almost 5 inches across, and of great substance. The whole flower is pure white throughout; tall strong stem. 50 cents.

**POLAR IMP**—3. (Philpott). Probably the best all white of this class ever bred in Australia and flowers earlier than most in class 3. It is pure white in both perianth and cup with a pleasing green throat. Has good carriage & a strong stem. \$1

**VERONA**—4. (J.L.R.). F.C.C., R.H.S. 1961 as a Show flower. Undoubtedly the finest 3C that has yet been seen, bred from Green Island x Chinese White. This superb flower is about four inches across with broad rounded flat, pure white per-
