ADAN MILLIKAN (White Trumpet)—A very neat smallish flower of wonderful refinement and substance; bred from Askelon; the solid perianth is pure white; the trumpet is bell-mouthed, white and just faintly toned green. PRICE: £5

ALSTONE (Incomparabilis)—A very pretty decorative variety, with very long stems, good perianth of rich yellow, the long narrow cup of orange-red goes to make a charming flower. PRICE: 10/

BARHAM (Incomparabilis)—A very good show flower, with lemon-yellow perianth; the nicely frilled cup of orange-yellow goes to make a charming early flower. PRICE: 30/

BEVERA (Bi-Color Incomparabilis)—A very large rounded flower, with glistening white perianth of great substance, with a shapely yellow cup. PRICE: 10/

FRILL PRINCE (Incomparabilis)—A very round flower, with primrose perianth; the pretty cup has a double frill of orange-yellow. PRICE: 10/

GLENFINO (Incomparabilis)—A very uncommon flower, with primrose perianth of great texture; the coppery-orange cup goes to make a charming flower. PRICE: £3

HECTARE (Incomparabilis)—A flower of very good form, with yellow overlapping pointed perianth; the cup is of orange-yellow, deeply stained blood-red at mouth; long, strong stems. PRICE: 30/

HISTORIAN (Incomparabilis)—A large rounded flower with very broad overlapping perianth of pure white; the shapely cup is of pale yellow; nicely frilled orange-red to edge; good long stems and a very good show flower. PRICE: £5

ISMARIS (Yellow Trumpet)—A large, early flower of faultless form and carriage, with good overlapping perianth of rich yellow, which carries a shapely trumpet of very deep yellow. PRICE: £3

KANUPA (Incomparabilis)—A very good garden and show flower; nicely pointed overlapping perianth of lemon-yellow; the shapely cup of orange-yellow is prettily frilled with darker orange at the mouth. PRICE: 30/

LESLIE FELL (Yellow Trumpet)—A rather smallish neat flower of great quality and texture; the perianth is of pale yellow; the shapely deep lemon trumpet is nicely rolled back at the brim, which goes to make a very good show flower. Greatly admired in my winning stand at the show. PRICE: £5

MINIM (Incomparabilis)—A very striking flower; the perianth opens pale primrose, turning to creamy white; the shapely cup is lemon-yellow. PRICE: £3

RESTFORD (Bi-Color Trumpet)—A really good large flower with broad overlapping creamy white perianth, with a shapely yellow trumpet. PRICE: £3

ROMFORD (Incomparabilis)—A very smooth flower, with a cup of deep orange color; the overlapping lemon-yellow perianth is of great texture. PRICE: £3

SAKI (Bi-Color Trumpet)—A very shapely flower of good texture, having a very rich yellow trumpet, with good, solid creamy-white perianth. PRICE: 30/

ADVANCE GUARD—A flower of noble proportions and intense deep yellow color throughout. PRICE: 5/

***AUSSIE**—A beautiful and refined flower, of perfect shape, and of the highest quality; perianth broad and flat; trumpet neat and nicely balanced. The flower has a stately carriage, and is of uniform, clear yellow. PRICE: £1/10/

BEN ALDER—A magnificent flower, of rich gold, with a very neat frilled trumpet. PRICE: 2/6

BEN HUR, de Graaff—Creamy yellow perianth, cup wide-open at brim; very attractive flower of fine substance. PRICE: 7/6

***BUNGA**—A self-yellow flower of good form. PRICE: 2/

BUXTED—A good show flower. PRICE: 2/

***CARBINE**—One of our best Trumpets; with broad, smooth overlapping perianth and beautifully formed trumpet; the color is a clear yellow self; early to mid-season. PRICE: 5/

CARISBROOKE—A very tall vigorous grower of good form; trumpet has nicely fringed brim; a very good show flower. PRICE: 7/6

DAWSON CITY—A superb flower of faultless form and fine quality; color, uniform soft yellow; a splendid show flower. PRICE: 3/

DECENCY—A very fine yellow Ajax, with remarkably flat, rather pointed perianth, standing at right angles to the long trumpet, which is nicely rolled back at mouth. The whole flower is soft golden-yellow throughout. PRICE: 5/

PHANTASY—Probably the most refined and whitest trumpet yet raised. This is an extra good flower in all respects. PRICE: 2/

QUARTZ—A perfectly ideal show flower of exquisite form and lovely smooth texture. Might be described as a white Royalist. PRICE: 5/
