- Altruist 3 O-R (Board)** .....\$1.00  
Smooth textured, flat, orange perianth, with a small, flat, dark orange-red cup. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Ambergate 2 O-O (Milne)** .....\$1.00  
Broad, smooth, overlapping amber petals with medium sized brick red cup. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Angel 3 W-GWW (Wilson)**.....\$1.00  
Wide, overlapping pure white petals with small flat white frilled cup and green eye. Ht. 19" (Midseason)
- Arish Mell 5 W-W (Blanchard)**.....\$0.50  
2-3 pure white florets with reflexed perianth on a tall, straight stem. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Brer Fox 1 Y-O (Backhouse)** .....\$7.00  
Intense coloring in perianth and trumpet. Trumpet flares and is frilled. Ht. 20" (Early)
- Broomhill 2 W-W (Board)** .....\$1.50  
White perianth, broad, bluntly pointed overlapping petals. Nearly straight, short, pure white corona. Ht. 18" (Early)
- Canisp 2 W-W (Lea)** .....\$1.50  
True white, smooth perianth. Overlapped, broad petals. Trumpet slightly expanding with neatly rolled mouth. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Cathedral Hill 6 W-Y (Pannill)** .....\$12.00  
Swept back perianth, somewhat pointed, with slight overlap. At onset, perianth is a creamy white, maturing to pure white, with a lovely sheen. Bright, lemon yellow, fluted corona. Good balance and substance. (Midseason)
- Chorus Line 8 W-Y (Pannill)** .....\$7.00  
2-3 individual nodding and well poised florets, each in its own visual space, ascending the stem. Reflexed white perianth with soft yellow, short cup. Very graceful, delicate and fragrant. Ht. 16" (Midseason)
- Cordial 2 W-P (Evans)**.....\$1.00  
White perianth with frilly pink cup. Petals are broad and pointed. Gives a good pink in most regions. Ht. 16" (Midseason)
- Easter Tide 4 Y-Y (Zandbergen-Terweg)**.....\$6.00  
This double appears more like a ruffled yellow peony or begonia than a daffodil. Heavy blossoms on a strong stem. Ht. 14" (Early)
- Explosion 8 Y-O (Pannill)**.....\$2.50  
Deep yellow perianth with orange cup. Well posed multi blossoms on a strong stem. Ht. 18" (Early)
- Falstaff 2 Y-R (Richardson)**.....\$1.00  
Broad, smooth, brilliant yellow perianth with an intensely contrasting orange cup. Long lasting, strong blossom. Ht. 19" (Early)
- Gracious Lady 2 W-P (Mrs. Richardson)**.....\$12.00  
Smooth, overlapping, spade shaped perianth is well balanced. The soft pink cup is slightly flared with a frilled margin. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Highfield Beauty 8 Y-YYO (Mott)** .....\$2.00  
Probably self yellow in most areas but may have an orange band on the rim of the cup. 2 or more blooms per stem. Ht. 22" (Midseason)

- Homestead 2 W-W** (Pannill).....\$15.00  
Pure white, broad ,spade shaped overlapping perianth. Trumpet slightly flared , cream maturing to pure white. Ht. 15" (Early)
- Indian Maid 7 O-R** (Pannill).....\$0.75  
Deep orange perianth, slightly pointed cup, ruffled and reddish. Ht. 18" (Early)
- Intrigue 7 Y-W** (Pannill) .....\$3.00  
1-3 small, lemon yellow blooms with long, flared, frilly trumpets which reverse to creamy white. Ht. 14" (Midseason)
- Jovial 5 Y-O** (Pannill) Withdrawn to permit increase
- Lovejoy 2W-YPP** (Murray Evans).....\$15.00  
Broad , overlapping perianth with a satin sheen. Corona yellow base, peach pink half of cup, flaring to a wide margin of deeper rose pink. Good balance, strong stem. Sunproof Ht. 16" (Mid-Late)
- Lyles 2 Y-Y** (McNairy).....\$0.75  
Very good, tall, smooth garden flower. Fine increaser. Overlapping lively yellow perianth with deeper yellow cup. Ht. 22" (Early)
- Misty Glen 2 W-GWW** (Board).....\$0.75  
Brilliant white with good substance and texture. Well overlapped perianth. Slender, serrated cup with green eye Ht. 20"(Midseason)
- Mobjack Bay 1 Y-Y** (Raymond Lewis).....\$7.50  
Overlapping, well balanced perianth. Trumpet has an evenly serrated margin. Color is a clear, uniform bold yellow. Ht. 16-18" (Midseason)
- Mountain Dew 1 W-W** (Pannill).....\$10.00  
Large white bloom with lovely sheen. Wide, slightly pointed perianth. Straight cup is flared with softly ruffled edge. Ht. 23" (Midseason)
- New Penny 3 Y-Y** (Pannill) .....\$12.00  
Lemon-yellow, overlapping perianth. Flared, evenly ruffled cup is a darker yellow. Ideal pose and perfect balance. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Panache 1 W-W** (Wilson).....\$1.50  
One of the best white trumpets. Well balanced large white trumpet and broad, flat, overlapping perianth. Ht. 21" (Midseason)
- Portfolio 1 W-W** (Pannill).....\$3.00  
White trumpet with smooth, lightly fluted flare at the margin. Broad, spade pointed petals are smooth and flat. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- River Queen 2W-W** (Pannill) Withdrawn to permit increase

Rich coloring. Excellent balance and pose. Fine flower for show and garden. Fertile pollen. (Late)

Eye-catching double, looking like a small white rose or gardenia blossom. Blooms best in cool, temperate zones. Ht. 16" (Late)
- Satin Lustre 3W-GGW** (Murray Evans).....\$15.00  
Poet looks, with shovel shaped, overlapping white perianth, with a glistening lustre and white rim. The deep, vivid green eye is the most striking attraction. Delicate, light fragrance. A Blue ribbon winner 1993 ADS National show. Ht. 14 1/2"(Late)
- Smyrna 9W-GOR** (Brodie) Withdrawn to permit increase

- Springdale 7 W-Y** (Pannill).....\$0.50  
1-2 blossoms to a stem. Overlapping petals have slightly pointed tips. Small yellow cup. Good garden flower. Ht. 17" (Early)
- Tynan 2 W-P** (Carcaim).....\$1.00  
Broad, flat, white perianth with clear, true pink cup. Excellent poise and form. Especially interesting for hybridizing. Ht. 17" (Late)
- Williamsburg 2 W-W** (Pannill).....\$2.50  
Perfectly balanced white perianth with creamy white cup. A reliable and consistent performer. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- Winged Flight 3W-GYR** (Murray Evans).....\$15.00  
Strongly reflexed, rounded and overlapping perianth with pure white silken texture and sparkle. Green eye , yellow midzone and red rim cup. Regal appearance on strong but graceful stems. Good balance and poise. Light fragrance. Ht. 16" (Mid -Late)

- Bantam 2 Y-YRR** (Barr & Sons).....\$ 0.75  
Wide, overlapping, bright yellow perianth, slightly reflexed. Cup has yellow eye zone, deepening to red towards the rim. Ht. 11" (Late)
- Demitasse 12 W-Y** (Pannill)(sib of Junior Miss).....\$2.50  
Creamy white, slightly pointed tipped reflexed perianth. Cup is straight and deep yellow in color. Ht. 14" (Midseason)
- Lintie 7 Y-O** (Barr & Sons).....\$0.50  
Yellow with a flat orange crown, shading to a deeper orange at the edge. Ht. 12" (Midseason/Late)
- Proxy 9 W-GYR** (Evans).....\$1.00  
Delicate, white, reflexed petals. Green eye, yellow flat cup, edged with red. Fragrant. Ht. 11" (Midseason/Late)
- Sailboat 7 W-W** (Pannill)..... 3 for \$1.00  
Reflexed perianth, separated petals. 1-3 florets to a stem. Cup is a creamy yellow changing to white at maturity. Prolific. Ht.16" (Midseason)
- Sidhe 5 Y-Y** (Gray).....\$0.75  
Pronounced ; "Shee" - a Cornish fairy. Light yellow, reflexed nodding perianth. Flared cup of deeper yellow. Ht. 15" (Midseason)
- Sunny Miss 7 Y-O** (Pannill).....\$2.00  
1 or more rich yellow well balanced blossoms. Perianth is moderately spade shaped. Flared, rich orange cup. Ht. 17" (Midseason/Late)
- Wendover 7 W-Y** (Pannill)..... 3 for \$1.00  
1-2 blossoms on a rounded stem. White perianth with flared lemon yellow cup. Great increaser. Ht. 16" (Midseason)

Reflexed perianth. Nodding head, often with multiple blooms. Clear buttercup yellow. (Late)

- Bagatelle 1 Y-Y** (J. Gerritsen and Son).....\$ 7.00  
Self yellow. Similar to Wee Bee and Little Gem. Has smaller blossoms than Wee Bee. (Early)
- Canaliculatus 8 W-Y**..... 3 for \$1.00  
Fragrant white flowers with orange cups. Multiple blooms to a single stem. Reflexed perianths. Flowers best if undisturbed. (Early)
- Frosty Morn 5 W-W** (Gray).....\$20.00  
Usually two florets to a stem. Head nodding, white reflexed perianth, short flared white cup. (Midseason)
- Jonquilla 10 Y-Y** (Clonal selection or seed grown).....\$2.00  
Tall stemmed with a cluster of small, bright yellow flowers. Lovely fragrance. Excellent for show, garden, and rock garden. (Late)
- Little Beauty 1 W-Y** (Gerritsen).....\$1.00  
Small bi-colored trumpet. Creamy white petals and bright yellow trumpet. (Early)
- Minnow 8 W-Y** (Gray)..... 3 for \$1.00  
1-3 florets. Creamy white perianth with dark yellow cup. Fragrant. (Early)
- OZ 12 Y-Y** (Pannill) Miniature candidate (sib of Junior Miss).....\$10.00  
Perianth reflexed and separated with a winged appearance. The cup is narrow and straight, deeper yellow than the perianth. (Early)
- Pixie's Sister 7 Y-Y** (Mitsch)..... 3 for \$1.00  
Diminutive, multi blossomed flower. The overlapped perianth petals and the cup are a uniform yellow. (Midseason)
- Rip Van Winkle 4 Y-Y** Withdrawn to permit increase
- Segovia 3 W-Y** (Mrs. F.M. Gray).....\$1.00  
Overlapping perianth is a true white color. Cup is almost flat and light yellow. (Midseason/Late)
- Snipe 6 W-W** (Wilson).....\$8.00  
Perianth widely separated and reflexed. Corona straight and long, slightly flared at the mouth. Pale yellow corona changes to white. (Early)
- Sundial 7 Y-Y** (Gray).....\$0.75  
Petite flower. Flat, small cup, 1 or 2 blooms. Cup is a somewhat deeper yellow than the perianth. (Early)
- Tenuior 10 W-Y** (Clonal selection or seed grown).....\$3.00  
Overlapping ivory white perianth is slightly reflexed with a dainty appearance. The small, flat cup is a deep yellow. (Late)
- Toto 12 W-W** (Pannill)(sib of Junior Miss).....\$0.50  
Approved Miniature 1993. Multiple blossoms. Narrow, straight trumpet, yellow at first, changing to white. Perianth slightly reflexed. Ht. 13" (Early)

Light yellow, separated perianth. Brighter yellow trumpet with delicate serrated edged rim. (Early)

- Three of Diamonds 3W-GWO** (Mary Lou Gripshover).....\$35.00  
White reflexing petals. Green eye which fades to white with a narrow orange-red rim. Bloom size about that of Segovia. Miniature Rose Ribbon winner. Miniature candidate. Ht. 12" (Late)

The grower's mixes are available in quantities of 25, 50 or 100 bulbs, an economical way to increase the number of flowers in your spring garden. Nature and market demand determines the varieties of bulbs available for these mixes but we do promise a fine selection which we are sure that you will be delighted with. Prices include postage.

### A Brief Explanation of Daffodil Classification

- The classification of a daffodil cultivar shall be based on the description and measurements submitted by the person registering the variety, or shall be the classification submitted by such person.
- Colors applicable to the description of daffodil cultivars are abbreviated as follows:  
**W** - white or whitish. **G** - green. **Y** - yellow. **P** - pink. **O** - orange. **R** - red.
- For the purposes of description, the daffodil flower shall be divided into perianth and corona.
- The perianth shall be described by the letter or letters of the color code most appropriate.
- The corona shall be divided into three zones, an eye-zone, a mid-zone, and the edge or rim. Suitable coded color descriptions shall describe these three zones, beginning with the eye-zone and extending to the rim.
- The letter or letters of the color code most accurately describing the zones of the **perianth** shall follow the **division** designation.
- The letters of the color code, most accurately describing the zones of the **corona** shall then follow, from the eye-zone to the rim separated from the perianth letters by an hyphen. In division **4**, the letters of the color code most accurately describing the admixture of petals and petaloids replacing the corona shall follow in proper order, using three, two, or one color codes as appropriate.
- If the corona is substantially of a single color, a single letter of the color code shall describe it.

Using these basic requirements, daffodils may be classified as follows:

**DIVISION 1: Trumpet** One flower to a stem, trumpet or corona as long as or longer than the perianth segments.

**DIVISION 2: Long cup** One flower to a stem, cup or corona more than one third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments.

**DIVISION 3: Short cup** One flower to a stem, cup or corona not more than one third the length of the perianth segments.

**DIVISION 4: Double** Double flowers.

**DIVISION 5: Triandrus** Usually more than one flower to a stem, head drooping, perianth segments often reflexed and of a silky texture.

**DIVISION 6: Cyclamineus** One flower to a stem, perianth usually reflexed and corona straight and narrow. Some exceptions exist.

**DIVISION 7: Jonquilla** Usually several flowers to a stem, flowers usually fragrant, stem is round in cross-section and foliage often rush like.

**DIVISION 8: Tazetta** Usually two to six flowers to a stem, sweet scented and very short cupped. Perianth segments rounded and often somewhat crinkled.

**DIVISION 9: Poeticus** Usually one flower to a stem. White petals sometimes stained with corona color at the base, small flat cup edged with red. Fragrant.

**DIVISION 10: Species** All species and reputedly wild forms. Double forms of these varieties are included.

**DIVISION 11: Split Corona** Corona split for at least one third of its length.

**DIVISION 12: Miscellaneous** Daffodils not falling into any of the preceding divisions.
