- S1 Altruist 3 O-R (Board)** Withdrawn to permit increase
S2 Ambergate 2 O-O (Milne) Withdrawn to permit increase
S3 Angel 3 W-GWW (Wilson).....\$1.00
 Wide, overlapping pure white petals with small flat white frilled cup and green eye. Ht. 19" (Midseason)
S4 Arish Mell 5 W-W (Blanchard).....\$1.00
 2-3 pure white florets with reflexed perianth on a tall, straight stem. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
S5 Brer Fox 1 Y-O (Backhouse) Withdrawn to permit increase
S6 Broomhill 2 W-W (Board) Withdrawn to permit increase
S7 Canisp 2 W-W (Lea) Withdrawn to permit increase
S8 Cathedral Hill 6 W-Y (Pannill)\$6.00
 Swept back perianth, somewhat pointed, with slight overlap. At onset, perianth is a creamy white, maturing to pure white, with a lovely sheen. Bright, lemon yellow, fluted corona. Good balance and substance. (Midseason)
S9 Chorus Line 8 W-Y (Pannill)\$3.00
 2-3 individual nodding and well poised florets, each in its own visual space, ascending the stem. Reflexed white perianth with soft yellow, short cup. Very graceful, delicate and fragrant. Ht. 16" (Midseason)
S10 Cordial 2 W-P (Evans).....\$1.00
 White perianth with frilly pink cup. Petals are broad and pointed. Gives a good pink in most regions. Ht. 16" (Midseason)
S11 Easter Tide 4 Y-Y (Zandbergen-Terweg)\$5.00
 This double appears more like a ruffled yellow peony or begonia than a daffodil. Heavy blossoms on a strong stem. Ht. 14" (Early)
S12 Explosion 8 Y-O (Pannill)\$2.00
 Deep yellow perianth with orange cup. Well posed multi blossoms on a strong stem. Ht. 18" (Early)
S13 Falstaff 2 Y-R (Richardson).....\$2.00
 Broad, smooth, brilliant yellow perianth with an intensely contrasting orange cup. Long lasting, strong blossom. Ht. 19" (Early)
S14 Fragrant Rose 2 W-GPP (B. Duncan)
 Withdrawn to permit increase
S15 Gracious Lady 2 W-P (Mrs. Richardson)\$7.00
 Smooth, overlapping, spade shaped perianth is well balanced. The soft pink cup is slightly flared with a frilled margin. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
S16 Highfield Beauty 8 Y-YYO (Mott).....\$2.00
 Probably self yellow in most areas but may have an orange band on the rim of the cup. 2 or more blooms per stem. Ht. 22" (Midseason)
S17 Homestead 2 W-W (Pannill).....\$10.00
 Pure white, broad, spade shaped overlapping perianth. Trumpet slightly flared, cream maturing to pure white. Ht. 15" (Early)
S18 Indian Maid 7 O-R (Pannill).....\$2.00
 Deep orange perianth, slightly pointed cup, ruffled and reddish. Ht. 18" (Early)

- S19 Intrigue 7 Y-W (Pannill)**.....\$2.00
1-3 small, lemon yellow blooms with long, flared, frilly trumpets which reverse to creamy white. Ht. 14" (Midseason)
- S20 Jovial 5 Y-O (Pannill)** Withdrawn to permit increase
- S21 Lovejoy 2W-YPP (Murray Evans)**.....\$7.00
Broad, overlapping perianth with a satin sheen. Corona yellow base, peach pink half of cup, flaring to a wide margin of deeper rose pink. Good balance, strong stem. Sunproof Ht. 16" (Mid-Late)
- S22 Lyles 2 Y-Y (McNairy)**..... Withdrawn to permit increase
- S23 Misty Glen 2 W-GWW (Board)** Withdrawn to permit increase
- S24 Mobjack Bay 1 Y-Y (Raymond Lewis)**.....\$4.00
Overlapping, well balanced perianth. Trumpet has an evenly serrated margin. Color is a clear, uniform bold yellow. Ht. 16-18" (Midseason)
- S25 Mountain Dew 1 W-W (Pannill)**.....\$6.00
Large white bloom with lovely sheen. Wide, slightly pointed perianth. Straight cup is flared with softly ruffled edge. Ht. 23" (Midseason)
- S26 New Penny 3 Y-Y (Pannill)**..... Withdrawn to permit increase
- S27 Panache 1 W-W (Wilson)** Withdrawn to permit increase
- S28 Odorous 10 Y-Y (Wild hybrid-Nursery propagated)**.....\$4.00
Clear yellow, heavenly fragrance. (Midseason)
- S29 Portfollo 1 W-W (Pannill)**.....\$2.00
White trumpet with smooth, lightly fluted flare at the margin. Broad, spade pointed petals are smooth and flat. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- S30 Rising Star 7 W-P (Pannill)**.....\$18.00
Though reluctant to rave about his own flowers, in Bill Pannill's opinion, this flower is the best pink Jonquil on the market today. Usually there are 2-4 florets per stem. It has a fine white perianth, with a true pink cup. A good increaser and fragrant. (Midseason)
- S31 River Queen 2W-W (Pannill)**.....\$15.00
Flat, overlapping, smooth textured perianth. Nicely poised on a strong stem, with very good balance. Consistently outstanding.
- S32 Sabine Hay 3 O-R (D. Milne)**.....\$6.00
Rich coloring. Excellent balance and pose. Fine flower for show and garden. Fertile pollen. (Late)
- S33 Smyrna 9W-GOR (Brodie)**..... Withdrawn to permit increase
- S34 Springdale 7 W-Y (Pannill)**\$1.00
1-2 blossoms to a stem. Overlapping petals have slightly pointed tips. Small yellow cup. Good garden flower. Ht. 17" (Early)
- S35 Tynan 2 W-P (Camcain)**.....\$2.00
Broad, flat, white perianth with clear, true pink cup. Excellent pose and form. Especially interesting for hybridizing
- S36 Williamsburg 2 W-W (Pannill)**\$3.00
Perfectly balanced white perianth with creamy white cup. A reliable and consistent performer. Ht. 18" (Midseason)
- S37 Winged Flight 3W-GYR (Murray Evans)**.....\$10.00
Strongly reflexed, rounded and overlapping perianth with pure white silken texture and sparkle. Green eye, yellow midzone and red rim cup. Regal appearance on strong but graceful stems. Good balance and poise. Light fragrance. Ht. 16" (Mid -Late)

- S38 Yazz 7 W-P (Pannill) (sib. of Rising Star)**.....\$12.50
This is a lovely flower, though not quite as refined as Rising Star. The petals are creamy white with a pink cup. Several florets to a stem. A good increaser and fragrant. (Midseason)

INTERMEDIATES

- I1 Bantam 2 Y-YRR (Barr & Sons)**\$ 0.75
Wide, overlapping, bright yellow perianth, slightly reflexed. Cup has yellow eye zone, deepening to red towards the rim. Ht. 11" (Late)
- I2 Birthday Girl 2W-GWW (B. Duncan)**.....\$6.00
As described by Brian Duncan, "This is a small, jewel smooth, pure white flower of perfect form." Intermediate. (Mid season)
- I3 Demitasse 12 W-Y (Pannill)(sib of Junior Miss)**.....\$1.50
Creamy white, slightly pointed tipped reflexed perianth. Cup is straight and deep yellow in color. Ht. 14" (Midseason)
- I4 Lintle 7 Y-O (Barr & Sons)**.....\$0.75
Yellow with a flat orange crown, shading to a deeper orange at the edge. Ht. 12" (Midseason/Late)
- I5 Proxy 9 W-GYR (Evans)**.....\$1.00
Delicate, white, reflexed petals. Green eye, yellow flat cup, edged with red. Fragrant. Ht. 11" (Midseason/Late)
- I6 Rimski 2W-YWP (B. Duncan)**\$6.00
"The 1/4" clearly defined rim is an unusual, pure powder pink" Those that know Rimski, feel that it is one of the very best intermediates. (Early-Mid season)
- I7 Sailboat 7 W-W (Pannill)**.....\$0.75
Reflexed perianth, separated petals. 1-3 florets per stem. Cup is a creamy yellow fading to white at maturity. Prolific. Ht.16" (Midseason)
- I8 Santa Claus 4 W-W (Wilson)**\$3.00
Eye-catching double, looking like a small white rose or gardenia blossom. Blooms best in cool, temperate zones. Ht. 16" (Late)
- I9 Satin Lustre 3W-GGW (Murray Evans)**.....\$10.00
Poet looks, with shovel shaped, overlapping white perianth, with a glistening lustre and white rim. The deep, vivid green eye is the most striking attraction. Delicate, light fragrance. An ADS Blue ribbon winner. Ht. 14 1/2"(Late)
- I10 Sidhe 5 Y-Y (Gray)**.....\$0.75
Pronounced ; "Shee" - a Cornish fairy. Light yellow, reflexed nodding perianth. Flared cup of deeper yellow. Ht. 15" (Midseason)
- I11 Sidley 3W-GYY (B. Duncan)**.....\$6.00
Perfect form. The nicely proportioned lemon-yellow cup, with green eye, is backed by a satin smooth, pure white perianth. Ideal intermediate, free flowering plant. (Mid -Late)
- I12 Sunny Miss 7 Y-O (Pannill)**.....\$0.50
1 or more rich yellow, well balanced blossoms. Perianth is moderately spade shaped. Flared, rich orange cup. Ht. 17" (Midseason/Late)

- I13 Wendover 7 W-Y** (Pannill).....\$1.00
1-2 blossoms on a rounded stem. White perianth with flared lemon yellow cup. Great increaser. Ht. 16" (Midseason)

MINIATURES

- M1 April Tears 5 Y-Y** (Gray) Withdrawn to permit increase
M2 Bagatelle 1 Y-Y (J. Gerritsen and Son).....\$ 2.50
Self yellow. Similar to Wee Bee and Little Gem. Has smaller blossoms than Wee Bee. (Early)
M4 Be Bop 7 Y-Y (Gray)..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M5 Bobby Soxer 7 Y-YY (Gray)..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M6 Canaliculatus 8 W-Y.....\$0.50
Fragrant white flowers with orange cups. Multiple blooms to a single stem. Reflexed perianths. Flowers best if undisturbed. (Early)
M7 Clare 7 Y-Y (Gray).....\$12.00
Typically grows with reflexed perianth segments. Uniform, lemon yellow perianth and a flat cup of darker yellow. (Mid-Late)
M8 Frosty Morn 5 W-W (Gray).....\$15.00
Usually two florets to a stem. Head nodding, white reflexed perianth, short flared white cup. (Midseason)
M9 Hawera 5 Y-Y (Dr. Thomson)..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M10 Jonquilla 10 Y-Y (Clonal selection or seed grown)\$2.00
Tall stemmed with a cluster of small, bright yellow flowers. Lovely fragrance. Excellent for show, garden, and rock garden. (Late)
M11 Kokopelli 7Y-Y (Bob Spotts) Miniature candidate.....\$25.00
2-4 florets, each floret a little longer than "Sundial". Opens self yellow, cup maturing to a beautiful, darker yellow. Good balance and substance. Good increaser. Garden and show flower. Shows excellence in warm climates. Several Rose ribbons. Won "Best miniature", "Miniature Gold" and "Miniature White" (Mid)
M12 Little Beauty 1 W-Y (Gerritsen)... Withdrawn to permit increase
M13 Minnow 8 W-Y (Gray)\$0.50
1-3 florets. Creamy white perianth with dark yellow cup. Fragrant. (Early)
M14 Oz 12 Y-Y (Pannill) (sib of Junior Miss).....\$6.00
Perianth reflexed and separated with a winged appearance. The cup is narrow and straight, deeper yellow than the perianth. (Early)
M15 Pixie's Sister 7 Y-Y (Mitsch)\$2.00
Diminutive, multi blossomed flower. The overlapped perianth petals and the cup are a uniform yellow. (Midseason)
M16 Rip Van Winkle 4 Y-Y..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M17 Segovia 3 W-Y (Mrs. F.M. Gray).....\$2.50
Overlapping perianth is a true white color. Cup is almost flat and light yellow. (Midseason/Late)
M18 Snipe 6 W-W (Wilson).....\$10.00
Perianth widely separated and reflexed. Corona straight and long, slightly flared at the mouth. Pale yellow corona fades to white. (Early)

- M19 Stafford 7 Y-O** (Gray).....\$12.50
Light yellow flowers and a bright orange rimmed cup. In our favorable Oregon climate it has a distinct red rim. A very versatile flower, a show winner, fine garden flower and does well in pots. (Early -Mid)
M20 Sundial 7 Y-Y..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M21 Sun Disc 7Y-Y\$2.00
Petals are light yellow and the cup is a deep, clear yellow disc. Well named. (Late)
M22 Tenuior 10 W-Y (Clonal selection or seed grown).....\$2.00
Overlapping ivory white perianth is slightly reflexed with a dainty appearance. The small, flat cup is a deep yellow. (Late)
M23 Three of Diamonds 3W-GWO (Mary Lou Gripshover)....\$25.00
White reflexing petals. Green eye which fades to white with a narrow orange-red rim. Bloom size about that of Segovia. Miniature Rose Ribbon winner. Ht. 12" (Late)
M24 Toto 12 W-W (Pannill)..... Withdrawn to permit increase
M25 Wee Bee 1 Y-Y (Minor Sport).....\$1.00
Light yellow, separated perianth. Brighter yellow trumpet with delicate serrated edged rim. (Early)

- C1 Rosebank 2 W-YPP** (Mrs. J Abel Smith).....\$15.00
"Small decorative flower, having a circular perianth, and with the shortish, deep pink apricot crown; closely resembles form division 3. Useful for breeding". (Midseason)
C2 Sophie Girl 2 Y-P (Mrs. J Abel Smith)\$15.00
"This is a small neat flower of good substance. The cup is a striking damson shade; a most arresting color. (Midseason)
