

Standard Daffodils

- S1 **Angel 3W-GWW (Wilson)** **\$3.00**
Wide, overlapped, pristine white petals with a small, flat, white frilled cup accented by the deep green eye. Elegant and refined. Ht.19", [Midseason]
- S2 **Brer Fox 1Y-O (Backhouse)** **\$10.00**
Opens a deep stunning orange and measures a full trumpet. Still perhaps the deepest color in its class. A must for orange trumpet breeding. Limited! Ht.18" [Midseason]
- S3 **Cathedral Hill 6W-Y (Pannill)** **\$8.00**
Lovely, graceful, slightly pointed, swept back petals. Opens with the color of old ivory, matures to pure white with a lovely sheen. The corona (cup) is fluted and clear yellow. Fine balance and substance. Lasts well in the garden and in a vase. Ht.14" [Midseason]
- S4 **Canisp 2W-W (Lea)** **\$5.00**
Purest white, smooth flower with a wide perianth. The cup is slightly expanded with a distinctive, gentle roll at the rim. A sublime show flower for its raiser. Winner of the highest awards. Ht.18" [Midseason]
- S5 **Chorus Line 8W-Y (Pannill)** **\$4.00 ea or 3 for \$10.00**
Two or three nodding, well posed florets. Each is beautifully spaced and the gracefully reflexed white petals are enhanced by the soft yellow cup. A vigorous grower but visually dainty, delicate and captivating. Fine fragrance! Ht.16" [Midseason]
- S6 **Cordial 2W-P (Evans)** **\$1.50**
White petals makes the frilled, deep pink cup stand out. The petals are broad, pointed and smooth. Good pink for most regions. Ht.18" [Midseason]
- S7 **Easter Tide 4Y-Y (Zandbergen-Terweg)** **\$5.00**
This fine double flower appears more like a ruffled yellow peony or begonia. Heavy, fragrant blossoms on a strong, sturdy stem. Ht.14" [Early]
- S8 **Explosion 8Y-O (Pannill)** **\$2.50 ea or 3 for \$6.00**
What a perfect name for this remarkable flower. Multiple blossoms of deep yellow with a bright orange cup. Highly fragrant and an unusually vigorous increaser. A favorite show flower that quickly makes a cluster of color in the garden. Ht.16" [Midseason]

- S9 **Falstaff 2Y-R (Richardson)** \$2.50 ea or 3 for \$6.00
 One of the best yellow/red daffodils from the late J. Lionel Richardson. Broad smooth, brilliant yellow petals with an intensely contrasting orange cup. Long lasting. Strong stems. Ht.18" [Midseason]
- S10 **Fragrant Rose 2W-GPP (Duncan)** \$12.00
 One of the finest pinks we list. The texture of the white perianth is velvety and smooth. The goblet shaped cup has a vivid green base and a deep rose cup. The fragrance is something special. Reminds us of old garden roses. It makes an exceptional cut flower for the fragrance alone! Ht.17" [Late Midseason]
- S11 **Gracious Lady 2W-P (Mrs. Richardson)** \$7.00 ea or 3 for \$18.00
 The smooth, well overlapped, spade shaped petals are very well balanced. Wonderful soft, melting, rose pink cup is lightly flared. Great show flower that is hard to find. Ht.18" [Midseason]
- S12 **Highfield Beauty 8Y-YYO (Mott)** \$ 3.00
 A soft self yellow in most areas. May have a soft orange rim to the cup during moist, cool weather. Two or more, smooth, large flowers per stem. Intense fragrance. Good vigor and increase. Ht.21" [Midseason]
- S13 **Homestead 2W-W (Pannill)** \$9.00 ea or 3 for \$23.00
 One of Bill Pannill's most desired flowers for exhibition. Many, many blue ribbons and Best in Show awards to its credit across the country and overseas. Pure white with a broad, overlapped perianth and impeccable texture. The cup is evenly and lightly fluted; opens creamy and quickly passes to pure white. Recommended! Ht.16" [Early Midseason]
- S14 **Indian Maid 7O-R (Pannill)** \$ 2.50 ea or 3 for 6.00
 We think that this is one of the best jonquil hybrids in its color class! Deep, orange/gold petals of substance with a deep, reddish orange cup. Has the intense, light, clean, mouth-watering scent of its *N. jonquilla* parent. A favorite multipurpose flower for show, garden display, or floral arrangements. Ht.18" [Early Midseason]
- S15 **Intrigue 7Y-W (Pannill)** \$ 2.50 ea or 3 for 6.00
 Another from Bill Pannill that is one of the best in its class. One sometimes, but mostly two or three flowers per stem. The blooms open a soft, creamy lemon. The lightly flared and ruffled cup quickly passes to a creamy white. A consistent producer of fragrant blooms with a great show form. Ht.14" [Midseason]

- S16 **Lovejoy 2W-YPP (Evans)** \$5.00
 Wide, overlapping white perianth with a satin sheen. The cup has a clear yellow base which passes to a peach pink and ends in a wide band of deep rose pink. Much admired coloring, good balance and a strong stem. Sunproof in our fields. Ht.16" [Mid, late season]
- S17 **Lyles 2Y-Y (McNairy)** \$3.00
 Very fine, tall, well formed flower of the deepest yellow throughout. Perfect for the garden, but many blooms may be shown. Rapid and sturdy increaser. The tall strong stems hold the flower well. Very under rated. Ht.22" [Early Midseason]
- S18 **Misty Glen 2W-GWW (Board)** \$3.00
 Brilliant, clear white flower with a stellar reputation on the show bench. The perianth is always close to perfection. The cup is slightly expanded with a neatly serrated brim. Outstanding Ht.20" [Late Midseason]
- S19 **Mobjack bay 1Y-Y (Lewis)** \$ 4.00 ea or •SPECIAL• 3 for \$10.00
 Nice, wide, well balanced perianth. The trumpet has an even, serrated margin. Color is a clear, uniform yellow. Ht.16"-18" [Midseason]
- S20 **Mountain Dew 1W-W (Pannill)** \$6.00
 Grand, large white bloom with a glisten or sheen to the perianth. The wide perianth is of classic form. The trumpet is slightly flared ending in a distinctive, softly ruffled mouth. Tall, stately, choice. Ht. 23" [Early Midseason]
- S21 **New Penny 3Y-Y (Pannill)** \$10.00
 Perhaps one of the best Show flowers in our list. A true small cup with a melting, lemon yellow perianth that is wide and smooth. The elegant, tailored cup is a shade or two darker than the perianth. Consistent, well balanced, with ideal pose. and a personal favorite. A choice flower in this color code. Ht.16"-18" [Midseason]
- S22 **Odorus 10Y-Y (Wild Hybrid - Nursery Propagated)** \$4.00
 Clear yellow through out. Heavenly fragrance. Grows with "hybrid vigor". Perfect for "heirloom" gardens as it has been in commerce since the sixteenth century. Our stock of this flower is healthy. Has the grace and charm some believe is lacking in "modern" hybrids. A must have for the scent alone! Ht.13" [Early Midseason]
- S23 **Portfolio 1W-W (Pannill)** \$6.00
 A modern classic. Smooth, flat white perianth has the elegant spade shape to each of the petals. Pure white, lightly fluted trumpet has an evenly flared mouth. Much admired by visitors. Ht. 23" [Midseason]

S24 Rising Star 7W-P (Pannill) \$18.00

Although reluctant to rave about his own flowers, Bill Pannill feels that this is the best pink jonquil hybrid on the market today. Usually 2-4 florets per stem. It has a fine white perianth and a true pink cup. Good increaser with the oh so lovely jonquil fragrance. Not only for show, this flower is superb for arrangements. Ht.14" [Late Midseason]

S25 River Queen 2W-W (Pannill) \$12.50

A show flower of the highest worth. A stellar reputation across the country. This is a snow white flower that is flat, overlapped, and has a polished finish to the perianth. Consistently producing exceptional show blooms, it has earned high praise from exhibitors fortunate enough to grow it. One of the best. Quantity of available bulbs is limited. Ht.18" [Late Midseason]

S26 Sabine Hay 3O-R (Milne) \$7.50

Caused a sensation when first exhibited by its raiser. Still a hard flower to beat for color impact. Cut early as the buds just open and protect from sun if you want to see this flower in all its glory. Deep orange perianth segments and a dark red, small cup. It has fertile pollen and transmits its color intensity to its children. Demand keeps our stock low and the price high. Ht.18" [Late Midseason]

S27 Springdale 7W-Y (Pannill) \$ 1.50 ea or 3 for 3.50

Named for our small village which is closest to Corbett. One or two blossoms per stem. The petals overlap and show prominent mucro tips (the pointed natural "clasp" at the top of each petal). Small, perfect, fragrant yellow cup. An excellent garden flower. Ht.17" [Midseason]

S28 Tynan 2W-P (Carncairn) \$ 2.50 ea or 3 for 6.00

Wide white perianth, flat and smooth. Clear pink cup. Excellent poise and form. Especially interesting for hybridizing pinks. From our friend Kate Reed of Carncairn Daffodils in Northern Ireland. Ht.18" [Late Midseason]

S29 Williamsburg 2W-W (Pannill) \$ 4.00

Another consistent, reliable show flower from Bill Pannill. Perfectly balanced white bloom opens with a creamy cup which whitens as it ages. A must flower for exhibitors. Ht.18" [Late Midseason]

S30 Winged Flight 3W-GYR (Evans) \$8.00 or 3 for 20.00

Strongly reflexed, rounded and overlapping perianth of a silky smooth texture that is enhanced by the sparkle of "diamond dusting". The beautiful cup is fascinating when examined up close. The base of the cup is a deep moss green. The mid zone is clear yellow with a fine red rim that finishes the flower nicely. Regal in appearance on strong and graceful stems. Nice balance and poise. Light poeticus fragrance. Ht.18" [Late Season]

S31 Yazz 7W-P (Pannill) \$8.00 ea. or 3 for 22.00

This sibling of Bill's 'Rising Star' is very popular. More robust than 'Rising Star' although, perhaps, not as refined. A wonderful grower with creamy white perianth and a soft pink cup. There are several, highly fragrant florets to a stem. Much in demand for show, garden and floral decoration. Ht.18" [Late Midseason]

C1 Baltic Shore 3W-GYR (Ballydorn) Standard \$9.00

One of the loveliest green eyed flowers from Sir Frank Harrison's fifty year breeding program. Outstanding show flower for those that imported it from Northern Ireland. This beauty has substance to spare. Consistent producer of refined show blooms. The deep forest green eye may extend half way up to the deeply colored rim in moist, cool seasons. A breathtaking cut flower. Fragrant too! First offering ever in the US market. Only a small number of bulbs are available. Order early as we expect to sellout. Ht.18" [Late Season]

C2 Bobbysoxer 7Y-YYO (Gray) Miniature \$9.00

Rare Miniature with classic show form. The small flower has a butter yellow perianth. The small cup opens yellow with orange tones, which merge into a broad, deep orange/red band. In wet, cool seasons the color is startling. Ht.8" [Late Season]

C3 Elrond 2W-W (Duncan) Intermediate \$15.00

"A lovely pure white with a hint of green in the eye of the cup, which seems whiter than the perianth. Slightly pointed form, and a glistening, rather than moth like texture, distinguish this most attractive flower from it's sister Elwing." Originally registered as a Div. 6. Ht.10" [Midseason]

C4 Golden Quince 12Y-Y (Gray) Miniature \$8.00

A bright golden yellow sport (mutation) of Quince. This flower is a true miniature with multiple stems and multiple flowers. Similar also to it's sister Tete a Tete which is one of the most popular daffodils in the world. Very hard to find. We were able to find our original stock in Holland. Likes a bit of shade which lengthens its bloom period. Very much recommended for Show or Garden. Ht.7" [Midseason]

C5 Mary's Pink 2W-GWP (Cairncairn) Intermediate \$9.00

We are very excited about this new listing. From our friend Kate Reed of Northern Ireland. A splendid addition to any collection; suitable for garden or show. The clean white perianth sports a clear, medium pink cup. The color has carrying power in the garden. Grows as an Intermediate for us. Ht.13" [Midseason]

C6 Mary Kate 2W-GWP (Duncan) Intermediate \$10.00

Lovely little, most consistent exhibition flower. The pointed white perianth is a clean white. It nicely sets off the green eyed, white cup which has a deep, rose pink band at the rim. Sturdy grower of steady increase. Ht.13" [Late Midseason]

C6 Memoir 2Y-WWY (Evans) Standard \$7.00

A strong grower of superior increase. The perianth is finely textured, smooth and round. Opens a soft luminous yellow. The perianth remains yellow while the cup passes to white with a yellow rim. Different, with a sophisticated, subtle coloration that is most attractive. Ht.18" [Midseason]

C7 Mite 6Y-Y (Booth-Gore) Miniature \$20.00

What a lovely flower. Graceful, swept back petals with a long tubular cup. Another very hard to find miniature daffodil that blooms in early midseason. A consistent winner on the show bench. Ht.8" [Midseason]

C8 Red Rum 2Y-R (Mrs. Richardson) Standard \$7.50

First shown the year of Nell's death, winning great praise in the RHS Halls. Early flower with a deep, clear yellow, smooth perianth and a heavily saturated orange/red cup. Very consistent producer of early show blooms. Good breeder, fertile both with seed and pollen. Cheery, bright garden subject and a strong increaser. A hard to find treasure. Limited quantities. Ht.16" [Early Midseason]

C9 Red Treasure 2Y-R (O'More) Standard \$12.50

A dark yellow perianth that deepens towards orange. The intense, dark red cup is modestly fluted. Flowers open perfectly. Originally from New Zealand, our stock is completely acclimated. Recommended for show and breeding. Ht.18" [Mid Season]

Intermediate Daffodils

Their use in the garden and for exhibition in their own class, is simply exploding. Our selection is extensive and we encourage you to try some of these lovely, exciting flowers. Try a few in a sunny nook or beside a pathway. They are wonderful in pots. We think you'll be convinced that they really are "Daffodils of the Future".

IN1 Bantam 2Y-YRR (Barr & Sons) \$3.00

A wide, bright, overlapped, smooth yellow perianth with a gentle reflex. The base of the cup is yellow, deepening to a rich red at the brim. Choice late flower. Ht.11" [Late Season]

IN2 Birthday Girl 2W-GWW (Duncan) \$6.00 ea or 3 for \$15.00

As described by Brian Duncan, "This is a small, jewel smooth, pure white flower of perfect form". Outstanding for the show bench. Ht.14" [Midseason]

IN3 Lintie 7Y-0 (Barr & Sons) \$1.00

Yellow perianth with a flat orange crown, shading to a deeper orange at the edge. Ht.12" [Midseason/Late]

IN4 Proxy 9W-GYR (Evans) \$1.50

The delicate, pure glistening white perianth is delightfully reflexed. The "in proportion" cup has a strong green eye, merging to yellow and banded by a fine, wire rim of the deepest red. Winsome and graceful. Nice poeticus scent. Ht.12" [Midseason/Late]

IN5 Rimski 2W-YWP (Duncan) \$6.00 ea or 3 for \$15.00

We think 'Rimski' is one of the finest Intermediates available. The perianth is a pure white. The cup has a soft yellow base and a one quarter inch wide, clearly defined rim of the purest powder pink. Subtle, sophisticated and very special. We highly recommended this great Intermediate. Ht.12" [Early Midseason]

IN6 Rosebank 2W-YPP (Abel-Smith) \$15.00

A small decorative flower, having a circular perianth, with a shortish, deep apricot pink crown; closely resembles a Division 3 in form. Useful for breeding Intermediates and Miniatures. Ht.14" [Midseason]

IN7 Sailboat 7W-W (Pannill) \$1.00 each or •Special• 6 for \$5.00

A gently reflexed perianth with separated segments. One to three florets per stem. The cup opens a creamy yellow and fades to white at maturity. Prolific with bloom and a fantastic rate of increase. Lightly fragrant. Ht.16" [Midseason]

IN8 Santa Claus 4W-W (Wilson) \$4.00

An eye catching, perfectly white, double poeticus type hybrid from the late Guy L. Wilson. It looks like a flawless white camellia or small rose. Opens best in cool, moist conditions. Fragrant and a great late cut flower. Ht.16" [Late season]

IN9 Satin Lustre 3W-GWW (Evans) \$10.00 ea. or 3 for \$25.00

Looks like a petite poet with the classic, shovel shaped perianth segments that are glistening white and overlapped. The vivid green eye and satin lustre finish to the petals, make this a striking flower. Delicate, light fragrance. Ht.14" [Late season]

IN10 Sidhe 5Y-Y (Gray) \$1.00 each or •Special• 6 for \$5.00

Pronounced: SHEE; a Cornish Fairy. From Alec Gray, the late, world renowned breeder of miniature daffodils (Creator of the popular 'Tete a Tete') Has a light yellow, reflexed, nodding or pendant bloom. The cup is of deeper yellow. Ht.15" [Midseason]

IN11 Sidley 3W-GYY (Duncan) \$5.00

This flower has perfect form. It is nicely proportioned having a lemon yellow cup with a jade green eye. The cup is backed by the jewel like, satin smooth perianth of pristine white. Named in honor of Tom Bloomer's daughter. Exquisite. Ht.12" [Midseason/Late]

IN12 Sophie Girl 2Y-P (Abel-Smith) \$15.00

This is a small neat flower of good substance and form. The cup is a most striking damson shade; a most arresting flower. Perfect for show and much requested for floral arrangements. One of the best! Ht.14" [Midseason]

IN13 Sunny Miss 7Y-O (Pannill) \$1.00 ea or •Special• 5 for \$6.00

One or more well balanced, rich yellow blooms. The perianth is moderately spade shaped with a flared, rich orange cup. Nicely fragrant as well. Ht.12" [Midseason/Late]

IN14 Wendover 7W-Y (Pannill) \$1.00 each or •Special• 6 for \$5.00

One or two blooms on a rounded, jonquil like stem. White perianth with a soft, lemon cup. Fragrant and a great increaser. For show, garden, pots, and fine in a vase. Yet another great flower from Bill Pannill. Ht.16" [Midseason]

Miniature daffodils are always in demand. Perfect for up close viewing in the garden. Plant these where they may be admired. Outstanding for smaller gardens. M1 Bagatelle 1Y-Y (Gerritsen & Son) \$3.00 each or •Special• 3 for \$7.50

Everyone that sees this perfect little miniature trumpet daffodil falls in love with it. The flower is soft yellow; similar to 'Little Gem' and 'Wee Bee' but slightly smaller. Ht.6"-8" [Early]

M2 Canaliculatus 8W-Y (Wild Origin) \$1.00 each or •Special• 3 for \$2.50

Blooms at five to six inches in height. A perfect, miniature "paper-white" type with lovely, fragrant white flowers sporting tiny, orange cups. Multiple blooms per stem. Flowers best with a good summer baking. May be shy to bloom Ht.6"-8" [Early]

M3 Clare 7Y-Y (Gray) \$12.50

This rare miniature is uniform and dependable. Produces a multitude of show blooms. The soft lemon perianth may slightly reflex which draws attention to the deeper yellow, flat cup. Superb and choice. Ht.6"-8" [Mid Lateseason]

M4 Frosty Morn 5W-W (Gray) \$15.00

Usually two florets per stem. The blooms are nodding or pendant and perfectly in scale. Clean white reflexed perianth and a short, flared white cup. Ht.6"-8" [Midseason]

M5 Kokopelli 7Y-Y (Spotts) \$25.00

Two to four immaculate florets with each a little longer than its parent 'Sundial'. Marvelous fragrance. Opens a striking self yellow; the small cup matures to a deeper yellow. Good balance and substance. It is a rapid increaser and healthy, producing many flowering side stems. A true multipurpose flower that is fine for Show, Garden and Decoration. Winner of several Rose Ribbons. Winner of Best Miniature, Miniature Gold and Miniature White Ribbons. Outstanding and in demand so stocks are small Ht. Variable [Midseason]

- M5 Minnow 8W-Y (Gray) \$.75 ea or •Special• 3 for \$2.00**
One to three florets per stem. Creamy white perianth with prominent mucro tips. Fragrant and a good grower. Likes a dry, hot summer baking. Ht. 6"-8" [Early Season]
- M6 Narcissus Jonquilla 10Y-Y (Species) \$2.00 each or •Special• 3 for \$5.00**
These bulbs are either clonal selections or grown from seed. Tall rounded stems and clusters of bright yellow flowers with a heavenly fragrance. Hardy in cold areas but does well in the south. A must have for fragrance. Ht. 14" [Late]
- M7 Oz 12Y-Y (Pannill) \$6.00**
Miniature sibling to 'Junior Miss' The perianth is reflexed with a nice swept back look. The cup is narrow, straight and of deeper yellow. Graceful with great appeal. Ht. 8" [Midseason]
- M8 Pixie's Sister 7Y-Y (Mitsch) \$2.50**
A diminutive, multi-blossomed flower of great worth. Both the overlapped, smooth, well formed perianth and cup are a sunny, uniform yellow. Pleasing light jonquil fragrance. Ht. 7" [Late Midseason]
- M9 Stafford 7Y-O (Gray) \$12.50**
A light, sunny, soft yellow with a bright, orange rimmed cup. In our favorable Oregon climate it has a distinct red rim many seasons. A versatile Miniature that does well in Shows, Garden and very fine in Pots. A favorite here. Ht. 8" [Midseason]
- M10 Sun Disc 7Y-Y (Gray) \$2.50 each or •Special• 3 for \$6.00**
A rounded flower of clear light yellow. The cup is deeper yellow, flat and disc like. Well named and choice. The light fragrance adds to its appeal. Ht. 6" [Late Midseason]
- M11 Three of Diamonds 3W-GWO (Gripshover) \$25.00**
An exceptional Miniature bred by our friend, Mary Lou Gripshover. Snowy white, slightly reflexing petals are smooth and well formed. The cup has a jade green eye and matures to white with a narrow, orange red brim. Blooms are about the size of 'Segovia'. Miniature Rose Ribbon Winner. Unique, choice, and rare.
